## **VFW POST 2433 CELEBRATES LOYALTY DAY**

Loyalty Day is celebrated across the nation as an opportunity to honor people who performed some heroic act or a group of patriotic acts in their communities. It generally includes, but is not limited to, fire, police and EMT personnel, post members and active local citizens. At a well-attended luncheon and awards presentation program held on May 1, 2016, the Veterans' Alliance of Union and the Michael A. Kelly Post 2433, Veterans of Foreign Wars and its Ladies Auxiliary honored three township people.

Life-long Union Township resident Sally Straus was honored for her extensive volunteerism, including her work in the program "Let No Veteran Die Alone", which provided radios to the veterans in hospice care at the VA hospital. Bob Johnsen, past Commander of the VFW, presented Sally's award and read an extensive list of her volunteer work and recalled her family's long history in the township. Her father started the Volunteer Fire Department. Sally admitted that if it happens in Union she either knows about it, or she's there. She stated "It is a pleasure and a privilege that I do from my heart." She also encouraged others to get involved, "You have to step up to stand out."

Fire Battalion Chief Michael Scanio, a veteran of the US Airforce, received the "Veterans of Foreign Wars Loyalty Day Award". Chief Scanio was 21 when he started his career with the Union Township Fire Department. He has won numerous accommodations and awards throughout his over 25-year career. In 2014 he was appointed as Union County Deputy Fire Coordinator and is on call 24-7. He thanked his family for being supportive, particularly his wife Shannon for being his rock and sounding board.

Police Captain Dave Tyms Is a third generation police officer. He said his family has been maintaining and promoting the safety of citizens for over 100 years. He credited his father and grandfather for setting an example for him to follow and stated in part, "if it weren't for them, I wouldn't be here today." His father and grandfather served the Milburn and West Orange Police Departments respectively. Captain Tyms is currently pursuing a Master's Degree in Emergency Management.

## THREE RESIDENTS BECOME CASA VOLUNTEERS

Union County Superior Court Judge Daniel R. Lindemann last month administered oaths to 16 community members who stepped up to serve as extra eyes and ears for family court judges on cases involving abused, neglected or abandoned children currently in foster care. Among them are Union's own Lillie Chadwick, Wigeby Toussaint and Tom Whelan.

The new Court Appointed Special Advocate volunteers completed 30 hours of training over six weeks and will next observe court to see other CASA volunteers in action. After performing the oath, Judge Lindemann stepped off the bench and personally thanked each advocate for committing to serve children in need of a voice. Several of the nonprofit's board members participated, providing each new advocate a commemorative pin and certificate. During a celebratory luncheon that followed, each advocate was matched to their

Volunteers with varied backgrounds and life experiences make successful advocates, and this class is no different. They range from age 23 to 81, some are parents, some empty-nesters, and others have no children. Some have lived out of

the country or elsewhere in the United States, and careers include business, real estate, education and stay-at-home parents. Most have no prior knowledge of the foster system.

CASA volunteers have court-ordered access to all parties in a child's life, including foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers, and incorporate into court reports findings from these contacts, as well as, observations from time spent with the youth. Volunteers advocate both in the community and in court to ensure that while the youth is awaiting a safe and permanent home, their needs are met, their best interests are priority and their time in care is as short as possible.

There are currently 600 Union County children in foster care; the nonprofit serves approximately one-quarter of those youth and its mission is to provide a volunteer advocate for every child in care. CASA of Union County trains three times a year.







## **BATTLE HILL STUDENT GROWS 36 POUND CABBAGE**

Each year, 3rd grade students across the country participate in the 'Bonnie 3rd Grade Cabbage Program.' Bonnie is a leading producer of vegetable and herb plants for the garden. The program began in 2002 to inspire a love of vegetable gardening. Each year, Bonnie Plants distributes more than one million free cabbage plants to 3rd Grade classrooms across the country. As part of the program, Bonnie Plants awards a \$1,000 scholarship to one student in each state.

This year, MaLé Slater, a current 4th grader from Battle Hill Elementary School in Union, NJ, took home the coveted prize for the 36 pound cabbage she nurtured at home over the summer of 2015. MaLé's appreciation for gardening is partially due to her third grade teacher Patricia Bogda. Ms. Bogda along with third grade teachers Cara LeBlond and Katie Ballard often brought their classes outside to tend to the Battle Hill Garden of Knowledge. This garden was granted to Battle Hill School in the 2013-2014

school year by the Union Township Educational Foundation. MaLé, along with her classmates, learned the importance of caring for the garden. MaLé also gained her green thumb from her mother and grandparents. They actively watched the plant together to ensure that it received the love necessary to grow such a large plant.


Bonnie Plants has delivered over 11 million cabbage plants nationwide since 2002, fostering an interest in gardening, healthy eating, and the environment along the way.





## **COMMUNITY GARDEN HAS A NEW ADDITION**

The Union Community Garden has a new us with our pollination after the mason bees are addition in the corner of the butterfly garden. The garden is located at the Eleanor R. Erickson Park on Liberty Avenue in Union NJ. The entrance is directly across from Bancroft Ave.

Please welcome our awesome new pollinators, the mason bees. Mason bees are solitary bees and because they have no hive to defend, they are very unlikely to sting (they are not aggressive at all - you'd have to actually step on them or squish them). And if they do sting, it's about as bad as a mosquito bite and does not produce the severe anaphylactic reaction that honey bees have.


Unlike honeybees (which were brought over by European settlers) mason bees are native to the U.S. and are much better pollinators too. We're hoping having these gentle bees around will help our garden grow better than ever!

Mason bees are spring bees, so in June they will be replaced with leafcutter bees, which are active in the summer. Like the name implies, they do cut leaves to make their nests but don't worry, they won't harm the plants. They take just as much as they need. Also solitary and not aggressive, the leaf cutters will continue to help

(right) The wooden block is for bees to nest in. Each bee will pick one hole and stick with it until it's full of eggs. The reeds are just to make it more visually interesting for them. The blue cloth is doused with mason bee attractant, to help them stay (and maybe attract some wild ones). The little cardboard box is full of bee cocoons. In the back is a cotton ball soaked in sugar water so they have some food for when they first awaken. They're tired and hungry after not eating all winter! done for the year.




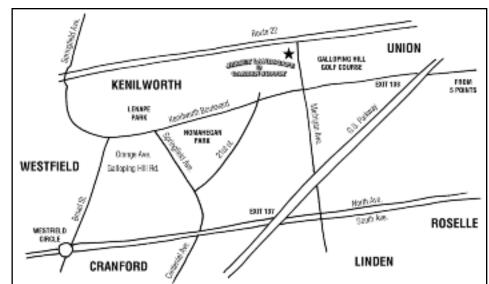
