

CLARK VETERAN RAISES FUNDS FOR NEW WOMEN'S WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL

William Caruso is gathering the troops. With the sponsorship and help of Clark American Legion post #328 and Clark UNICO, Caruso is working to raise funds for Clark's first Women's War Veterans Memorial.

The idea came after Caruso helped the American Legion raise money for the Purple Heart Monument in town. Caruso was talking with his wife, Gert, about the open space that remained in front of town hall. "My wife asked, 'Why isn't there a monument dedicated to the hardworking women who have served our country? And that got me thinking," said Caruso.

A veteran wounded during the Korean war, Caruso knew firsthand how imperative the women serving were to his recovery. "I was in the navy hospital and each of the naval nurses treated me with such compassion," Caruso said.

With that thought, Caruso knew exactly what should fill that blank space in front of town hall, and the work for the Women's War Veterans Memorial began.

While the memorial's design is not yet complete, Caruso explained that it will be an image of a woman in uniform saluting the flag. There will also be a statement thanking the women who have served in the military.

Caruso aims to have the unveiling ceremony at the end of April, 2016. He hopes to have women veterans there for the ceremony and will invite top officials.

In order to get funding for the memorial, Caruso has teamed up with Clark's American Legion and Clark UNICO to put together a

> "Clark UNICO is glad we can be part of such an honor for our female military," Clark UNICO president Ralph Bernardo said.

> Caruso expressed his gratitude to the National Tree Company. They are sponsoring a table for five wounded veterans who served in Iraq and/or Afghanistan and their guests.

> The event will be held at Gran Centurions on February 14, 2016 at 6 p.m. Tickets costs \$60 per person and include the dinner and show. A cash bar is available.

> The proceeds of the event benefit both the Women's War Veterans Memorial and the Wounded Warrior Fund. Seating is limited so Caruso urged those interested to reserve a spot soon. 
David was born in Lexington, Kentucky, and raised in Springfield, N.J. He earned a B.A. in Science Education at Montclair University in 1950 and a Masters in Administration and Supervision at Montclair in 1957. A scholarship in his name has been established for a graduating senior at Westfield Senior High School, for one who has demonstrated an extraordinary interest in natural or environmental sciences.

He joined the army in 1945 and served with the 15th Infantry regiment in the Philippines, receiving the Asiatic Pacific Campaign World War II Ribbon and an Honorable Discharge. David was an active member of the Mountainside Veterans of Foreign Wars, and was honored to be the Grand Marshal of the 2014 Memorial Day Parade.

In his professional career, David started as a Science Teacher in Roselle Park, NJ for 2 years, followed by teaching Natural Science to 7th graders Westfield, NJ for12 years. He served as principal of Deerfield School, Mountainside, Charles H. Brewer Middle School, in Clark, NJ, and the Carl H. Kumpf Middle School in Clark, for an additional total of 25 years.

Community involvement included 6 years as a Councilman on the Mountainside Borough Council, service for 6 years on the Union County Regional High School Board of Education, service on the Board of Directors of the Children's Specialized Hospital, membership for many years in the Lions Club, including being President in 1986-87, membership in the VFW-Post 10136, a member of the Mountainside Music Association. David was a Scoutmaster and Leader in Boy Scout Troop 76 for 4 years during which time they graduated 6 Eagle Scouts; he was a Little League Coach for 2 years, which included winning the pennant, and the Jonathan Dayton Choral Parents Society. David loved Fishing, and was on the New Jersey State Council for Central Jersey Trout Unlimited, and served on the Board of Directors for The Warren County Rod and Gun Club.

In his retirement, David was an avid fisherman, and fished frequently with his son, Michael, and other family members. David has photos of almost every child and grandchild holding a fish. Marilyn and David loved to travel and sometimes combined fishing with their trips. They traveled all over Europe, went to China, and



the Caribbean. David included fishing in his trips to Alaska 5 times, New Zealand, Belize, and all over the United States and Canada.

David Hart was a pillar of the community, had high moral values, was active in his church, was a wonderful father and family man, and a man of great accomplishments. He brought out the best in everyone around him, and was beloved by all. He will be sorely missed.




