UNION HIGH PERFORMING ARTS SHINES AT PAPER MILL

Union High school was nominated for 12 Paper Mill Rising Star awards and took home the Best Choreography award. Students performed "Step in Time" from this year's performance of Mary Poppins, chosen by the Paper Mill. Performing the routine at the Paper Mill stage had its challenges, the number is over 5 minutes long and had to be cut down to 3 minutes and 30 seconds.

The piece is a tap dance number, with plenty of intensity and the group worked hard to make sure that none of the passion wavered. For their performance they included 12 dancing sweeps, which included all of their high energy moments with dancers flipping, and a dance off by student Johnathan Develson.

Their success on stage started in early May, when the Union High School performers first heard that they had been nominated for 12 awards. They immediately delved into rehearsal, preparing for the big event 3 times a week for more than two hours at each practice. The students enjoyed the repetition, despite the strenuous work because they wanted to master their craft. They did just that by setting a goal and accomplishing their objective. Their overall achievement as skilled performers started in the beginning of the school year, working hard from the very start.

Jennifer Williams, choreographer, described the event as "Very exciting." Even though this marks her third win in the last four years and she foresees future awards with the incredible amount of talented students that enter Union High School. "We do get a handful of students who come in with dance training and they are so wonderful, but a majority of them come in with no dance training experience at all," said Williams. "These students come with a spark and instantly I know we can teach them to become dancers," explains Williams.

Students like Jonathan Duvelson, who won this year's Douglas Michael Krueger Scholarship, had no prior dance experience. Douglas Michael Krueger was a young performing arts student from Union who lost his



life at a young age. Jonathan winning the award hit home for Williams because Doug and she were close friends and to this day she and Doug's mother continue to help raise money for the Douglas Michael Krueger Scholarship. This year Jonathan Duvelson was nominated for Best Lead Actor in his performance, he didn't win, but being nominated and winning the scholarship marked a very special evening.



UNION FIRE DEPARTMENT DEMONSTRATES NEW EXTRICATION EQUIPMENT

The Union Fire Department recently took delivery of their new extrication equipment, which will help them respond to emergencies where individuals may be trapped in their vehicles. A demonstration was performed this morning at the UFD training facility where members of the Fire Department simulated such a scenario on a Hyundai Veloster donated by the BASF Corporation.

"Our old equipment was purchased about 10 years ago," said Township of Union Fire Chief Thomas Byrne. "In that time the way vehicles are manufactured has changed. Manufacturers are using different metal compounds which are now more difficult to cut through."

This cutting-edge, Holmatro equipment allows quicker and easier access to victims requiring extrication from the ultra-high strength and boron-infused steel used in manufacturing today's contemporary motor vehicles. The equipment is 30% lighter, yet, three times more powerful than its predecessor, allowing the responder to work more efficiently while simultaneously increasing the likelihood of the best possible outcome for the victim.

"In emergency situations every second lost is the difference between life and death," said Mayor Manuel Figueiredo. "We are proud to be able to support the Fire Department and outfit them with the latest in lifesaving technology."

During the course of the simulation, the extrication process was seamless with equipment that cut through metal and glass in minutes. The entire process, from start to finish, took approximately 10 minutes.

Competing against six other choirs from the tri-state area, including the 2015 GospelFest winner, Montclair State University Gospel Choir, the Kean University Gospel Choir wowed the audience with its rendition of "None but the Righteous." The choir was awarded a trophy and a cash prize that will go into funding future endeavors for the group, and each member of the choir received an individual medal.

Prior to the competition, the choir had the privilege of singing on the Fox 5 News show, Good Day Street Talk. The executive producer of GospelFest, A. Curtis Farrow, chose the Kean Gospel Choir to appear on the program, which aired April 16th.

BATTLE HILL ELEMENTARY VISITS THE CALDWELL PARSONAGE

This year the Union Township Historical Society opened the doors to the Caldwell Parsonage for elementary students of Union Township, and hopes to make it an annual field trip. Battle Hill Elementary had the opportunity to visit this historic landmark. The Caldwell Parsonage serves as a historical museum, owned and operated by the Union Township Historical Society. It is located on Caldwell Avenue, and was the home of the Rev. James Caldwell, a Presbyterian minister and active supporter of the Patriot cause during the Revolutionary War. The Caldwell House is on the National Register of Historic Places as a well-preserved 18th-century farmhouse with a historical connection. Several state grants have been made for renovations and upkeep of the aging structure.

The students of Battle Hill were guided through the home and barn outside by Mrs. Barbara La Mort, Historical Society President; Mr. David Arminio, Historical Society Vice President and Union Board of Education member; and Mr. Joseph Canarelli, Historical Society Trustee.

The students were given the opportunity to learn about the rich history that took place in the area in which they live. They were engaged through the tour and were challenged to complete a scavenger hunt. They were also able to play games from the Revolutionary period.

To follow up with the tour of the Caldwell Parsonage, the 4th grade students were treated to a reenactment of the life of James Caldwell, portrayed by Union High School graduate, Meridoc Burkhardt. This presentation was a great follow-up to the tour and helped the students better understand the historical events that took place in their hometown.v


