RAKE AND HOE GARDEN CLUB SERVES OUR VETERANS

The Rake and Hoe Garden Club is fulfilling their mission of service to the community this year by participating in Apple Fest at the Westfield Historical Society in October where they created floral designs given away for donations to the veterans. Members purchased allium bulbs as a fundraiser this Fall as well, accumulating almost \$600 in profit for the veterans. The Club appreciates all the donations from the public! This funding will be allocated to Music for All Seasons,

a non-profit organization in Scotch Plains, which serves veterans through their creative song-writing program, "Voices of Valor" (voicesofvalor.org) as well as Rake and Hoe's own established veterans projects at Lyons Veterans Hospital.

Since 1952, the Rake and Hoe Club has joyfully fulfilled their mission to provide decorating services to the Lyons Veterans Medical Center, Lyons, NJ. Four times a year the members provide floral arrangements for dining tables and individual bedside arrangements for the veterans.

In addition, for several years Rake and Hoe members have prepared gift baskets (filled with toiletries, socks, games and other necessary items) to be distributed to the veterans during the holiday season. This year 111 veteran gift bags have been delivered to Lyons Hospital. New this Fall, Rake and Hoe began writing cards to the veterans at Lyons thanking them for their service. One hundred eighty cards were hand written and sent to veterans at the Lyons Hospital. This will be done again in the Spring.

The Department of Veterans Affairs New Jersey Health Care System is comprised of two main campuses, which provide health care to veterans. Services include long-term care, psychiatric care and a full range of medical and surgical care. Special programs include cancer screening, diabetes education, healthy aging, home based care, post-traumatic stress disorder, war related illnesses and women's health services. Lyons is affiliated with the University of Medicine and Dentistry and the Trenton State





ADVOCATES NEEDED FOR AREA FOSTER YOUTH UNION COUNTY TEENS FACE AGING-OUT ALONE

Marla was 15 when she and her mom came to New Jersey from El Salvador. She was promised housing with her sister and brother-in-law, food and the chance to attend school. However, when Marla arrived, she was forced to work long hours at a restaurant strip club and not allowed school. After Marla's brother-in-law sexually abused her, Marla told her mom, who kicked her out of the house. Scared and alone, the teen moved in with her boyfriend, who made her work two jobs to pay for rent and food. Dreams of school seemed impossible now. Just when Marla thought it couldn't get worse, she became pregnant and her boyfriend beat her until she lost the baby. A co-worker let Marla stay with her but called the state when she couldn't help anymore. Marla, still just 15, then began a journey in foster care.

Each year, nearly 23,000 youth age out nationally; 450 right here in New Jersey. Data shows these kids often lack the necessary skills

to live independently, resulting in 40 percent being homeless, 55 percent unemployed, 1 in 4 suffering with post-traumatic stress, 60 percent arrested and 71 percent experiencing unplanned pregnancies. These youth are twice as likely than non-foster kids to not earn a high school diploma or GED, and 25 percent earn a two- or four-year degree by the age of 24.

Will you be the voice for one of the nearly 600 Union County youth, ages 0-21, in foster care through no fault of their own? CASAs are sworn in by a judge and court-empowered to speak to all parties: foster parents, teachers, doctors, therapists and more. CASAs incorporate their findings — as well as observations from regular visits with the youth — into reports for the judge. They participate in quarterly court hearings and work to ensure the youth's time in care is as short as possible and their best interests remain priority.

Join CASA's next training class, which kicks

off Tuesday, March 1, 2016. CASA advocates for youth age 0-21. Those interested in working with youth 14-21 also undergo specialized Fostering Futures training, designed to equip volunteers with tools to guide teens toward a successful future on their own.

CASAs meet with their foster youth regularly and participate in quarterly court hearings to ensure the youth's needs are met and their best interests remain priority.

CASA currently has volunteers to serve just approximately one-quarter of the county's foster youth; its goal is to provide one advocate for every foster child. There are myriad ways to help make that a reality, and bringing friends, family and colleagues to shop the Alex & Ani event is an easy way, as all proceeds go toward funding trainings for members of the community to become sworn advocates and the voice for a foster child.

All new students will be required to have the following information for registration in the Westfield Public Schools: Birth certificate with raised seal from the Bureau of Vital Statistics; Proof of residence (utility bill, tax bill, lease, closing statement, voter registration); Personal Health History; and Proof of Immunization (most recent record), which includes: Diphtheria, Pertussis and Tetanus vaccine (DPT Series) – 4 doses with 1 dose given on or after the fourth birthday, or any total of 5 doses. Poliomyelitis vaccine - 3 doses of oral poliovirus vaccine (OPV) or enhanced inactivated polio vaccine (IPV), with 1 dose given on or after the fourth birthday, or any 4 doses spaced by a minimum of 1 month.

Rubeola (Measles) vaccine – 2 doses given on

on or before October 1, 2016 and have not yet or after the first birthday separated by at least a month, or laboratory documentation of immunity. Rubella (German Measles) vaccine - 1 dose given on or after the first birthday, or laboratory documentation of immunity. Mumps vaccine – 1 dose given on or after the first birthday, or laboratory documentation of immunity. Hepatitis B vaccine – 3 doses or laboratory documentation of immunity. Varicella vaccine - one dose of varicella vaccine on or after the first birthday or proof of disease or immunity is required for children 19 months of age or older who attend a child care center, or are entering Kindergarten or Grade 1. State law will not permit any child to be admitted to a public school unless immunizations have been completed and documented by an M.D., D.O., or Nurse Practitioner, specifically indicating a day, month and year administered.

Only one entry physical examination is necessary on admission to kindergarten or first grade (pre-K physical may be the entry physical). A 5 year physical exam is recommended. Registration, Personal Health History, Physical Exam and Medical Records forms are available district web site www.westfieldnjk12.org. They are located within the Parents tab under the "New Student Registration Forms" link and can be printed and completed before the scheduled registration date. These forms are also available by calling one of the schools. Should parents have any questions about the registration process, please call one of the Westfield Public Schools.

In the event of a delayed opening or school closing due to inclement weather, registration for that day will be rescheduled. 


