KENILWORTH VFW LOOKING FOR VIETNAM ERA WAR VETERANS

Robert Jeans, commander of Kenilworth VFW Post 2230, has announced that the Post is seeking the whereabouts of any current or former Kenilworth resident who saw military service during the period of the Vietnam War, whether in Vietnam or not.

"Officially speaking," stated Commander Jeans, "the US Department of Veterans Affairs uses the time frame of service beginning February 28, 1961 to May 7, 1975. Our members have been busy for a number of months trying to compile such a list of local servicemen and women. We are searching for anyone who served our country during that period whether in Vietnam, Southeast Asia, or any other place in the world. We just want to find 'our boys and our girls' who served our great nation during that time period whether in combat or not."

Jeans added, "We are looking for as much of the following data as possible for each person. But any leads would be appreciated. That desired information includes: (1) name, (2) branch of service, (3) unit, (4) rank, (5) the years served – from when to when, (6) where stationed, (7) Kenilworth address, (8) where living now or if deceased, (9) current contact information, (10) and a photograph – preferably in uniform." The commander added, "Photographs will be returned

if requested."

Jeans concluded, "This information may be sent in by the veteran, a family member, or a friend. We are trying to make sure that these patriotic citizens are remembered for their courage and loyalty to America. They each deserve this recognition."



of Charles E. Vitale, Jr. "Mr. Kenilworth". Mayor Fred Pugliese read a proclamation dedicating the park on Lincoln Drive in his memory on October 28, 2015 during a Council Meeting.

Charles E. Vitale, Jr. "Mr. Kenilworth" was born and raised in Kenilworth before passing on January 25, 2006 at the age of 84. He ran the "Variety Shop" on the Boulevard, was an arbitrator with the American Arbitration Association, officer of the Kenilworth Lions Club, Businessmen's Association, Charter member of the Rotary Club, Director of the Washington Rock Girl Scouts Council, driving force in the Kenilworth Senior Citizens Club and held many varied seats in Borough and County government. The former is just the tip of the iceberg for this civic minded family man.

Charlie was married to the love of his life, Charlotte, for almost 60 years. They raised their five children in Kenilworth; Antoinette, Thomas, Nancy, Peter and Joseph. In an article published in the Cranford Chronicle, July 20, 1989, Charlie is quoted as saying "My lifestyle is that I must be involved. I simply can not sit down and do nothing."

The full proclamation:

WHEREAS, Charles E. Vitale, Jr. a lifelong resident of Kenilworth, affectionately referred to as "Mr. Kenilworth" for his vast knowledge of the town's history, government, educational and business/industrial components, loved Kenilworth and expressed his devotion through the many civic, social and charitable organizations with which he was involved throughout the past 60 years; and

The Borough of Kenilworth honored the life began as a founding charter member of the Kenilworth Rotary Club in the 1940's and continued into the 1950s and 1960's with his involvement in the Kenilworth Historical Society and the Kenilworth Lions Club, as President of the Kenilworth Businessmen's Association in the late 1950's, Charlie started an annual holiday tradition of flying Santa into the Borough by helicopter. He was a member of the Kenilworth Board of Adjustment and served as Kenilworth's representative to the State Cross Acceptance Planning Commission. Charlie remained an active member of the Kenilworth Planning Board until his passing; and

> WHEREAS, in 1971, he was elected to the Union County Board of Education as Kenilworth's Representative and served on the Board for thirteen years – nine continuous years of which he served as Board President. When he retired from the Board in 1984, he was honored by having the David Brearley Media Center named after him, and a scholarship in his name funded by the Brearley Bears Booster Club; and

> WHEREAS, in 1987, with the assistance of other members of the community and the Kenilworth Police Department, Charlie established a local Youth Services Chapter to help troubled kids. From organizing lectures, cruises, trips to the Meadowlands or Manhattan and every type of activity in between, he gave tirelessly of his time to help Kenilworth youths at risk. He also served on the Board of Directors of the Washington Rock Girl Scout Council and devoted much of his time to that organization.

WHEREAS, Charlie was devoted to the Seniors of Kenilworth and was actively involved WHEREAS, Charlie's civic involvement in the Kenilworth Senior Citizen Club. He served

two terms as Club president from 1987 to 1989. Although there was a two-term limit under Club rules, the members elected Charlie to a third term in 1992. As President, he was instrumental in bringing a federally funded nutrition program to the Seniors Club - where anyone over 60 could receive a full meal at the Senior Center; and

WHEREAS, among his many other accomplishments, Charlie was a successful businessman and ran his own construction company until he retired in the early 1970s. He remained involved in the industry as a professional arbitrator with the American Arbitration Associations commercial panel, mediating and arbitrating complex construction disputes. In 1993 he was honored as Citizen of the Year by the Greater Eastern Union County Board of Realtors.

WHEREAS, Charlie met Charlotte Allen while ice skating at Jackson's Pond in Kenilworth; in 1946 they married. Their five children, Antoinette, Thomas, Nancy, Peter and Joseph were all raised in the Borough. A loving and dedicated husband, father, grandfather and great grandfather; of all his accomplishments, most important to him and closest to his heart was his family. He loved them dearly and devoted his life to them.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that on this 28th day of October, 2015, in recognition of his service and devotion to his community and family, on behalf of the Council and the residents of this great community, I proclaim the little neighborhood park between Lincoln Drive and Roosevelt Lane, the new Charles E. Vitale, Jr. Park, as it shall be known from this date forward.

GIVING TREE




