## WATCHUNG ARTIST FEATURED IN NEW ART GROUP INVITATIONAL

The Watchung Arts Center will be showing the "2015 New Art Group Invitational: Artists and Their Friends," an exhibition of new work by 12 artists, organized and installed by the New Art Group, an organization of visual artists with a 22 year history in north central New Jersey.

Running from Tuesday after Labor Day weekend through late September, with the opening reception on Sunday, September 13 from noon to 2:30pm, the 2015 New Art Group Invitational highlights key works from a variety of New Jersey based artists. Varying greatly in medium, visual approach and subject matter, the exhibit is an opportunity to see the works of some members of the New Art Group members alongside the works of other artist friends whose artist endeavors they admire and respect.

Artists rely heavily on other artists for influence, support and for how others are executing in a medium or style that is similar to

theirs, or even radically different from theirs. New Jersey is increasingly the home to a large number of artists who are experimenting with visual media in new ways. There are many examples of how artists worked stylistically with or off on one another, artists such as Pablo Picasso and George Braque. This exhibit gives the viewers a chance to see how those influences can be obvious or sometimes not even apparent.

"As our second invitational, we wanted to bring to our audience artists they may not be familiar with," says New Art Group founding member, Paul XO Pinkman. "Artists who are friends throughout our development are incredibly important to how we stay dedicated to our work and how we experience and develop new ideas that keep it vital."

The artists whose works are represented in this show are Aliza Augustine of Jersey City, Francesca Azzara of Westfield, Alaine Becker of South Orange, Jane Caminos of Watchung, NJ, Pauline Chernichaw of Englewood Cliffs, Dorothy Kuehn of Maplewood, Nancy Ori of Berkeley Heights, Paul XO Pinkman of Plainfield, Madeleine Shaw of Shrewsbury, Heidi Sussman of West Orange, Eric Valosin of Warren, Gail Winbury of Westfield

In addition, we are trying something new this time, an opening brunch. As a way of offering a different viewing time and experience, we are having our opening earlier in the day and offering coffee, tea and brunch snacks.

The Watchung Arts Center, located at 18 Stirling Road in Watchung on the Watchung Circle, is a multi-disciplinary arts facility serving Watchung, the surrounding communities and the Tri-State Area.

### **COME CELEBRATE ON WATCHUNG HISTORY DAY**

Celebrate the history of our area at Watchung History Day on Saturday, September 26, from 11 a.m.- 4p.m. at the Village Green and Texier Museum on the Watchung circle.

The Union Army is coming! The Reenactor/Living History organization, the 3rd New Jersey Volunteer Infantry, Company A will camp overnight on the Village Green once again. The regiment portrays an 1863 "post Gettysburg" recruiting encampment, where Company A has returned, tired and depleted, to their home state to recruit, rest and refit. Visitors can travel back in time and visit the various stations in the camp with demonstrations of soldiers' life. The kind and gentle Sergeants of the 3rd NJ will turn the children into trained marching "soldiers" for "Uncle Abe" Lincoln. The encampment will be open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. for "new recruits".

The Texier House Museum will be open for

tours sponsored by the Watchung Historical Committee of many displays of life in early Watchung, including Moldenke's Castle, ice cutting on the lakes, a photo display by Justin Scalera of historic homes, entitled "Watchung: Then and Now, Watchung's sports champions, the Great Flood of 1973, Watchung in WWII and more. Many local service groups will participate: the Watchung Fire Department will bring its 1949 fire truck, a vintage ice cream truck will sell frozen treats, and more.

The film "Reflections of Watchung", produced by Christopher VanderFliet will be shown. Boy Scout Troop 32 will be selling hot dogs and homemade apple crisp. Folk music by the Good earth Revue will entertain.



### WATCHUNG DISTRICT AWARDED AMERICAN CHEMICAL SOCIETY GRANT

Watchung Borough's Gifted and Talented Teacher, Elaine Chesebro, in conjunction with Dr. Gail Seelig has been awarded a grant from the American Chemical Society. The American Chemical Society offers a program in which chemistry professionals share their expertise and enthusiasm for science with an elementary,

middle, or high school teacher over the course of one school year. They enhance science education, and secure a \$500 donation for the school where they volunteer.

Mrs. Chesebro explains, "Dr Seelig and I have partnered for many years. Her expertise has enriched lessons on the human brain, STEM projects, and helped plan science fairs, as well as full day science expos in the district. If not for her, I wouldn't have known about this opportunity. I'm excited to learn about marine studies along with the students.

Gail and I will design hands-on lessons covering diverse marine topics including electrical fields, echolocation, and bioluminescence. We will work together to create lessons that will enhance the current

science curriculum and allow students to perform experiments using the "scientific process". The experiments will provide opportunities for the students to experience new ways to learn fundamental concepts in marine chemistry and biochemistry.

Dr. Seelig comments, "By working with the teachers throughout the school year to help young students on science projects, I hope to instill in students the same excitement that I have known in the pursuit of scientific discovery. Through our partnership, my expectation is that students will be able to have more science learning experiences than might otherwise have been possible. Mrs. Chesebro and I intend to use this project as a foundation for continued partnering in the future.


### **HIGH FLYERS AT WATCHUNG LIBRARY**
