
#### **SPFHS TEACHER RELEASES FOURTH BOOK**

Author Gwyn English Nielsen, teacher of English and communications at Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School and resident of Scotch Plains, recently released her fourth book in print: From Footlights to Flashlights: Ten conceptual plays that reach and teach teens. The anthology is a collection of character-building plays, each focusing on a specific theme related to a challenge that adolescents often experience in today's society.

From Footlights to Flashlights contains oneact pieces that could be referred to as "morality plays" as each teaches a message, a moral. Themes include good vs. evil, identity, peer pressure, romantic love, inequity, manners, miscommunication, sexism, grief, and tolerance— all relevant given today's everchanging, moral and ethical climate. Nielsen's previous works for children, Serendipity and the Dream Catcher and Torey the Turkey Goes Skiing are also didactic in content.

Nielsen started penning the one acts fifteen years ago when she was teaching theater at a local summer camp. Gradually, she began to produce and direct the short plays. Four of the ten she produced and directed while a teacher at Terrill Middle School. Her students performed them at Park Middle, Terrill Middle, and at Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School to rave reviews. After writing six more, she decided to put all ten together in the anthology so that other teachers of drama/English would be able to produce them as school assemblies for no royalty fees. "For me, it's always about the message and not about the money. As a society, we are moving away from traditional values, turning inward. It's time to return to existential soul-searching and to what is truly important in life," suggests Nielsen. She also admits that some of the plays are autobiographical in content. "All authors draw from their own lives. Fortunately, I've had a fascinating one so far so that my plays tend to be on the avant-garde side. Scenic elements are sparse and the staging is often unorthodox. Consequently, no one needs a big budget to produce them."





Recently in mid-October, the book was featured at the Frankfort International Book Fair in Frankfurt, Germany, which is the world's largest. From Footlights to Flashlights will also be featured at the AASL's (American Association of School Librarians) seventeenth national conference and exhibition in Columbus, Ohio, November 5-8.

Locally, Gwyn English Nielsen and a collection of student actors will present scenes from the book at the Mountainside Library (Saturday, March 5 from 2 to 3 p.m.). The book is available for purchase on-line via Amazon and Barnes and Noble.com and as a special order in stores.

#### **SO MUCH BIGGER THAN A BOX - OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD**

Juliette Rose, a resident of Scotch Plains and first grader at Trivium Academy of New Jersey, participated in a worthy cause that will touch the heart and life of a child thousands of miles away. As part of her community service at her school, she donated her time filling up a box with toys, hygiene products and school supplies; items most American children may take for granted and certainly would not expect to find under their Christmas tree. In an interview with Jill Parasine, a volunteer with the North Central New Jersey Area Team of Operation Christmas Child for the past five years, she shared a memorable moment from one recipient of an Operation Christmas Child box. "Alex, a Rwandan boy, received a comb which he carried for years and cherished because he felt such pride in having one of his own," said Parasine. "He later volunteered for OCC as a young man to give back and to help others understand how their gift can impact the life of a child in another country. Even a small gift, such as a toothbrush, could be an extraordinary item to children in some countries where families share one toothbrush."

Before packing the boxes with donated items, students watched a video at school explaining the collection process and how each of their boxes will carry great joy and meaning to another child. The kids were delighted to learn that the boxes can be delivered by canoe, camel, truck, donkey, and even by elephant.

Since 1993, Samaritan's Purse,a Christian Humanitarian aid organization, founded by Rev. Franklin Graham, Rev. Billy Graham's son,has collected and delivered more than 124 million gift-filled shoe boxes to children in more than 150 countries and territories through Operation Christmas Child. In 2015, Operation Christmas Child hopes to collect enough shoe box gifts to reach another11 million children. Shoebox gifts are collected in the U.S., Australia, Finland, Germany, Japan, New Zealand, Canada, Spain and the U.K.

Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes are delivered children around the

world. Samaritan's Purse not only delivers the boxes to children, they also invite the children to attend a 12-part Bible study, entitled "The Greatest Journey" in their language at their level. It ends with a lively graduation ceremony and a gift of a Bible in their language.

Volunteers from the synagogue's Social Action Committee conducted a month-long coat drive collection and seventh-grade Religious School





CASA of Union County, a non-profit that recruits, trains, supervises and supports community members to advocate for abused, neglected or abandoned children in foster care, will receive 15 percent of sales between 6 and 8 p.m. Monday, February 1, 2016, at a "Charmed by Charity" soiree in the popular jeweler's Westfield shop at 200 East Broad Street. Shoppers enjoy light refreshments and Alex & Ani's (+) energy punch, while CASA staffers on hand can offer more about the CASA experience and the need in our own community.

There are nearly 600 Union County children in foster care through no fault of their own, and each has a case pending in family court in Elizabeth. After completion of 30 hours of training in Westfield, CASAs are sworn in by a Union County judge and empowered by court order to speak to all parties in the child's life foster parents, teachers, doctors, therapists and more. CASAs meet with their foster youth regularly and participate in quarterly court hearings to ensure the youth's needs are met and their best interests remain priority.

CASA currently has volunteers to serve just approximately one-quarter of the county's foster youth; its goal is to provide one advocate for every foster child. There are myriad ways to help make that a reality, and bringing friends, family and colleagues to shop the Alex & Ani event is an easy way, as all proceeds go toward funding trainings for members of the community to become sworn advocates and the voice for a foster child.

#### **ADVOCATES NEEDED FOR AREA FOSTER YOUTH UNION COUNTY TEENS FACE AGING-OUT ALONE**

Marla was 15 when she and her mom came to New Jersey from El Salvador. She was promised housing with her sister and brother-in-law, food and the chance to attend school. However, when Marla arrived, she was forced to work long hours at a restaurant strip club and not allowed school. After Marla's brother-in-law sexually abused her, Marla told her mom, who kicked her out of the house. Scared and alone, the teen moved in with her boyfriend, who made her work two jobs to pay for rent and food. Dreams of school seemed impossible now. Just when Marla thought it couldn't get worse, she became pregnant and her boyfriend beat her until she lost the baby. A co-worker let Marla stay with her but called the state when she couldn't help anymore. Marla, still just 15, then began a journey in foster care.

Each year, nearly 23,000 youth age out nationally; 450 right here in New Jersey. Data shows these kids often lack the necessary skills to live independently, resulting in 40 percent being homeless, 55 percent unemployed, 1 in 4 suffering with post-traumatic stress, 60 percent arrested and 71 percent experiencing unplanned pregnancies. These youth are twice as likely than non-foster kids to not earn a high school diploma or GED, and 25 percent earn a two- or four-year degree by the age of 24.

Will you be the voice for one of the nearly 600 Union County youth, ages 0-21, in foster

care through no fault of their own? CASAs are sworn in by a judge and court-empowered to speak to all parties: foster parents, teachers, doctors, therapists and more. CASAs incorporate their findings — as well as observations from regular visits with the youth — into reports for the judge. They participate in quarterly court hearings and work to ensure the youth's time in care is as short as possible and their best interests remain priority.

Join CASA's next training class, which kicks off Tuesday, March 1, 2016. CASA advocates for youth age 0-21. Those interested in working with youth 14-21 also undergo specialized Fostering Futures training, designed to equip volunteers with tools to guide teens toward a successful future on their own.



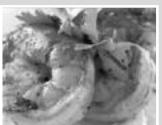
