## MARY POPPINS CAST TEACH SUMMIT ELEMENTARY-SCHOOL STUDENTS "SUPERCALIFRAGILISTICEXPIALIDOCIOUS"

Over 50 Summit elementary-school students with a flair for the dramatic participated in an evening of song and dance as they were taught "Supercalifragilisticexpialidocious" by Summit High School Mary Poppins' cast members on February 17.

Students from all of Summit's elementary schools were invited by the Mary Poppins' Educational Outreach team to the free workshop. Attendees were asked to contribute "tuppence," to be donated to Family Promise, a local organization which helps families in need. The collection ties in with the "family" theme of Mary Poppins being promoted to the community. Over \$200 was raised for Family Promise; the drive will continue during the performances, which will run March 2-6.

Before the workshop, students drew "Let's Go Fly a Kite"-shaped illustrations of an activity they loved doing with their family. These will be displayed throughout the high school during the performances.


The students danced, acted, and sang during workshops led by Anne Poyner, director; Kelly Mott-Sacks, choreographer; and by cast members.

"So many of our talented high schoolers developed their love of theater on our elementary school stages," said Poyner. "I am sure that some future Summit High School stars joined us on Thursday evening."

"We feel it is our responsibility to nurture the love of theatre in our younger students as we teach them about the audition process, and how to perform," she said.

The elementary students were filled with questions about auditioning, rehearsals, and technical aspects of the musical. At the conclusion of the workshop, they performed what they had learned for their parents.

The event was part of the Educational Impact program, which connects the musical to the school district's curriculum, using the production as a teaching tool for the greater student body and local community. Other parts of this effort

## SUMMIT DANCERS EXCEL AT REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Local residents Catherine Lawlor (16) who is a junior at Mount Saint Mary Academy and Ciara Lawlor (14) a freshman at Summit High School recently danced at the Mid-Atlantic Regional Championships in Philadelphia. Catherine competed on two winning Championship Teams. Ciara danced on five winning teams. She also competed in solo championships, and qualified dance at the World Irish Dance to Championships, which will be held in Glasgow, Scotland from March 20th to March 26th. Ciara will be competing in the Solo U15 Championships and the Celii Team competition. Both dancers have been dancing with The Marie Moore School of Irish Dance in Scotch Plains since they were 5.

Claire Borzner, a championship Irish dancer and the girls' neighbor, helped get the girls involved years prior. ## **\$2500 GRANT TO HELP MOMS HELPING MOMS FOUNDATION EXPAND**

community-based not-for-profit organization that distributes diapers to babies living in low-wage families in the New Jersey area, has been selected as one of 29 national recipients of the inaugural Funds for Change grant awarded by the National Diaper Bank Network (NDBN).

"NDBN's Funds for Change grants help diaper banks reach more families by investing in organizations that we recognize as growing community assets and strengthening that investment with technical support for nonprofit organizations through our national network," said Susan Van Ness, director of programs at National Diaper Bank Network. "NDBN is very pleased to present Moms Helping Moms Foundation with a \$2500 grant to further its effort to help families in New Jersey."

Moms Helping Moms Foundation the Moms Helping Moms Foundation, the grant will be used to build out their office space to allow for more inventory storage and to streamline their operational procedures.

> "Having the money to reorganize our space and to purchase more shelving and bins will allow us not only to take in more inventory, but will also make the process of putting bags together for our clients much more efficient and safe. The improved safety will allow us to bring more volunteers in to help out. That coupled with the increased efficiency of our procedures will allow us to serve more clients than we are able to currently. We are very excited to get started on this project!" says Bridget Cutler, President, Moms Helping Moms Foundation.

In total, NDBN awarded more than \$100,000 in grant funding to member diaper banks According to Bridget Cutler, President of operating in 21 states. However, the net impact

The 29 grants awarded ranged in size from \$500 to \$10,000 and went to both newly formed and established diaper banks, located in communities throughout the country.

Since its first diaper distribution in 2011, Moms Helping Moms Foundation has helped provide more than 100,000 diapers as well as other essential baby supplies to hundreds of families living in New Jersey.

Moms Helping Moms Foundation continues to help families facing financial distress meet their babies' basic needs by: 1) providing access to essential baby supplies, and 2) connecting individuals with a variety of services aimed at supporting them during pregnancy and the first three years of parenthood, such as parenting support, child development education, financial literacy, and health and wellness. 

### **NEARLY 600 UNION COUNTY KIDS NEED YOUR VOICE**

Court advocates sought in Summit for foster youth

Meet foster youth Michael, age 8: Ever since I can remember, me and my siblings lived in our parents' car or motels. We ate lots of fast food but after a while we just wanted real food like a normal family. One day the police stopped my dad and said my little sister was really thin. They took her to the hospital and then came back for me and my siblings and put us in foster care. I'm really sad because we are in three different homes and don't see each other much. We now go to school but had never been to one before! There's so much to learn that other kids already know. We really miss mom but dad scares us. We saw mom again on weekend visits at grandma's and were excited because we thought we would get to live there. But one day, mom snatched us from the visit to bring us to dad, who the judge said she can't see. Mom and dad took us out of New Jersey and we drove through a bunch of states. We didn't have money and dad made us stand with him outside and told us to look sad while he

begged for money. When the police found us we were so excited to come back to New Jersey. They arrested my mom and dad. Even though we're glad to be back, my brother and I have nightmares and miss our siblings who are in other foster homes. I feel terrible — I'm the oldest and should have protected them. Why can't we all just be together and have a regular life?

Michael is one of many children that CASA serves and hopes to serve, as its referral book continues to grow. CASA of Union County is seeking Summit residents interested in being the voice for one of the nearly 600 Union County youth, ages 0-21, in foster care through no fault of their own. Trained CASAs are sworn in by a judge and court-empowered to speak to foster parents, teachers, doctors, lawyers, tutors, therapists and more. CASAs visit the youth regularly and incorporate all findings into a report for the judge. CASAs attend court hearings quarterly, working to ensure a youth's time in care is as short as possible and their best interests remain the top priority for all parties. Although not required, there is an additional need for advocates who speak Spanish.

CASA's Spring training kicks off Thursday, April 14, 2016 and includes 10 sessions over several weeks, ending May 10, 2016 and soon followed by a swearing in at the courthouse. Training is 6 to 9 p.m. at the County Clerk's Building, 300 North Avenue East in Westfield, Second Floor, across from the Westfield Diner and a light dinner is provided.

Attend an information session in Westfield or Elizabeth. Evening sessions are 6 pm, Thursday, March 17; Tuesday, March 29; Monday, April 4; and Monday, April 11 at the County Clerk's Building in Westfield;

Morning sessions are 10 a.m. Fridays, March 18, April 1 and April 8 at CASA, 1143-45 East Jersey Street, Second Floor, in Elizabeth. Summit residents are encouraged to contact Lisa at (908) 527-7048 or lporis@casaofunioncounty.org to RSVP for an information session
