ARBOR DAY CELEBRATES TREES, POETRY AND EARL PHILLIPS

The Fanwood Shade Tree Commission's held its annual Arbor Day observance on Friday, April 29th, 2016. The event honored veteran member Earl Phillips, 94, who recently retired after more than 30 years as a member. Phillips, a retired police officer and Fanwood volunteer, received a certificate of appreciation, a commemorative book and a hand made rain stick presented by the students of the Park Middle School Environmental Club. Also honored was poet John McDermott of Cranford, winner of this year's nationwide Arbor Day Poetry Contest. Mr. McDermott was presented with a \$300 prize by Adele Kenney, Fanwood's poet laureate and Shade Tree Commission member. The students of the Environmental Club presented information on the Emerald Ash Borer, a pest found in New Jersey ash trees. It was announced that for the 23rd consecutive year, Fanwood has been awarded Tree City USA status, which recognizes the town takes special care of trees. Kudos to Shade Tree Commission Chairman Steve Falco for another wonderful program!

JOE MCCOURT WILL BE MEMORIAL DAY PARADE GRAND MARSHAL

Joe McCourt, who as a lieutenant served in the U.S. Army as a platoon leader in the Vietnam War, will be the Grand Marshal of this year's Fanwood Scotch Plains Memorial Day parade.

McCourt, 70, of Scotch Plains, is active in both the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars groups at the local level, has been an integral part of the Borough's and Township's Memorial Day and Veterans' Day observances for many years and was also a member of a five-person committee that oversaw fundraising and construction of the Vietnam War memorial in Scotch Plains.

"With Joe's support, we've been able to add the concert and it really pays tribute in the right way to acknowledge those who made the ultimate sacrifice -with touching music and letters from home," Fanwood Mayor Colleen Mahr said. "Joe has always made sure that the integrity of the parade remains and that the focus is on our nation's war casualties and it is a day to remember their loss."

The parade, to be held on Monday, May 30, caps a weekend observance that includes a concert and services remembering those who gave their lives for the nation. Events are as follows:








RESCUE SQUAD WILL OFFER FREE CPR CLASSES

The Fanwood Rescue Squad will present free CPR classes for the community during EMS Week in May 2016.

The classes last about 3 hours and only the Monday, May 16 and Wednesday, May 18 classes are still available. These classes are only for residents of Fanwood and Scotch Plains.

All classes are conducted at the Fanwood Rescue Squad, 123 Watson Road in Fanwood. The curriculum will be American Health and Safety Institute CPR/AED/choking management

for adults, children and infants. They emphasize that this is NOT the right class for nurses, EMTs and medical personnel who require CPR for Healthcare Providers.

The course will take approximately three hours to complete. The squad asks that participants be on time and wear comfortable clothing. Participants that stay for the whole course will receive a two-year certification card.

School One elementary staff of Grades 1 through 4 had the opportunity to receive professional training in the area of writer's workshop from The College of New Jersey professor Matthew Hall.



ROCKIN' FOR AUTISM MUSIC FESTIVAL RAISES MORE THAN \$10,000 FOR AUTISM PROGRAMS AND SERVICES FOR NEW JERSEY FAMILIES

The Town of Fanwood's Rockin' For Autism Music Festival is pleased to announce that its inaugural event, held on Saturday, April 16 at LaGrande Park in Fanwood, has raised more than \$10,200 to support autism programs and services in New Jersey.

The fundraising effort surpassed the \$7,000 fundraising goal set by its creator 14-year old Fanwood resident Mallory Banks, an Autism Awareness Junior Ambassador who ranks among the top kids in New Jersey raising money for Autism Awareness Month. It also doubled the

\$10,000 that she had previously raised from 2011 through 2015 in honor of her brother Ethan (16) and all those affected by autism spectrum disorder.

Several hundreds of people packed into LaGrande Park throughout the day to listen to music from a variety of local bands, including: Goodworks; Three-Piece Nugget; The Broadcasters; Leave the Gun; and Eric Harrison's Crash Course. Additional entertainment was provided by Main Source DJs; special needs music therapist Jammin Jenn; and the Cindy Smith Dance Studio.

Food and refreshments were provided by Nick's Pizza & Deli, "The Empanada Guy" food truck, Picklelicious, New Jersey American Water, and more than three dozen volunteer bakers.

Local merchant and non-profit participants included: Be Craftful; Child's Play Challenge Course; Robert Wood Johnson Hospital; Children's Specialized Hospital; Autism NJ; Watchung Pediatrics; Tiny Tots Therapy; Jammin Jenn Music Therapy; Functional Performance

Therapy; Rich Tric Photography; Temple Sholom of Scotch Plains' Inclusion Taskforce; Dip's Fashion Conception; Glam Pam and Her Glitter Overload; Eddie Lin, the "Ausome" Balloon Creator; Pete the Magician; Rodan & Fields; Chloe & Isabel; and many others who donated products and services for the raffle.

The festival also coincided with the Scotch Plains-Fanwood Youth Baseball Association's annual opening day ceremony, where Miss Banks, Fanwood Mayor Colleen Mahr, and Scotch Plains Mayor Kevin Glover threw ceremonial first pitches. In addition, the Scotch Plains-Fanwood Soccer Association and Wolves Basketball Academy ran sports clinics for special needs kids.

All proceeds will be donated to Autism NJ, the largest statewide network of parents and professionals dedicated to improving lives of individuals with autism spectrum disorders.
