### POLICE PARTNER WITH FOUNTAIN BAPTIST CHURCH TO HELP BUILD STRONG RELATIONSHIPS WITH YOUTH

The Summit Police Department is continuing its community outreach initiatives through a recent program held in partnership with Fountain Baptist Church designed to foster increased understanding and positive relationships between police and the community.

On Saturday, May 14th, Police Chief Robert Weck worked with the congregation at Fountain Baptist Church to facilitate a group dialogue on police interactions with African American youth. During the discussion, hosted by the Fountain Baptist's Boy's Right of Passage Ministry led by Minister Rodney Williams with the assistance of Rev. Vernon Williams, Chief Weck spoke to the young men about the importance of communication and mutual respect while interacting with law enforcement to ensure positive and constructive encounters.

In addition to the discussion, Chief Weck and Officer Matt Tarentino from the Department's Community Policing Unit also demonstrated simulated motor vehicle stops. These simulated traffic stops helped to highlight what citizens should expect while being stopped by law enforcement, and to demonstrate the high level of professional training standards expected from the Summit Police Department's officers.

"The Summit Police Department is dedicated to working with the members of the community and their leaders to create dynamic partnerships that help make our City a safe and enjoyable place to live, work, and play," said Chief Weck. "I am proud of our partnership with Fountain Baptist Church and grateful to Minister Williams for the opportunity to build relationships with the young members of their congregation, while also showcasing the professional standards of our Department and our officers."

At the close of the presentation, Chief Weck fielded questions from the attendees and held a panel discussion which addressed the continuing initiatives being undertaken by Summit PD and the law enforcement community to promote mutual understanding and cooperation between law enforcement and the public.

### **CITY OF SUMMIT PLANTS RAIN GARDENS** AT LIBRARY AND CITY HALL

The City of Summit is announcing the urban streets it becomes contaminated before completion of two rain gardens located at the Summit Free Public Library and City Hall. The projects were accomplished through the collaborative efforts of the Summit Department of Public Works, Rutgers Cooperative Extension Water Resource Program, and Summit Environmental Commission.

Rain gardens function as a way to effectively capture rain water and filter it directly into the ground, reducing storm water runoff. With the installation of these two rain gardens, approximately 30% more clean water will soak into the ground. As rain water travels through

entering storm drains, and local streams and lakes. "It is a priority for the City of Summit to

manage storm water runoff and reduce our impact on the water system," explains Community Services Director Paul Cascais. "Rain gardens are an important component of our waste water management strategy."

### UNITED METHODIST CHURCH OF SUMMIT CHALKBOARD CONVERSATION

The Summit community once again welcomes the Chalkboard Conversations, presented by the United Methodist Church in Summit. Each year the volunteers at UMC place a large chalkboard in front of the church, with a question posted and allows all who wish to answer.

The first question is posted by Senior Pastor Shawn Callender Hogan, the chalkboard is meant to be interactive and for residents to become heavily involved, so after the first question is posted, citizens are asked to create their own questions. The questions are open ended and promotes thought provoking responses. Like the response to the question, "What would you ask god". A unanimous participant wrote on the chalkboard; "Why did you have to take my son away?"

The chalkboard only goes up during the summer season, when people are more likely to be out and about, but has become so popular that residents often ask why not keep it up the entire

year? Pastor Hogan feels that although the board serves the community well it has its time and should be taken down, to allow people to dwell on the writings on the board.

This year, the first question posted for the community was "Where is your favorite place to find peace?" already people have responded with comments like; on the dance floor, on my yoga mat, and nature walk with my dog. The board has a calming vibe, in that it allows you to express yourself freely, without judgement.





### **INVASIVE BEETLE!!!**

The City of Summit is preparing for a possible infestation of the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB), an invasive beetle from Asia that has attacked and killed tens of millions of Ash trees. The beetle was first found in New Jersey in the spring of 2014 in Somerset County, and since then, has been caught in six counties throughout the state.

The City of Summit is urging homeowners to take steps to protect their trees and control the spread of the beetle. Signs of an infestation include: canopy dieback beginning at the top of the tree and progressing through the year until the tree is bare; sprouts growing from the roots and trunk; split bark with an S-shaped indentation; Dshaped exit holes; and increased woodpecker activity, creating large holes as they extract the larvae.


Biology/ Kinesiology.




