On Saturday, October 3, 2015, twelve children auditioned for the role of the mice in ARB's Nutcracker. The mice take part in the famous battle scene in the ballet, where the main character Clara dreams that tiny mice in her living room grow giant and take on the army of toy soldiers and the Nutcracker prince.

The six children that were selected to perform as this year's Nutcracker Community Mice are: Madison Ferreira (1st Grade) and Elisha Mena (2nd Grade) from Franklin School, Raquelle Reinoso (K) from Madison School, Kyra Jones (K) and Evan Martin (2nd Grade) from Roosevelt School, and Anastasia Rachinsky (1st Grade) from St. John Vianney.

The mission of American Repertory Ballet (ARB) is "to bring the joy, beauty, artistry and discipline of classical and contemporary dance to New Jersey and nationwide audiences through

public performances and to dance students through artistic and educational programs." This year's "Community Mice Initiative" aims at fulfilling this mission in an immersive way that will expose children to a professional environment and challenge them to achieve performance goals.

"We are thrilled to bring this opportunity to the children of Rahway," says Lisa Beth Vettoso, Director of Educational and Community Programming. "Rahway is an incredibly supportive and artistic community, and the 'Community Mice Initiative' offers local children not only an exciting performance opportunity, but also a wonderful, immersive learning experience with role models in the arts."

Rahway Community Mice rehearsals begin Saturday, October 10, 2015.

In a continuing effort to reach all types of audiences, ARB will also offer its first Sensory Friendly performance of Nutcracker on Sunday, November 22 at 1:00pm at UCPAC.

DAY OF PRAYER DRAWS TOGETHER LEADERS FROM MULTIPLE FAITHS

Amidst a time of international, national and local violence and crises, leaders from more than 40 houses of faith throughout Union County came together this week for the second Union County Day of Prayer, held Wednesday at the First United Methodist Church in Westfield. More than 300 people were in attendance.

"Praying for peace in the midst of violence" featured readings and comments from religious leaders of a number of faiths, including Christianity, Judaism, Islam and Buddhism, as well as music.

The Union County Day of Prayer is an interfaith gathering of the faith-based, nonprofit and government communities to unite people from throughout the county regardless of race, religion or disability and to bring greater awareness of the support services available to them, according to Sid Blanchard, executive director of Community Access Unlimited (CAU), which supports people with disabilities and at-risk youth.

The event is sponsored by the Union County Interfaith Coordinating Council, an organization comprising 40 interfaith congregations and community-based nonprofits, including CAU. The council promotes inclusion of all people within the community, without regard to race, religion or disability, and creates a clearing house of faith-based, nonprofit and government community services available to the public, according to Blanchard.

"We come together to help bring the community together," Blanchard said. "You can't have community unless all people are included in that community and are respected for their worth as humans.

"We see today a lot of violence taking place in the community. For a lot of us, violence is not a one-time occurrence, it's an everyday occurrence," he added, noting that people with disabilities are among the most prevalent victims of violence in the community.

Cantor Matthew Axelrod of the Congregational Beth Israel in Scotch Plains, was one of the religious leaders who participated in

the event.

"I think these interfaith events are very important," he said. "They bring the community together and give us access to each other's traditions. It de-emphasizes what divides us and shows us what we have in common, bringing us together."

Pastor Carmine Pernini of the Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church in Rahway, said, "There is a lot of violence in community and it's a good sign that various religious traditions can come together and pray. That is a sign of peace. I'm here to pray with my brothers and sisters in a sign of peace."

Father Jack Martin, Priest Emeritus, said, "We debate. We argue. We take sides and defend our rights. Among all the anger and violence, let us remember there is reverence in the face of the other."

Ven. Duhk-Song Sunim of the So Shim Sa Zen Center in Plainfield, added, "The Buddhist teachings are based on kindness and love of all living creatures. The Buddhist view is we are all part of the larger community."

Imam Ali Jaaber of the Masjid Darul Islam Mosque in Elizabeth, said every community must embrace those in the greatest need at times of

crises, citing the needs of the 600,000 refugees pouring into Europe.

"We have to reach out to see what support we have and the attitudes and dispositions of people of other faiths. We have to build on that," he said, adding that the mosque will be holding coats drives for refugees and will look across denominations for support, something the Interfaith Coordinating Council has made possible, he said.

"It has benefitted our community," he said. "Jobs, education, training, record expungement. As a person serving the community I have to stay active with those in the county who do the same."

