Now in its fourth year, this event was dropped in 2015 but was brought back by popular demand to the delight of close to 10,000 fair goers that attended.

The children had a blast in the Kids Travelin Shindig area which had kiddie rides, inflatables, face painters, ice cream, temporary tattoos and a special appearance from Batman, Bat Girl & the Bat Mobile. If you were hungry, there were over 25 food vendors selling everything from sausage and peppers, steak sandwiches, dogs and burgers, gourmet guacamole, empanadas, genuine polish kielbasa & sausage, Italian delicacies, kettle corn, ice cream and much more. 




