In addition to race activities, arts and crafts, face painting, complimentary food and a DJ were hand to add to the festivities. Summit's 69th Annual Mayor's Fourth of July Celebration will take place on Monday, July 4, 2016 at Soldiers Memorial Field. 



Chief Robert Weck, Summit PBA Local #55 and members of the Summit Police Department are excited to announce their 2nd annual food and household goods collection on ongoing and will conclude on Monday June 13th. The Summit Police Department will be partnering with the non-profit organization Family Promise (Union County) to be a recipient of the items collected. In addition to Family Promise, by the suggestion of Geleen Donovan, Executive Director of Family Promise- Union County, the Summit Police Department will also be teaming up with the Junior League of Summit to benefit from the items collected. The Junior League of Summit has been supportive to family's right here in our own community who struggle to supply meals for their loved ones during the summer months.

The "Summit Community Cares" food and household goods collection was first started in 2015 and proved to be guite successful with over 350 pounds of food collected. This event is held at the end of the school year where it seems to benefit the youth of our communities the most. Sadly, many don't realize the struggles that countless families face on the day to day, including affluent areas such as Summit. Amanda Parrish-Block, Community Vice President of the Junior League believes, "food insecurity is a growing concern in Summit today. The goods collected in this food drive will directly benefit the families who rely on support that goes on






TATLOCK TENNIS COURT PROJECT COMPLETION

The City of Summit is announcing that the Tatlock Tennis Court Replacement Project has reached completion. Four new courts with state-of- the-art post-tension concrete technology is now ready for play. Recently, each court was color coated and lined to meet United States Tennis Association and USTA Youth Tennis program teaching standards. LED lighting, new fencing, seating, and shade structures are also new additions to the courts.

Evening play is permitted until 10:30 p.m. only; lighting structures will not work past this time. Residents are encouraged to stay off courts until all signs have been removed, indicating that courts are ready for play. "Through the support of the city, county and Summit Tennis Association, we have created a fabulous new tennis complex for the Summit community," explains Director of Community Programs Judith Josephs. "I look forward to our beautiful new courts being put to good use very soon."

The Tatlock Tennis Court Replacement Project is funded through the City's Capital Improvement Fund, the Union County Kids Recreation Trust Fund, and by a generous donation from the Summit Tennis Association. Leading the project along with city engineers is project designer, Thomas Miller of Premiere Product Design. Miller has developed extensive experience in the design of athletic complexes through the years. The contractor for the project is Classic Turf of Connecticut. Plans for the official opening ceremony will be announced in early June. Reservations for court play are suggested but not required; those with reservations will have priority on the courts. 



IRS SCAM - PROTECT YOURSELF

The Summit Police Department issued an advisory on their FaceBook page on May 27, 2016: "Advisory: IRS scam going wild. Dispatch phone, nor will the agency call about taxes owed received 100 calls about the scam today. Do not fall for it. The IRS does not call and will never direct you to make a payment or confirm your Social Security number over the phone."

In March the IRS issued a Consumer Alert. According to the IRS website aggressive and threatening phone calls by criminals impersonating IRS agents remain a major threat to taxpayers, but now the IRS is receiving new reports of scammers calling under the guise of phone or e-mail. verifying tax return information over the phone.

Protect Yourself

Scammers make unsolicited calls claiming to be IRS officials. They demand that the victim pay a bogus tax bill. They con the victim into sending cash, usually through a prepaid debit card or wire transfer. They may also leave "urgent" callback requests through phone "robo-calls," or via aphishing email. They've even begun politely asking taxpayers to verify their identity over the

Many phone scams use threats to intimidate and bully a victim into paying. They may even threaten to arrest, deport or revoke the license of their victim if they don't get the money.

Scammers often alter caller ID numbers to make it look like the IRS or another agency is calling. The callers use IRS titles and fake badge numbers to appear legitimate. They may use the victim's name, address and other personal information to make the call sound official.

Here are some things the scammers often do but the IRS will not do. Any one of these five things is a tell-tale sign of a scam.

The IRS will never:

Call to demand immediate payment over the without first having mailed you several bills.

Call or email you to verify your identity by asking for personal and financial information.

Demand that you pay taxes without giving you the opportunity to question or appeal the amount they say you owe.

Require you to use a specific payment method for your taxes, such as a prepaid debit card.

Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the

Threaten to immediately bring in local police or other law-enforcement groups to have you arrested for not paying.

If you get a phone call from someone claiming to be from the IRS and asking for money or to verify your identity, here's what you should do:

If you don't owe taxes, or have no reason to think that you do:

Do not give out any information. Hang up immediately.

Contact TIGTA to report the call. Use their "IRS Impersonation Scam Reporting" web page. You can also call 800-366-4484.

Report it to the Federal Trade Commission. Use the "FTC Complaint Assistant" on FTC.gov. Please add "IRS Telephone Scam" in the notes.

If you know you owe, or think you may owe tax: Call the IRS at 800-829-1040. IRS workers can help you.

Stay alert to scams that use the IRS as a lure. Tax scams can happen any time of year, not just at tax time. For more, visit "Tax Scams and Consumer Alerts" on IRS.gov.

has been able to grow the Arboretum's staffing capacity with the addition of a second environmental educator and three paid horticultural internships.






SUMMIT HIGH SCHOOL BOYS VOLLEYBALL TEAM CELEBRATES 100TH ALL-TIME WIN






