The The Sean Reilly Traumatic Brain Injury Fund will host it's annual fundraiser, 'A NIGHT AT THE RACES', on Saturday, April 30th at the Knights of Columbus, Summit. Join us for a fun night of video horse racing, DJ, delicious light fare and fabulous prizes!

On January 27, 2009, Sean P. Reilly, a Summit High graduate, passed away at the age of 25 from complications attributable to a Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) that he sustained nearly 5 years earlier while studying abroad in Europe. During his 5 years as a minimally conscious TBI patient, Sean and his family experienced firsthand all of the challenges and pitfalls associated with funding and reimbursement for TBI related healthcare. And so, after Sean's passing, his parents Susan and Bill founded the Sean Reilly TBI Fund to address and bridge the funding shortfalls.

All proceeds from this event will go directly to supplemental therapies and rehabilitative equipment for patients at New Jersey's leading TBI rehabilitation centers such as the JFK Johnson Rehabilitation Institute's Center for Head Injuries, especially its Extended Recovery Unit in Edison, New Jersey. The Fund also partners with the Brain Injury Alliance of NJ, funding the needs of statewide TBI patients and their families.





The Book Sale is about to begin! The annual profits go to a worthy cause." Summit College Club (SCC) Book Sale will be held from April 19 through 24, 2016, at the American Legion Hall, 257 Elkwood Avenue, next to the library in New Providence.

About 40,000 gently used books will be displayed, all of them sorted into twenty five categories: "History," "Fiction" (by the author's last name), "Children," "Teens," "Cook Books," "Foreign Language," "Biographies," "Art," "Sports" and "Parenting" are just some of the categories. There are sections for CDs, DVDs, and LPs, as well.

The first day of the sale is aimed at book dealers and has a \$20 admission charge. On the next five days, Wednesday through Sunday, April 20 through 24, there is no admission charge, and tens of thousands of books are sold, the vast majority of them for fifty cents, a dollar, or two dollars.

The Book Sale will be open on Wednesday and Thursday from 10 am to 9 pm; on Friday and Saturday from 10 am to 6 pm; and on Sunday, the last day of the sale, from 10 am to 3 pm. Sunday is "Bag Day": Customers may fill an entire shopping bag with books of their choice for just \$5 a bag.

All the proceeds from the massive sale go toward funding scholarships for deserving local high school girls.

"One of the reasons this sale is so popular," commented Marylou Motto, an SCC member, "is that it's local. People in Summit, New Providence, Berkeley Heights, and the surrounding communities save us their books each year. Other people in those communities (and far beyond!) then buy the books for very little money. It's recycling at its best—and all the

SCC collects the books at Westy Self Storage, 15 River Road, Chatham. Donors may continue to bring books there during the day until April 7. "All our work is made possible by the generosity of Westy's," comments Lynne Rogerson, this year's Book Sale chair. SCC members spend hundreds of hours setting up the sale, moving the books, and sorting them all one by one.

The Summit College Club is a branch of the American Association of University Women (AAUW), an organization that promotes equity for all women and girls through advocacy, education, philanthropy, and research. Membership is open to all women and men holding the associate degree or higher.







Clara Barton was born on December 25, 1821, in Massachusetts. In 1852 she founded one of the first free public schools in New Jersey. During the American Civil War, she headed for the front lines, taking supplies to wounded soldiers and earning the title "Angel of the Battlefield." She became a passionate supporter of the International Red Cross and established the first chapter of the American Red Cross.

Actor Pat Jordan of the American Historical Theatre has performed this program in venues throughout the United States giving voice to the stories of this courageous, inspirational woman.


