# SUMMIT MAYOR RADEST KICKS OFF MEALS ON WHEELS 50TH ANNIVERSARY COMMUNITY PARTNERS PROGRAM

On Thursday, January 7, newly-elected Summit Mayor Nora G. Radest kicked off the local Meals on Wheels 50th Anniversary Community Partners program at SAGE Eldercare in Summit, NJ. She joined Carol Graham, a SAGE board member and Summit resident, in delivering meals to local older adults.

"We invited local clergy, business owners, corporations, other non-profits, first responders, and elected officials to become a Community Partner in celebration of our 50th Anniversary," noted Marianne Kranz, Director of Meals on Wheels for SAGE Eldercare. "It would give these partners an opportunity to meet some of the older adults who helped build our communities while delivering a meal and spreading awareness on the importance of this service."

SAGE Eldercare began its Meals on Wheels in 1966 with funding received from the Summit Junior League. Volunteers were recruited from various organizations such as the College Club, United Church Women, P.E.O., Red Cross, Women Pioneers of Bell Laboratories, and the Junior Fortnightly Club.

In the early days of this program, the meals were cooked in the kitchen at SAGE Eldercare, which was staffed by a part-time administrator and a cook. Six volunteer drivers delivered meals to approximately 27 clients per day. Today, nearly 30 volunteers deliver meals to 120 adults each weekday. Over the course of a year, 300 volunteers deliver more than 44,000 meals to 250 people in Union County (Berkeley Heights, Mountainside, New Providence, Springfield and Summit), Essex County (Millburn and Short Hills), and Morris County (Chatham and Madison).

"More than a meal, this program provides a wellness check and a brief visit to residents over the age of 60 who are often isolated from the very community that they helped to establish," stated Ms. Kranz. Meals are presently provided by the Linden Meals on Wheels facility and Overlook Medical Center and are delivered between 11:00 am and 12:30 pm to residents in nine regional communities via 14 routes.

In addition to the Community Partner program, SAGE also hosted a "Soup"er Cook-off on Wednesday, January 27. SAGE staff and volunteers made their favorite soups and the public was invited to come and vote for their favorite entry. Attendees were asked to bring a can of soup to donate to SAGE's Portable Pantry, which helps to supplement the Meals on Wheels program. In addition, attendees had the opportunity to learn more about both programs from Ms. Kranz.





# **VISUAL ARTS CENTER AWARDED SUMMIT AREA PUBLIC FOUNDATION GRANT**

The Visual Arts Center of New Jersey is proud to announce the receipt of a grant from the Summit Area Public Foundation. Thanks to the financial support of organizations like the Summit Area Public Foundation, the Art Center remains dedicated to the Summit community and reaching all Summit residents. The Foundation's investment in these enrichment programs will be critical to each program's success. The Art Center's commitment to its mission, "bringing art and people together," extends to all Summit residents.

The Art Center works closely with other Summit organizations including: SAGE Eldercare, the Connection for Women and Children, the PEP Program, the Junior League of Summit, Dreamcatcher Repertory Theatre, the Student Partner Alliance, Reeves-Reed Arboretum, the Film Society of Summit and Interweave, partnering with them to present public programs and to make available its facility upon request. In total, the Art Center has eight community engagement programs reaching at-risk inner city youth; seniors; formerly homeless women and their families; developmentally disabled adults and low-income families.



Mayor Ellen Dickson administered the oath of office at the Squad's Annual reorganization meeting in December.







# AHEAD OF THE STORM: SUMMIT CHURCH REACHES OUT TO THE HOMELESS

Central Presbyterian Church delivers food and warm clothing in New York City

While many of us spent Friday evening fighting the crowds at the supermarket for last minute supplies before Blizzard Jonas hit, a group of dedicated teenagers and their chaperones packed up meals, hot soup, and warm clothing items and headed into New York City to bring some comfort to people living on the streets.

The snow was already falling when the 8 teens and 5 chaperones packed up 75 bagged meals, 5 gallons of hot home-made soup, 3 gallons of hot cocoa, 100 bottles of water, 15 first aid kits, 100 coats, 50 sweaters, and 100 hygiene kits into a van and headed into the city. In spite of the increasing snow, the group stopped at 3 different locations, and handed out all they had brought. By the time they returned to Summit, the snow was deep and the roads treacherous, but not a single volunteer regretted the trip.

"A Midnight Run is a wonderful opportunity for adults and mature youth to work as colleagues and peers. The kids jumped out of the car at every stop and engaged. We were all struck by how respectful and pleasant folks were. They asked politely for sizes or specific needs and were understanding if we didn't have that. We heard 'Thank you so much' a hundred times," said Ted Tolles, a chaperone on Friday's trip.

The trip was the most recent of many taken over the past three years by volunteers from Central Church. A similar relief mission has left the church nearly every month since 2013 when Central partnered with MidnightRun.org, a volunteer organization that is dedicated to finding common ground between the housed and the homeless.

Central Church conducts drives (which are open to the public for donations) each month to collect items to send on the runs, including coats, toiletries, clothing, shoes, and hand/toe warmers. All ages get involved – middle schoolers run collections and prepare the bagged meals, high schoolers sort, load and deliver the goods. Adults

shop, drive, cook and chaperone. Even the preschoolers have participated, decorating the brown bags in which the meals are packaged. The project has brought together multiple generations with a common goal of helping those in need.

# CASA FETES SUMMIT'S ANITA PORTO



Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County's 3rd annual Foster the Dream Gala at Galloping Hill Golf Course in Kenilworth in November was soldout, as more than 240 attendees joined the festivities to

celebrate the nonprofit's advocacy work for children in foster care and several honorees, including Summit resident Anita Porto.

Porto, who received the Dream-Keeper Award for Outstanding Volunteerism, completed CASA's 30-hour training and began advocating for foster youth in 2012. Porto's casework has included maneuvering through an overburdened child-welfare and legal system to ensure developmental delays, medical concerns, sexual abuse and complex immigration matters were addressed in as timely a manner as possible.

Natalie Deo, program director at CASA of Union County, and Porto's supervisor, noted, "Anita fought for youth that couldn't fight for themselves. She fought a system that was cheating her youth, jumped hurdles and stripped away suffocating red tape. With persistence and commitment, she prevailed. Anita's adept navigation of complicated issues changed the lives of three girls who had no voice of their own."

Porto was born in Puerto Rico, grew up in Brazil and adventured to the United States for college, where she met her husband. When they started a family, Porto left a banking career to care for her sons. Since 1998, she has been active in volunteerism, including teaching English as a Second Language, and working with Literacy Volunteers of Morris County, for which she has volunteered and now sits on the board. Porto also assists Orange High School students with college applications.

CASA of Union County recruits, trains, supervises and supports community volunteers to serve as the eyes and ears of the judge, and the voice for children in foster care through no fault of their own. After training in Westfield, CASAs are sworn in by a family court judge and empowered by court order to speak to all parties in the child's life: foster parents, teachers, doctors, therapists and more. CASAs regularly meet with their foster youth to ensure their needs are met and best interests remain priority. There are nearly 600 Union County children currently in foster care due to abuse, neglect or abandonment, and CASA of Union County serves 143 of them. Its goal is to secure one CASA for every foster child.
