The Trinity United Methodist Church at 1428 Main St. Rahway is celebrating its 166th Anniversary on October 18, 2015 with the theme "Celebrating 166 Years of God's Faithfulness" based on Psalm 57:10. A thanksgiving service will start at 10:30 a.m. in the sanctuary. Come join us.

Methodistism came to Rahway in 1774 through Rev. William Watters who served on the New Jersey Circuit. In 1798, a board of trustees elected and so began the First Methodist Episcopal Church. A chapel was completed in 1849, thirty-one members of the First Church decided to organize another church building more convenient to their home location in lower Rahway.

In 1850 a building was erected at the corner of Broad Street and Milton Avenue (now the site of the Harley-Davidson dealership). However, with the growth of the railroad a new site, the present location, was chosen. In 1893 the first service was held. In 1895 the name was changed to Trinity Methodist Episcopal Church. In 1897, a parsonage was built next to the church, where the parking lot is today.

In 1930 the church name changed to Trinity Methodist Church and again changed in 1960 adding United. Through the years our buildings have gone through many changes and expansions. In 1956 the parsonage on Bryant Street was purchased. With the construction of the Educational building in1962 our parsonage was razed. In 1972 seepage of gasoline made our building unsafe for two years and worship services were joined in First United Methodist Church.

The real story of our Trinity Church, is the story of the people who through the years has worshipped God and shared in Christian fellowship. A strong church school tradition, ministries of music and caring pastoral leadership have provided the foundation for a future generation which will assure the continuance of this church in our community.

HALLOWEEN IN RAHWAY

Rahway is THE place to be on Halloween with a full day of events that cater to all ages.

The day kicks off at 10AM with make-up artists set-up at the Rahway Recreation Center (3 City Hall Plaza) for those who would like to have professionals work on their ghoulish appearances. The multiple make-up artists will be on scene until 4PM.

At 11AM, Halloween-enthusiasts of all ages will be judged at the Train Station Plaza (Corner of E. Milton Ave. and Irving St.) for the City of Rahway's annual Halloween Costume contest. There will be 1st Place trophies in the following categories: up to age 3, 4-6, 7-10, 11-4, Family or Group, Senior Citizen and Adult Funniest, Scariest, and Most Original. Register for costume contest in person at the Recreation Center or online at cityofrahway.org. The deadline is Friday, October 30 at 3 pm. Only those who have pre-registered will be judged.

Promptly at 12 noon the massive Rahway Halloween parade will step off the Train Station Plaza and head down Irving St. towards the Hamilton Stage parking lot. Led by the Rahway High School Marching Band, the parade will feature floats, Halloween music. At the end of the parade route, Rahway's annual Trunk-or-Treat awaits the Rahway trick-or-treaters.

Simultaneously at noon, the second annual Rahway Zombie Apocalypse scavenger hunt will get underway. This hunt is a real life adventure game that with zombies wandering the City looking for food (brainsss). Participants, dressed as zombies and ghouls, will be given a story that leads to a series of clues. Clues are hidden in everyday places around the City and while the answers to some may be obvious, others may leave participants stumped and wandering around. Not for the faint hearted, this is a mentally challenging journey that can be completed entirely on foot and must be completed before sundown (5:54PM). Not everyone who begins is expected to complete the challenge, but those who do will be entered to win one of three \$150 gift cards. Yet, perhaps the best part of it all is, the satisfaction felt at having solved a series of mind-bending puzzles to discover a zombie feast. Check out www.cityofrahway.com/zombie for more info.

At 6:00PM the City will host its first edition of Zombie vs. Vampires Walk! This is an attempt at determining what the most popular undead creature is. Participants will come dressed as either a zombie or a vampire and march through Rahway's downtown.

At 6:45PM all eyes will turn to the sky as we launch a Haunted Halloween display of fireworks from City Hall (Main St. and E. Milton Ave.)

At 2PM the Union County Performing Arts Center will be transformed into The Devil's Theater. Professional actors have only one mission – to scare you beyond belief.

At 8PM Fearless Productions will be presenting Jekyll & Hyde the musical at the Hamilton Stage (360 Hamilton St.).

Restaurants in Rahway's downtown will be having Halloween parties and specials.

BLUE JAYS IN YOUR GARDEN WINTER BIRD FEEDING - PEANUTS

Blue Jays are native North American forest dwellers, common in our area. They are a familiar and noisy presence around many North American bird feeders. If you want to bedazzle friends and family, little is easier than feeding and attracting Bluejays to your garden, seemingly on command.

Attracting Blue Jays is as easy as putting out a cup of unsalted peanuts* every day with some gray striped sunflower seeds. These beautiful creatures will quickly become dependable and frequent visitors to your garden. If you put peanuts out close to the same time every day you can count on these highly adaptable and intelligent birds to show up within minutes of their regular feeding time. It is truly amazing. If you want to put out more later in the afternoon there always seems to be a 'watch bird' ready to give a call to the rest of the flock.