Added Blanchard, "It's great to have a Thanksgiving dinner. It's great to have a holiday collection and a Day of Prayer. But there are 362 other days of the year we have to be here for each other."

CAU is a statewide Elizabeth-based nonprofit providing support programs and services to adults with disabilities as well as youth served under the Department of Children and Families (DCF) to enable them to live independently in the community, in areas including housing, vocational and life-skills training, education, advocacy and recreation.

Have you seen this collection box? It sits on the sidewalk on Park Avenue in front of the stores across from the Scotch Plains Municipal Building. It is not a mail box so don't put letters in it! It is a collection box for used glasses and hearing aids and a project of the Scotch Plains Lions Club. The Lions open the box and collect the glasses. The used glasses are brought to a charitable organization, New Eyes for the Needy in Short Hills NJ. They clean and sort the eyeglasses and hearing aids and if they are reusable they send these to medical missions and international charitable organizations for distribution to poor people in over 25 countries around the globe. Gold-framed eyeglasses and metal scrap are sold and the proceeds are used to purchase new prescription eyeglasses for the needy in the US. With the community's support, the Scotch Plains Lions Club recycled over 2,000 eyeglasses in 2014. Similar collection boxes can be found at Elm and Broad in Westfield (Westfield Lions Club) and in the Fanwood Recycle Center and on South Avenue by the Fanwood Train Station (Fanwood Club).



The Scotch Plains Lions Club is part of Lions International, the world's largest and most active

service organization with more than 1.4 million members in more than 43,000 Lions Clubs around the world. There are over 200 Lions Clubs just in New Jersey. The Scotch Plains Lions Club meets the second Thursday of each month at 7 PM at the Jade Isle. The club has many fund raising activities and the money is distributed to local charities and community activities and most importantly to many organizations throughout the area which serve the blind and visually impaired.

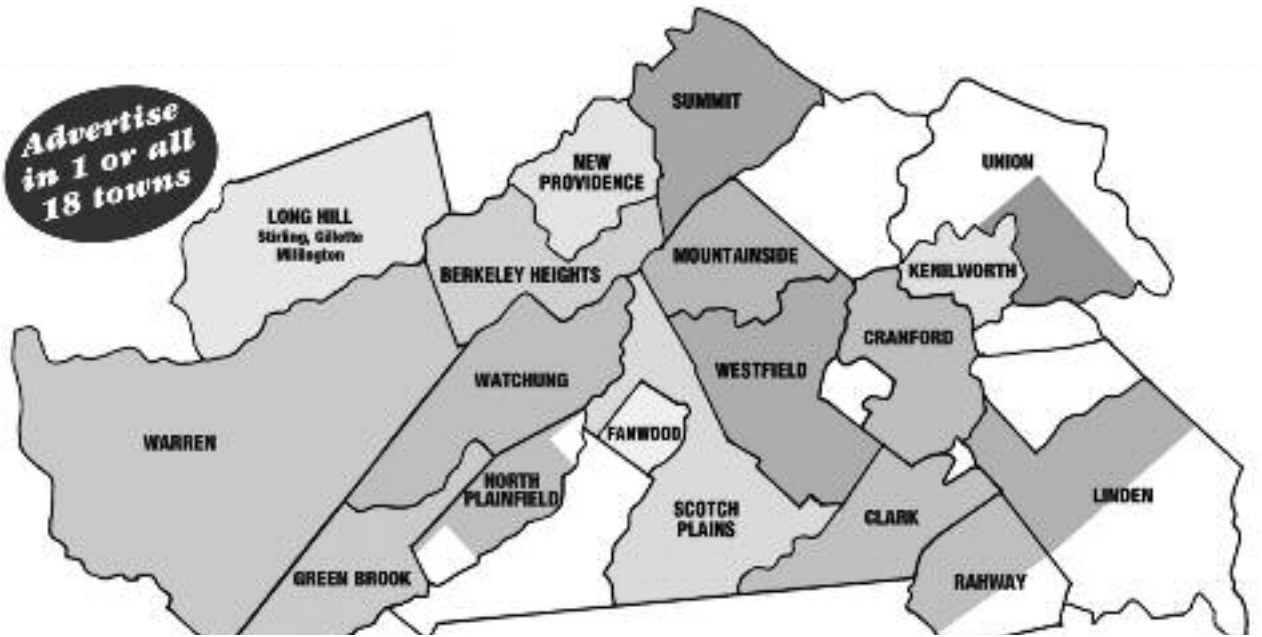
