

FINGERPRINTING IDENTIFICATION PROGRAM

Submitted by William G. Parenti, North Plainfield Chief of Police

Chief William G. Parenti is partnering with Somerset County Sherriff Frank Provenzano and the North Plainfield Board of Education. On April 15, 2016 they conducted a voluntary fingerprinting identification program for the children of West End School, StonyBrook School and East End School. This identification kit consists of fingerprinting the children and sending the card home with the child for the parents to complete and store in a safe place. A photograph and hair sample complete the kit. The kit will be of great benefit in the unlikely event the child would need to be identified.

Each year a child disappears in a crowd at the fair. A toddler wanders out an open door. A teen doesn't return from the mall. In fact, every year, hundreds of thousands of kids in the U.S. are reported, "missing."

What can parents do to help us? Have information that helps identify your child ready to hand to law enforcement the instant you report your child missing.

Recording your child's fingerprints is particularly important. Why? Not only because everyone's fingerprints are unique, but also because they don't change over time like physical appearances. We also recommend that you update the photos of your kids in the kits at least once a vear.

Are the fingerprints or other information in the kits kept by the police? No! The family is to keep the kits and fingerprints in a safe place...and provide the information to the police only in case of emergency. Even then, we don't keep the information in our records permanently without your permission.

FOURTH GRADE INVENTION CONVENTION

On Wednesday, April 27th, Somerset County Library System of New Jersey's (SCLSNJ) North Plainfield Memorial Library branch, in collaboration with West End Elementary School, hosted the Fourth Grade Invention Convention. Participants pitched an idea, then created a prototype for the most creatively useful item in class. The winning invention, "The Absentator" by Jasmine Stacey, resolved the issue of missing classwork when absent. Stacey's invention would allow students to FaceTime the classroom by driving the phone around on a robotic car.

The program was funded by the Association for Library Service to Children "Curiosity Creates"; grant made possible by a generous donation from Disney.

Amy Behr, a librarian at SCLSNJ's North Plainfield Memorial Library branch and "Curiosity Creates" grant coordinator, worked with fourth grade teachers Heather Morgan, Ryan Johnson, Nicole Faraone, Alison Apisa, and Teresa Diller; Assistant Principal Marilyn Quinones, and Supervisor of Science and Social Studies Jamil Maroun to make this program

ROTARY CLUB ANNUAL TRACK AND FIELD MEET

The oldest service club of the three Plainfield's will hold their most important annual community service project on June 1 at the Hub Stine Athletic Complex in Plainfield.

Long a mainstay in supporting the North Plainfield and Plainfield communities, the Rotary Club of Plainfield-North Plainfield will offer an afternoon of friendly but determined competition to young 12, 13 and 14 year-old athletes from area middle schools.

"This invitational meet is the longest-running meet of its kind in the entire state," said Michael Townley, director of the meet. "We have offered this meet as a service to area youth since 1923, except during World War II."

Rotary club members and their friends serve as the officials at the Meet. They are supported by members of the Interact Club at North Plainfield High School. Interact is the youth-based service club sponsored by Rotary International.

"Interact is a great club of enthusiastic students who are interested in doing good deeds for others," said Ravenell Williams, Rotary president and the executive director of the Plainfield YMCA. "They help us with a number of our service projects and activities throughout the year, and host quite a few activities of their own to benefit North Plainfield residents. We are proud of them and of all that they accomplish throughout the year."

Eighty-eight years of track and field meets has drawn many thousands of participants, including Olympic decathlon champion and former Plainfield resident Milt Campbell. "We recognize that participating in our Track and Field Meet was but one step in Milt's long and successful

drive to achieve his decathlon championship," said Townley. "In fact, our Club was proud to be one of the many community groups that financially supported his Olympic trip."

According to Townley, each year the Club members learn something new about the athletes that participated in the Meet. "One of the seniors we interviewed at Plainfield High for our scholarship awards last year commented that not only did she win a medal at our Meet, it was also her first formal track event. It influenced her to go on to star on the PHS track team, and led to her decision to run track in college."

Schools invited to send athletes to this year's Meet include North Plainfield Middle School, Plainfield's Maxson Middle School and Hubbard Middle School, the Valley View School in Watchung, South Plainfield Middle School, and four other area schools.

Medals will be awarded to first, second and third place finishers in all events except the relays, where ribbons are awarded to second and third place finishers. If the past is any indication, medals or ribbons will be earned by athletes from every school that is registered.

"Our Club looks forward to this special service project," said Townley. "Rotary International's motto is 'Service Above Self'. We truly enjoy providing this service to these fine young athletes and presenting them an opportunity to win medals or ribbons for their athleticism."

The Track and Field Meet is open to the public. The Hub Stine Athletic Complex is located on Randolph Road in Plainfield.



NORTH PLAINFIELD'S LIBRARY GETTING MUCH ANTICIPATED UPDATES

Somerset County Library System of New Jersey's North Plainfield Memorial Library branch, located at 6 Rockview Avenue in North Plainfield, will be experiencing some muchneeded updates and renovations at the end of the 2016 year. The proposed plans include replacing carpeting, an increase in community interaction and seating areas, refreshed paint on all first floor walls, additional electric outlets to respond to growing technology demands, all new furniture, and more.

Acknowledging that it is time for the furniture to be updated, County Library Administrator for SCLSNJ Brian Auger said, "Do you realize Nixon was president when we bought the furniture at the North Plainfield Library branch? And that's the first term Nixon administration."

"The Library remains committed to meeting the informational needs of all North Plainfield citizens," said Christal Blue, SCLSNJ's North Plainfield Memorial Library branch manager. "The renovation embraces a user-focused design that reflects how the community uses the Library's space."

"Borough officials have supported the Library's need for an update," continued Blue. "With the support of borough officials and Library Advisory Board, we have been steadily working to improve the look and design of the Library. The Library's previous director, Lauren Ryan, had the vision to propose a list of Capital Projects designed to bring the Library's facilities up to 21st century standards. Within the last 2 years, we've partnered with the Borough to add new children's room furniture, make the lower level handicap accessible, and install an


the Borough's Library."


