REIGN OF TERROR – THE UNION COUNTY BANDITS



Dr. Walter E. Boright

Dr. Walter E. Boright, historian and member of the Union County Historical Society, will be the featured speaker at the Society's annual spring dinner to be held Sunday, April 10, 2016 at the Garden Restaurant located at 943 Magie Ave., Union.

His topic is "Reign of Terror – the Union County Bandits." His Power Point presentation will address the gang of three bandits who lived in Roselle Park and

Kenilworth. The trio caused a reign of terror throughout Union County from December 1920 to February 1921. The threesome committed a total of 21 hold ups of trolleys, automobiles, and business offices before captured following a bloody shoot out on Morris Ave. Dr. Boright has gone through considerable research to carefully document those events of 95 years ago.

Advanced reservations are encouraged as last year Dr. Boright's presentation about Governors from Union County drew a capacity crowd. Tickets are \$32 person.

“MADE IN UNION” AT CALDWELL PARSONAGE

On Sunday, April 17, at 2:30 p.m. Tom Beisler and Tom Haggerty, trustees of the Union Township Historical Society, will give a lecture on the history of manufacturing in the town—augmented by a newly created slideshow, “Made in Union”—at the Caldwell Parsonage, 909 Caldwell Avenue, Union.

Their presentation will focus on the people and products of businesses that once made—or still make—their homes in Union, such as: Headley’s Cider Mill; Headley ship mast hoops; Tuscan Dairy; Peerless Beverage Company; Ce De Candy, Inc.; Wm. Kratt Company, which made harmonicas and pitch pipes; Pyro Plastics Corporation, which made toy ray guns; Gemex watch bands; John J. Reid Varnishes; International Paint Company; Potter Aeronautical Corporation, whose flow meters were used for fuel in the U.S. space program’s first rockets in the 1950’s; Elastic Stop® Nut Corporation, which made self-locking fasteners used, among others, by our military in WW II ; National Woodworking Corporation; and Permutit water softeners.

The program will be part of the meeting of the Union Township Historical Society, which will begin at 2 pm. Non-members are cordially invited to attend. Refreshments will be served, including

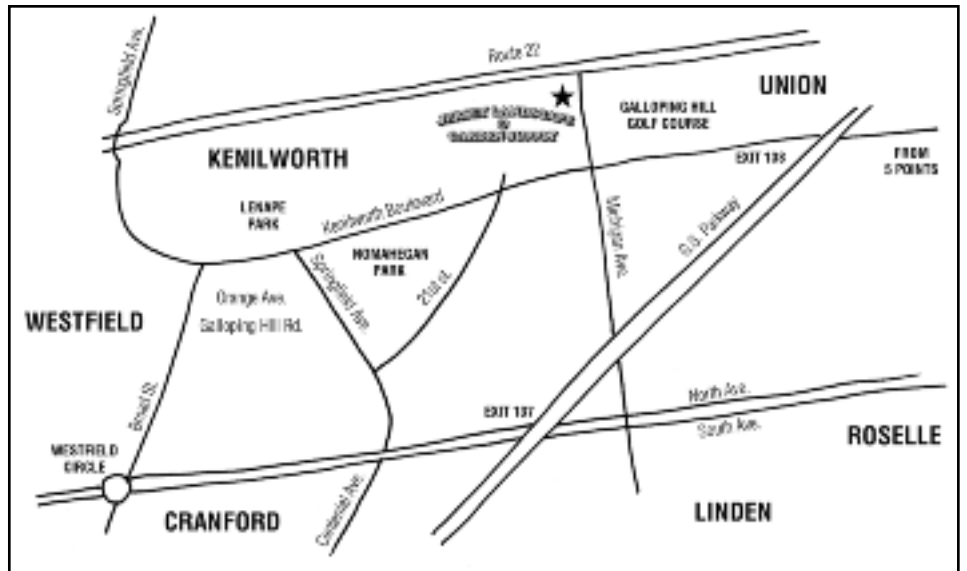

FIREFIGHTERS MATCH CULINARY SKILLS TO BENEFIT THE BURN CENTER AT SAINT BARNABAS

The Sixth Annual Firefighter Cookoff and Food and Wine Tasting was held on February 29, 2016 at the Pines Manor in Edison, New Jersey. Over thirty-five restaurants, bakeries and caterers, twenty-five tables of wines, spirits, liquors and cordials and the Firefighter Cookoff involving twenty fire departments from around the State will get together for an evening of good eats, good spirits for a good cause.

The event featured a cook off pitting teams of firefighters against each to be judges for their culinary skills. The event was started by Robert Hill, retired Fire Chief of Roselle, NJ. What started as a lighthearted competition for bragging rights has turned into a major fundraiser for The Burn Center at Saint Barnabas sponsored by the New Jersey State Fireman's Mutual Benevolent Association.

Though the event had a party atmosphere there is some serious cooking going on. The event originally was to choose the team with the best "Firehouse Food", quickly made dishes that can fill the hearty appetite of firefighters on duty. Over the years the dishes that were being prepared were elevating out of the realm of firehouse food and so a gourmet category was added to the competition. Now half of the teams, determined by lottery, compete in the fire house food category while the other half compete in the gourmet category. Then an over all winner is crowned.



Shifts are twenty four hours long so the need for breakfast, lunch and dinner is a daily concern. Usually the task of cooking is shared amongst the firefighters unless there is some one who loves to cook and then the rest are usually in for a treat. The teams are given gift cards donated by Shoprite with a \$500 limit to get the supplies they need for the cook-off.

Besides the judged competition the public got to vote for their favorite Firefighter Chef. Everyone who attended, approximately one thousand people, got to vote for their own People's Choice Award. More information can be found on line at cookedanduncorked.com or by calling 973-322-4305.

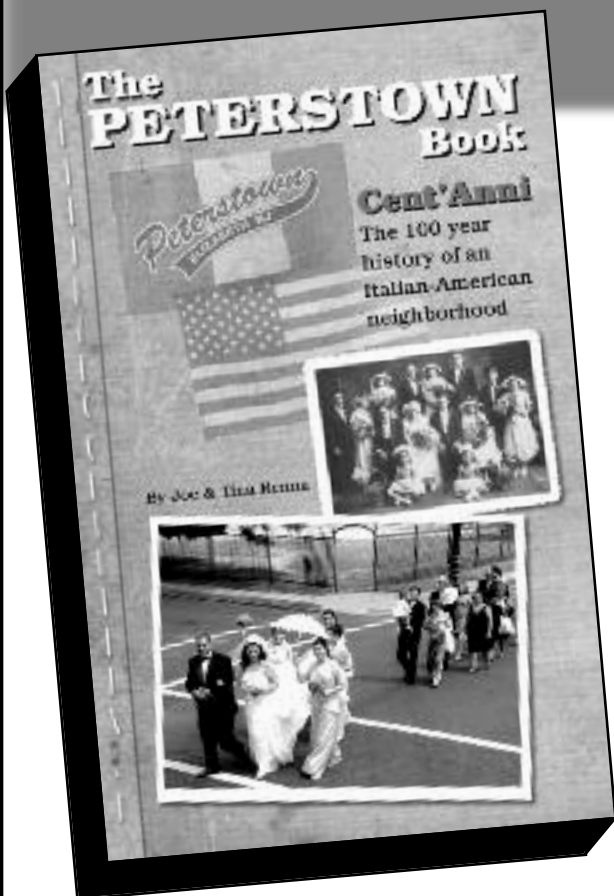