These beautiful blue crested birds with black and gray wings are easily recognizable. Their bird call is a loud "Jay! Jay!" sound. This is only one of a wide variety sounds the bird employs including excellent imitations of several hawk calls. When Blue Jays are in your area you will definitely hear them.

Blue Jays are sometimes known to eat eggs or nestlings of other birds making many people hate them. It is this practice that has tarnished their reputation, but in fact, they are largely vegetarian birds. Most of their diet is composed of acorns, nuts, and seeds.

Most northern Blue Jays head south for the winter and join large flocks of up to 250 birds although some do not migrate. The ones that stay add dramatic color and excitement to the winter landscape. Bluejay migration is still considered a mystery to scientists.

Blue Jays have a special throat pouch that can

hold extra seeds and acorns which they bury until later. This is why the Blue Jays are credited with replanting our woodland forest after the last ice age.

*Don't put out too many peanuts at one time. You will only be feeding the squirrels.



ASTRONOMER CARL SAGAN WAS INSPIRED BY TEACHER AT RAHWAY HIGH



Carl Edward Sagan, Rahway High School graduate, class of 1951, was perhaps the most popular and well–known astronomer during the 1970s, 80s, and 90s. Sagan not only pioneered exobiology, the branch of science that deals with the possibility and likely nature of life on other planets or in space, but also worked closely with NASA on many of their space probes. He was also responsible for popularizing science by making the field more interesting, more exciting, and more comprehensible for the general public.

Sagan was born in Brooklyn, New York on November 9, 1934, the son of immigrant parents. Samuel Sagan, Carl's father, was a garment worker and there was little reason to believe his son would be destined for any other occupation. The young boy, however, had an inquisitive spirit and after a visit to the New York World's Fair in 1939, the four-year-old became enthralled by the wonders the future was predicted to bring. Over the next ten years, Carl developed an insatiable appetite for the mystery of the planets and stars and became an avid reader of the popular science fiction magazines of the day that featured amazing stories of space travel, flying saucers, and visitors from outer space. For fans of the genre, their interest was given only a hobby status owing to the fact that science fiction had not yet become a serious topic for mainstream scientists.

In 1948, the Sagans moved to Rahway and fourteen-year old Carl enrolled in Rahway High, not yet realizing the possibility that his hobby would eventually become his career. On a fateful day, while in biology class, his teacher, Mr. Lee Yothers, assured him that one could actually make a profession and earn a livelihood as an astronomer. Sagan would often recall that incident and comment, "That was a splendid day when I began to suspect that if I tried hard I could do astronomy full-time, not just parttime."

After graduating from R. H. S., where he was chosen "Most Likely to Succeed" by his senior



classmates, Sagan attended the University of Chicago and received a B. A. and B. S. (1955), an M. S. in physics (1956), and a Ph. D. in astronomy and astrophysics (1960). For two years (1960-1962), he was a Miller Fellow at the University of California, Berkeley, and later worked at the Smithsonian Astrophysical Observatory in Cambridge, Massachusetts (1962-1968) during which time he lectured at Harvard. In 1971 he became a full professor at Cornell and served as the Associate Director of the Center for Radio Physics and Space Research at the university.


Sagan's contributions and achievements in

science over his lifetime were many and varied. He was the first to postulate the actual high temperatures on the planet Venus and warned how a similar "greenhouse effect" could alter temperature changes on earth. He perceived global warning as a growing man-made danger years before it became the current and controversial topic it is today. Sagan also hypothesized that Jupiter's moon Europa was potentially habitable, and contributed insights regarding seasonal changes on Mars. At the height of the Cold War, he became an advocate for nuclear disarmament and theorized the dangers of a "Nuclear Winter."

Sagan served as an advisor at NASA from its inception, contributing to many of the robotic space craft missions that explored the solar system. He conceived the idea of adding an unalterable and universal message on space craft that could be understood by any extraterrestrial intelligence that might find it. His first message "Record" was sent into space on space probe Pioneer, launched in 1972, and his "records" were also attached to several other probes in 1973 and 1977.

Over the course of his career, Sagan published more than six hundred scientific papers and authored, co-authored, or edited more than twenty books. Some of his more popular titles include the Dragons of Eden for which he won a Pulitzer Prize, Broca's Brain, the Blue Dot, and Contact. His award winning television series "Cosmos a Personal Voyage" was the most widely watched series in the history of American Public Television. Cosmos, winner of an Emmy and a Peabody award, has been seen by over 500 million people across sixty different countries.

Most television viewers watched Cosmos and/or saw Carl Sagan on his frequent appearances as Johnny Carson's guest on the Tonight Show never realizing he was a graduate of Rahway High. In 1995, the Rahway Board of Education paid tribute to Sagan by naming the science wing of the high school after the famous astronomer.
