ROCKIN' FOR AUTISM KICKS OFF MUSIC FESTIVAL

All-Day Festival Will Feature Musical Acts, Food Trucks, Local Vendors, Autism Workshops, Raffles, Inflatables and the Scotch Plains-Fanwood Youth Baseball Opening Day Ceremony

To commemorate Autism Awareness Month, and raise awareness of and funds for autism research, the Town of Fanwood will be hosting its first annual Rockin' For Autism Music Festival on Saturday, April 16, 2016, from 10:00am to 5:00pm at LaGrande Park. The all-day festival will feature a variety of local musical acts, food trucks, local vendors, autism workshops and clinics, raffles and inflatables, and will coincide with the Scotch Plains Fanwood Youth Baseball Association Opening Day Ceremony.

All proceeds will be donated to Autism NJ, the largest statewide network of parents and professionals dedicated to improving lives of individuals with autism spectrum disorders.

The festival is the brainchild of 14-year-old Fanwood resident Mallory Banks, who since 2011 has raised more than \$10,000 for Autism NJ in honor of her brother Ethan (16) and all those affected by autism spectrum disorder. Miss. Banks, an Autism Awareness Junior Ambassador, ranks among the top kids in New Jersey who raised money for Autism Awareness Month.

"For the past few years, I've had a lot of success in raising funds for autism awareness by hosting bake sales and raffles. This year I wanted to do something bigger and better, and get more of the community involved," said Mallory, who conceived of the festival while recovering from spinal surgery last year. "The Rockin' For Autism music festival is like a dream come true, and I am so excited that our mayor and so many local bands and businesses have committed to helping me raise funds for autism awareness."

In 2015, Mallory approached Fanwood Mayor Colleen Mahr during the town's annual Fannywood Day celebration and pitched her idea for hosting a music festival in La Grande Park. Since then, Mayor Mahr has been working closely with Mallory; her parents, Jeff and Gina Banks; and local government agencies to help facilitate the event. In 2014, the Fanwood Borough Council honored then 12-year-old Mallory for raising \$3,500 for autism awareness, and proclaimed June 17 to be Mallory Banks Day.

"Mallory Banks is an extraordinary girl, whose passion for raising awareness for autism is truly inspirational and sets an example for others to follow. I am honored to able to support her efforts and applaud her deep commitment to community advocacy," said Mayor Mahr. "With Everything that the Rockin' For Autism has to offer, I am confident that the annual festival will exceed expectations in terms of raising awareness

and funds, and will have a long-lasting, positive benefit for Fanwood as well."

Among the many musical acts scheduled perform include Goodworks, Three-Piece Nugget, Broadcaster, Leave the Gun, Strung at Heart, The Jeff Birns Band and Eric Harrison's Crash Course. The event will be MC'd by Main Source DJs.

Many local businesses and organizations have also

pledged to support the festival, including: Nick's Pizza & Deli, Fanwood Bagels & Deli and Frank's Auto Repair in Fanwood; GrillStone, Rich Tric Photography, Temple Sholom and The JCC of Central NJ in Scotch Plains; The MAX Challenge and Cesar Kai Academy in Cranford; Cindy Smith Dance Studio in Garwood; Main Source DJs in Woodbridge; and New Jersey American Water in Voorhees.

The festival will also coincide with the Scotch Plains-Fanwood Youth Baseball Association's annual opening day ceremony. Fanwood Mayor Coleen Mahr will throw the ceremonial first pitch to commence the 2016 SPFYBA baseball season. In addition, the Wolves Basketball Academy will also run clinics on the basketball courts, and the Scotch Plains-Fanwood Soccer Association will organize impromptu games during the event.

The event will also feature a variety of autism clinics, including workshops by Jammin' Jenn, which has been using music therapy to connect with special needs children and adults since 2009. Autism New Jersey and Children's Specialized Hospital will also partake in spreading awareness.

Rockin' For Autism is an annual music festival dedicated to raising awareness and funds for AutismNJ. CIVIL AIR PATROL (CAP) CADET PROGRAM

CAP was founded in 1941. It is a volunteer civilian auxiliary of the United States Air Force ("non combatant volunteers"). CAP is a national benevolent nonprofit organization with over 60,000 members, including over 26,000 cadets and nearly 35,000 adult members.

The Civil Air Patrol (CAP) offers a "Cadet Program" for the youth of Scotch Plains and adjacent towns. The program is open to teenagers from 12 to 18 years old. The Cadet Program promotes the use of aerospace themes to help educators excite and motivate their students to excel in science, math, technology, language arts, social studies, and other traditional subjects. In addition, cadets receive Aerospace Education, Flight Orientations, STEM education, and more.

CAP promotes strong character in its cadets, which is reflected in the CAP Core Values: Integrity, Volunteer Service, Excellence, and Respect. Cadets learn how to lead through formal classroom instruction and hands-on experience where they apply leadership principles to real-world challenges within the cadet corps.

Through a graduated curriculum, cadets first learn to follow, then to lead small groups, and ultimately experience command and executive-level leadership, earning grade and honors along the way. Topics include how to think critically, communicate effectively, make decisions, motivate, and manage conflict. Self-discipline

and teamwork are emphasized. Physical Activities are also part of the Cadet Program in order to encourage a healthy life style.

CAP has summer programs for cadets that they can attend in different parts of the nation and outside of the USA. Furthermore, CAP provides scholarships, career exploration activities, and opportunities to fly.


Military Commitment: Although the Air Force provides most of CAP's funding, cadets are not obligated to join the military. However, 10% of the cadets at the U.S. Air Force Academy get their start in CAP.

CAP still actively performs search and rescue missions within the United States (a program tailored to adults and older cadets). After the September 11, 2001 attacks, Civil Air Patrol aircraft provided the first aerial pictures of the World Trade Center site, "Ground Zero," and also flew transport missions bringing donated blood to New York City. CAP members responded by the thousands to help out in the aftermath of hurricanes Rita and Katrina in 2005, both on the air and on the ground – helping with search missions, disaster relief and aerial survey flights.

SPRING ACADEMY WILL MOVE INTO TWO LOCATIONS IN APRIL

This is a relocation of their second Montessori school which also offers a very successful After School program.

Ji and her husband, Bruce Huang, opened their first school (Little Spring Montessori Academy) six years ago in North Brunswick, and opened their second school (Spring Academy) three years ago in Garwood.

More than 250 students enrolled in its popular "Learning, Friends & Fun" summer day camp last year, in the 2 campuses.

"Our programs promote students' ability to self-learn and time management," Huang said.

This is what he calls the philosophy of "individualized education," where each student is taught to unlock his or her inner potential and is encouraged to excel academically.

"We do this by making sure every pupil gets valuable one-on-one attention," Ji explained.

Their very successful Montessori + Chinese Preschool program, for example – taught by loving and energetic Montessori teachers and experienced and patient Chinese teachers, breaks down students into smaller groups per their ability levels – ensures every child learns at their own pace and gets challenged and excited. "Being able to learn a foreign language at a young age definitely provides stimulation to the brain and better prepares students to be a global citizen, especially the Chinese language – it just gives students a huge edge given the enormous potential and opportunities in China," Huang said. "Spring Academy's Chinese Immersion is unique," Ji added, "because it is based on the Montessori Curriculum - all subjects such as Science, Geography, Music, and Math, are taught in Chinese- and Chinese language learning is one of the subjects."

Spring Academy will hold an open house shortly after the move. Spaces are still available for the Preschool program, After School program, and Summer Camp programs, and registration will be held during the Open House.
