
As we were cleaning up, I asked Phil how he intended to get home. He simply answered, "I'm going to drive."





FREE TAX RETURN HELP FOR SENIOR CITIZENS

New Providence, Berkeley Heights, and other area residents can obtain free assistance in preparing and filing their individual 2015 tax returns. Free assistance will be provided at the New Providence Senior Citizens Center (NPSCC), 15 East Fourth Street, New Providence, by volunteer tax counselors under a program sponsored jointly by the AARP, the Internal Revenue Service, and the New Jersey State Division of Taxation. Tax counselors will be available on Mondays and Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., from Saturday, February 6, 2016, through Monday, April 11, 2016. Beginning January 25, 2016, taxpayers seeking assistance in preparing and filing their returns may call the NPSCC at 908-665-0046, between the hours of 10:30 a.m. and 2:00 p.m., Mondays through Fridays, for an appointment, or they may sign up at the center. The IRS is again advising taxpayers to file early to reduce the potential for identity theft.

Taxpayers must bring photo identification, social security cards of persons filing the return and of any dependents listed on the return; copies of their 2014 federal and state returns, and any 2015 federal forms W-2, 1099-R, 1099-INT, 1099-DIV, 1099-B, SSA-1099, documentation of the amount of rent or real estate taxes paid in 2015 and of other expenses if the taxpayers wish to itemize deductions; and, if they wish to have any refund directly deposited to their bank account, a check showing their bank's account number. In the case of taxpayers filing joint returns, both taxpayers should be present to authorize the electronic filing.





COURT ADVOCATES SOUGHT IN NEW PROVIDENCE

Nearly 600 Union County kids need your voice

can remember, me and my siblings lived in our parents' car or motels. We ate lots of fast food but after a while we just wanted real food like a normal family. One day the police stopped my dad and said my little sister was really thin. They took her to the hospital and then came back for me and my siblings and put us in foster care. I'm really sad because we are in three different homes and don't see each other much. We now go to school but had never been to one before! There's so much to learn that other kids already know. We really miss mom but dad scares us. We saw mom again on weekend visits at grandma's and were excited because we thought we would get to live there. But one day, mom snatched us from the visit to bring us to dad, who the judge said she can't see. Mom and dad took us out of New Jersey and we drove through a bunch of states. We didn't have money and dad made us stand with him outside and told us to look sad while he begged for money. When the police found us we were so excited to come back to New Jersey. They arrested my mom and dad. Even though we're glad to be back, my brother and I have nightmares and miss our siblings who are in other foster homes. I feel terrible — I'm the oldest and should have protected them. Why can't we all just be together and have a regular life?


Michael is one of many children that CASA serves and hopes to serve, as its referral book continues to grow. CASA of Union County is seeking New Providence residents interested in being the voice for one of the nearly 600 Union County youth, ages 0-21, in foster care through no fault of their own. Trained CASAs are sworn in by a judge and court-empowered to speak to foster parents, teachers, doctors, lawyers, tutors, therapists and more. CASAs visit the youth regularly and incorporate all findings into a report for the judge. CASAs attend court hearings quarterly, working to ensure a youth's time in care is as short as possible and their best interests remain the top priority for all parties. Although

CASA's Spring training kicks off Thursday, April 14, 2016 and includes 10 sessions over several weeks, ending May 10, 2016 and soon followed by a swearing in at the courthouse. Training is 6 to 9 p.m. at the County Clerk's Building, 300 North Avenue East in Westfield, Second Floor, across from the Westfield Diner and a light dinner is provided.

Attend an information session in Westfield or Elizabeth. Evening sessions are 6 pm, Thursday, March 17; Tuesday, March 29; Monday, April 4; and Monday, April 11 at the County Clerk's Building in Westfield; Morning sessions are 10 a.m. Fridays, March 18, April 1 and April 8 at CASA, 1143-45 East Jersey Street, Second Floor, in Elizabeth.
