#### **BUILDING THE CITIZENS OF TOMORROW**

Hard work has never been this much fun. The Scouts of Troop 368 had been hard at work during the summer, earning a total of 232 merit badges among themselves. They were just getting warmed up for the new school year. Within the first 10 weeks of the school year, the Scouts have gone canoeing, visited the attractions of Washington DC, committed their time to three community service projects in town and launched an official STEM program within their Troop.

The school year started with a canoe trip down Delaware at the Ten Mile River in New York where the Scouts camped and cooked next to the river. Over NJEA weekend, under the watchful supervision of the adult leaders of the Troop, 30 Scouts visited the many educational museums and historical monuments of the nation's capital, including the Capitol building, the Washington Monument, the American History Museum, the Smithsonian Air and Space Museum, the National Archives and the International Spy Museum. They attended workshops on what it took to become a spy at the Spy Museum and saw the original Declaration of Independence at the National Archives; the Scouts had a full schedule.

The Scouts walked all the way to all the attractions and some of them even packed in a History of Scouting hike.

Under the leadership of Scoutmaster Joe Allegra and several other dedicated Adult Scout leaders, Troop 368 has made a consistent commitment of giving back to its community. Although community service hours are essential for rank advancement, these projects achieve much more by engaging the young boys in something productive and purposeful. Scouts learn the humble responsibility of giving back and doing so with respect, which in turn helps build up their character and integrity. Adult Scout leaders not only mentor the Scouts, but also set an example themselves by volunteering their own time and energy to the next generation of young men. The Troop kicked off the year by cleaning up the town on September 26th, they even invited family and friends to join in the cleanup. Troop 368 volunteered to give back to its host school, Mountain Park School. For several hours on a crisp October afternoon this year, Scouts raked and bagged leaves and blew away debris to make the school tidier and safer for its students. In November, Scouts helped serve breakfast at the Rotary Club Pancake Breakfast at the Little Flower Church.



Currently about 20 of the Troop Scouts are preparing for a High Adventure trip to the Grand Canyon in the summer of 2016. They have begun fundraising for this week long trip and have started preparing themselves physically for the grueling hikes and rafting in the Canyon. A handful of the senior Scouts are working towards their Eagle Rank and as is common with Eagle Projects, their projects will touch and improve parks, trails, churches, schools and other community facilities.

These young men and boys are giving back to their communities, building deep friendships with each other, learning valuable leadership skills and having fun while doing it. At the December campout, Scouts will be building their own fire without matches! A Winterfest is planned for mid-January and in another upcoming challenge at the end of January called the Klondike Derby, Scouts will race sleds, a test of skill and strength, through the Watchung Reservation. This year a new tradition began in Berkeley Heights. A special program honoring our Veterans and military personnel and formally renaming the centrally located Memorial Park was held on November 11th. The new program was part of "Operation: We Remember" and coordinated by the Veterans Memorial Park Renewal Committee. VFW Post 6259 presented the colors. Honorary Committee Member and long time resident Vito Mondelli led the flag salute. In an emotional speech, Shiloh Frampton representing the VFW, thanked the town for honoring our Veterans and service men and women with this new ceremony, and how significant it is that the Park has been renamed. Mayor Robert Woodruff formally renamed Memorial Park to Veterans Memorial Park and placed a wreath on the Memorial Wall. He encouraged the over 100 people in the crowd to remember our Veterans and enlisted personnel not just on Veterans Day, but every day.

Through funds already raised and with tremendous volunteer help and donated materials, a new Memorial wall and walkway to the park have been installed, along with new electrical upgrades that beautifully light Old Glory at night.

Mayor Woodruff shared his recent experience visiting Normandy and reminded the crowd of the amazing courage and sacrifices of our soldiers so that we might enjoy our freedom. Councilman and Committee member Craig Pastore read the names of Berkeley Heights men who died in service to our country in World War II

Committee Chair Ted Romankow explained that funds are still needed to complete the park renovations which include: new sidewalks, benches, and lamp posts, as well as a new statue entitled "Fallen Soldier" and monuments to those who served in Afghanistan and the continuing War on Terror in the Middle East. Renovations will be done in time for Memorial Day 2016 but financial and volunteer support is still needed. 



## **HOME FOR GOOD DOG RESCUE CELEBRATES 4,000 ADOPTIONS**

Summit-based nonprofit organization Home for Good Dog Rescue celebrated its milestone 4,000th adoption on Nov. 28 as part of a special two-day event hosted at its offices in Berkeley Heights, NJ.

At a mere 13-weeks-old, Stella, a former stray Labrador Retriever mix from Swainsboro, GA and the sole survivor of her litter, found her forever home that morning amid enthusiastic applause from the organization's volunteers, staff, and fosters.

"It's amazing how far we have come in just five short years," Rich Errico, Home for Good's co-founder and treasurer, said. "Our operation started out of somebody's living room in 2010, and we would not have been able to grow so much in such a short time without the support of our local community."

Home for Good's staff surprised the Perrone family of Madison, NJ by announcing that they and Stella marked the latest major benchmark in the organization's five-year history. And following a round of applause, the team popped open a bottle of champagne to truly begin the celebration.

"Every dog we save reminds us why we do what we do," Home for Good Dog Rescue's Public Relations and Social Media Coordinator Matt Holowienka said. "It's wonderful to see Stella go home with such a wonderful family, and everything truly seemed to align to make this moment possible."

After visiting the first part of the adoption event on Nov. 27, the Perrone family fell in love with Stella and hastily filled out an application for adoption. And although they worried she would find another home as they waited for approval, she was still eagerly waiting when they returned Saturday morning.

"I was here for the 1000th adoption," Foster

Coordinator Susan Strell said. "That we have placed so many dogs not only in permanent homes but in foster homes is more success than we could have ever imagined."

The 100-percent foster-based Home for Good Dog Rescue transports dogs from high-kill shelters throughout South Carolina and Georgia to New Jersey in search of their forever homes. It has been only one year since it celebrated its milestone 3,000th adoption in 2014.

"We're only going to keep growing from here, and it's wonderful that so many people have gotten involved in our mission," Errico remarked.

Home for Good's next endeavor is the construction of the ALMOST HOME Wellness Center in Aiken, S.C. This specialized facility

will allow the organization to rescue even more dogs by providing a safe place of recovery and rest for dogs either too young or too sick to make the journey north.


