


Anthony's Eagle Project was completed at the Environmental Education Center in Basking Ridge. Nets had been placed under the eaves of the roof that covers the front porch of the EEC in an attempt to get barn swallows to build their nests elsewhere. Unfortunately, once the nets were installed, a majority of the barn swallows left the EEC. In order to encourage the birds to return, Anthony constructed and mounted thirteen barn swallow nesting boxes along with constructing a barn-like structure and an informational sign.

Joshua is a member of Meyersville Presbyterian Church. Meyersville is a small hometown church with a small congregation in Long Hill Township. When the time for his Eagle Scout Project approached, Joshua wanted to give back to his church. He consulted with Session Members and a wall and garden were proposed to complete the front landscaping. Donations from Halls Nursery, D'Avella Landscaping, Ed DaSilva and Ray Clarke along with countless hours from parents, his fencing coach, Rich Brown, and fellow scouts helped Josh see his project to completion.

Matthew's Eagle Scout Service Project was building 14 Blue Bird Houses at Lord Stirling Stables in Basking Ridge. Matt's love of nature was a great match with this equestrian park's commitment towards enhancing their horseback riders' experiences in the natural environment. Blue birds, native to North America, have been increasingly threatened by other invasive birds. The houses were built with specific customized entry holes to help ensure the Blue Bird's survival.





Fire Prevention Month will include an open house at the Stirling Volunteer Fire Co. for all residents of Long Hill Township and their friends. It is free and will be held rain or shine on Sunday, Oct. 25 from 11am until 4pm. The firehouse is located at 321 Somerset St., less than a half block from Main Ave. where there will be fun activities for children and adults.

Visitors will tour the firehouse, go inside fire engines, see firefighter tools such as the Jaws of Life, Thermo Imaging Cameras, Halligan tools, and more. Outside kids can hold a real fire hose and shoot water from it and at 2pm everyone can see an actual Jaws of Life demonstration where a real car is cut apart.

No reservation is necessary, just come to the Stirling firehouse whenever it is convenient for you between 11am and 4pm. There will be free hot dogs, free drinks, and free ice pops along with free coloring books and firefighter helmets for the children. As part of the fire engine tour you can ring the bell on the fire engine. The bell on each of Stirling's fire engines are more than 50 years old and as a new fire engine replaces an old one, the old bell is transferred to the new fire engine.

This year's goal for fire prevention month is for everyone to have a smoke detector in every bedroom and one on each floor of the house, including the basement and attic. It is vital that you must be able to hear the Beep Beep of the smoke detector where you sleep because most home fires occur between 11pm and 7am, when you're asleep. Also, a fire doubles in size every 30 seconds so it is important to get out and stay out as quickly as possible, then call 911.

If you know of a group of children that would like a special presentation on fire safety and fire prevention please call the Stirling firehouse at 908 647-2669 and leave a message with your telephone number. We'll get back to you and arrange a date for the presentation and bring along a fire engine.




