# **CRANFORD HISTORIC PRESERVATION AWARDS**

On March 12 at the Hanson House in Cranford, the 2016 Cranford Residential Preservation Award was presented to Jim and Julie Murphy, and the Cranford Commercial Preservation Award was presented to Lynn Suga-Rafanelli of Just4Pooches. The Award is sponsored jointly by the Cranford Historical Society and the Cranford Historic Preservation Advisory Board (HPAB).

In presenting the awards, Maureen Strazdon, Chair of the Cranford Historic Preservation Advisory Board, noted both historic and current connections between the buildings that weren't known when the awardees were chosen. Historically, in 1899, Mr. F.W. Hunter, who built the Murphy's house, bought property in the area where Just4Pooches now stands, and so he may have owned the land. Currently, the architect on both buildings was Ronald Meeks of Cranford, and the construction was done by Siano Brothers Contracting of Cranford.

The Residential Award given to Jim and Julie Murphy was for their work on their house at 302 Prospect Avenue. The house was built in 1897 at a cost of \$20,000 by owner Fred W. Hunter as part of the Roosevelt Manor section of town. Mr Hunter died in 1903, and the house was purchased by a Mr. Woodling that same year for \$7,550. It is an eclectic blend of Roman, Greek, and Flemish classical styles. The interior features a circular center hall with receiving parlor and main living room to the right and library and dining room to the left, and kitchen, butler's pantry and maid's staircase in the rear. The house was purchased in 2003 by the Murphys, and in 2005, based on extensive research and old photos, they started the restoration project to return it to its original look. The entire process took 10 years.

The Commercial Award was presented to Lynn Suga-Rafanelli, owner of Just4Pooches at 208 North Avenue West. The house was built in 1875 near the intersection of North Avenue West and Orchard Street. It's unclear who lived in the building early on since the first listing for an occupant of the house in the Cranford Directory is in 1906, a Joseph Richards. Ms. Suga-Rafanelli bought the building in 2014. She restored the exterior of the house to its former glory, adding whimsical touches such as the dog bones integrated into the porch design. In 2015 Lynn moved her pet emporium, Just4Pooches, from North Union Avenue to the house.

The Cranford Historical Society and the Cranford Historic Preservation Advisory Board salute the Murphys and Ms. Suga-Rafanelli for their interest in preservation and their efforts to preserve the character of Cranford.

Founded in 1927, the Cranford Historical Society is a private organization whose mission is to preserve and

perpetuate the history of Cranford. The Society operates the Crane-Phillips House on Union Avenue North, and is headquartered at the Hanson House on Springfield Avenue.





To enroll in the Lifeguarding course, you must be at least 15 years old.

The Pre-requisite skills evaluation includes the following:

1. Swim 100 yards continuously with head-up (including 50 yds with a rescue tube).

- To participate in the Lifeguard course, you 2. Swim 200 yards continuously of breaststroke and freestyle. Swim goggles may be used.
  - 3. Tread water for 2 minutes using only the legs. You should place your hands under your armpits.
  - 4. Complete a timed event within 1 minute, 40 seconds. Swim goggles are not allowed.
  - Starting in the water, swim 20 yards. Your face may be in or out of the water.
  - Surface dive, feet-first or head-first, to a depth of 7 to 10 feet to retrieve a 10-pound object.
  - Return to the surface and swim 20 yards on your back to return to the starting point with both hands holding the object while keeping your face at or near the surface so you are able to get a breath. You should not swim the distance under water. Exit the water without using a ladder or steps.



At the DAR meeting Ms. Dawley presented a slide presentation of her art and spoke about her father and the influence he had on her becoming the artist she is today.


