MAYOR'S DAY 5K RUN TO BE HELD ON SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 20

There is still time to register for the fifth annual Mayor's Day 5K Run to be held on Sunday, September 20, 2015. Held rain or shine the event will start at Union High School on Cooke Drive. Registration begins at 7:45 a.m. with actual race commencing at 9 a.m. The day will also feature a Kid's Run for grades K through 5. The event is sponsored by the Union Township Chamber of Commerce.

On Thursday, August 13, 2015 a kick-off event was held and Benjamin Duvelson, this year's recipient of a portion of the 5K proceeds was in attendance with his family. Benjamin has Sickle Cell Anemia, a hereditary disease in which the red blood cells are crescent moon shape instead of round. Due to their crescent shape the red blood cells are rigid and sticky which can slow or block blood flow and oxygen to vital parts and organs. This often creates intolerable pain. In September 2014, Ben was diagnosed with Stage IV Avascular Necrosis to the left hip resulting from loss of blood flow to the femur head. This has left Ben unable to walk without pain or assistance. Being too young for a hip replacement, he has endured many procedures followed by months of hospitalization and rehab. Ben has been recovering well; however, he still has days of pain and fatigue from the anemia.

Ben is an intelligent youngster who loves to make people laugh. He is the fourth son of parents Emmanuel and Perette Duvelson. His three older brothers have traits of the illness. His younger brother shows no sign of illness. They have learned to adjust to many changes that this illness has caused the family.

CHILD ADVOCATE TRAINING STARTS SEPTEMBER 29TH

CASA volunteers speak for foster children.

When removed from her parents' care, three-year-old Alyssa was found underweight, dirty, and mostly grunted, cried or pointed to communicate; she even had been attempting to change her own diapers. When the foster mom tried to clean dirt from Alyssa's body and crust from her hair, the child was terrified of water. As the words "autism spectrum" and "developmental testing" were tossed around, the foster mom worked with Alyssa to improve communication and lessen tantrums, and introduced age-appropriate toys and books into her world.

Also about to enter Alyssa's world? Her CASA, the Court Appointed Special Advocate assigned by a Union County family court judge. Nearly 40 percent of children CASA of Union County has served this year alone entered care due to neglect, just like Alyssa, whose parents struggled with drug abuse. Armed with a court order, CASAs speak to all parties in the child's life: foster parents, doctors, caseworkers,

therapists and teachers, and incorporate those findings, as well as observations from the CASA's own visits with the child, into reports for the judge. CASAs participate in court hearings and speak on the child's needs and best interests. For Alyssa, her CASA's advocacy included securing speech and occupational therapy, changed placement to a more age-appropriate special education class, and increased visitation with a caring grandparent.

Alyssa, now five, has tested out of special-needs interventions and this fall will walk through the doors of a mainstream kindergarten classroom. She is a bright and enthusiastic child who loves horses — and her CASA.

Why don't you walk through the doors of the next CASA training sessions and be the voice to change the life of one of the 542 Union County children in foster care?





VON STEUBEN'S VITAL ROLE IN AMERICAN REVOLUTION

Hans Arndt will recount Baron von Steuben's technical training of Washington's troops, helping them to defeat British forces in the American Revolution. The presentation will begin at 2:30 pm on Sunday, September 20, at the Caldwell Parsonage, 909 Caldwell Avenue, Union.

Mr. Arndt is chairman of the Peter Muehlenberg Unit of the Steuben Society of America—a patriotic, educational association of American citizens of German descent. The Muehlenberg Unit has completed a number of projects, including annually awarding Steuben Prizes to outstanding students atNew Jersey high schools, Rutgers University, the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, and the U.S. Naval Academy at Annapolis.

Hans immigrated to this country from Germanyin 1955. After a year of work and night school, he served two years in the U.S. Army. Four years later, with his wife's help, Hans earned a B.S. in Mechanical Engineering from Newark College of Engineering (now NJIT). His professional life was spent with Exxon and major engineering companies in construction of refineries and chemical plants, which took him and his family to many foreign countries. Hans is now retired.

His program will be part of the meeting of the Union Township Historical Society, which will begin at 2 pm. Non-members are cordially invited to attend. Refreshments will be served. Admission is free; donations are greatly appreciated.
