ATHLETICS NIGHT ACQUAINTS STUDENTS WITH SPORTS PROGRAM

Parents and students, including current eighth graders, who hope to play Fall sports at Watchung Hills Regional High School (WHRHS) attended a Fall Athletics Night in May to hear from Athletic Director Chris Van Vliet, and speak to team coaches.

After welcoming remarks and a presentation by Van Vliet about the philosophy, mission and information about key upcoming dates, students and parents went to breakout sessions throughout the school to meet and speak with coaches. There were coaches representing Football, Boys and Girls Cross Country, Field Hockey, Boys and Girls Soccer, Girls Tennis, Girls volleyball, Fall Cheerleading, Gymnastics and Competition Cheer.

"I was very pleased with our fall athletics night," said Van Vliet. "We had a nice turnout, and the feedback I received was all positive. My hope is that our fall athletes are now more informed about our athletic department and the important items that need to be completed before practice begins, as well as the expectations of our coaches in each of our fall programs."

The WHRHS Athletic Department has two athletic


trainers, Terry Marcazo and Michelle Armonda. There are 33 head coaches and 92 coaches in all. The Athletic Department promotes the following qualities for our student-athletes, he said, including: Competitive excellence, resilience, leadership, integrity, and teamwork.

Academic eligibility is extended to all freshman athletes for teams that compete during their first Fall and Winter season, Van Vliet said. To be academically eligible to compete during the Spring season, freshman athletes must have completed 15 credits during their first semester at WHRHS. For sophomores, juniors and seniors, students must have completed 30 credits from the previous school year to be eligible to compete during the Fall and Winter Seasons. For the Spring Season, they must have 15 credits at the end of the first semester.

Students interested in participating in fall sports will faced key deadlines for forms and physicals even before the end of school in June, Van Vliet said. First day for all Fall sports is Monday, Aug. 15th, except for Football, which starts Wednesday, Aug. 10. More information can be found on the department web site at www.whrhs.org.


GIRL SCOUT "NO IDLING" TAKE ACTION PROJECT

SUMMER FUN AT THE WATCHUNG ARTS CENTER

The performance and exhibit season has ended at the Watchung Arts Center, but there is still lots of activity for children and adults. For children, there are two camp programs available: a three-week Summer Art Camp in July, and two, two-week theatre camp programs in August. Adults can participate in both Yoga and Zumba during the summer months. Details and registration information for all programs can be found at watchungarts.org/Classes.htm.

Summer Art Camp, for ages 6-12, begins July 11th and runs until July 29th, from 10 AM to 3 PM Monday through Friday. The program, under the direction and instruction of Mrs. Monica Otero, focuses on Creativity, Imagination and Ingenuity, offering children a unique opportunity to acquire or improve artistic skills, learn new techniques, explore different media and get inspired by famous artists, in an atmosphere of fun. Surrounded by the beauty of the Watchung Mountains, students appreciate both Art and Nature as they draw and paint outdoor scenes and have picnic lunches at Best Lake.

The central theme for 2016 is "Masters of the Modern Age". Students learn about Picasso, van Gogh, Matisse, O'Keeffe, Cezanne, Monet, Pollock, Reilly, Seurat, Mondrian, Kandinsky and others. Pieces based on the theme will be created daily (Projects vary each week!)

In August, All Children's Theatre will return to the WAC for its 21st season. The well-known and highly acclaimed Performing Arts Day Camps for boys and girls ages 6 to 17 "playfully" lives its motto "Where Every Child Is A Star." Two two-week sessions are offered, meeting Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The Creative Dramatics Camp (August 1st – 12th) is geared for children who want to create, develop, write and perform in their own show. The Broadway Kids Camp (August 15th – 26th) gives kids various facets of the theatrical experience. They learn about singing along with acting and dancing using music from a variety of Broadway musicals from the Rogers and Hammerstein classics to more contemporary shows such as "Grease" and others.

Yoga classes will be held on Thursday mornings at 10:00 a.m. during the month of July, and during the evenings, on Tuesday and Thursday, from July 12th through September 1st. The Thursday morning sessions will be taught by Susan Ahlstrom, Tuesday evening sessions by Mike MacDonald, and Thursday evening sessions by Renata Cardinal. All are Certified Yoga Instructors who teach at the Watchung Arts Center throughout the year.

Yuli Oliviera, the Center's Zumba Instructor, will be extending the Spring Zumba session for three additional weeks in July. Wednesday evening classes will be held on July 6th, 13th and 20th at 6:00 p.m., with Saturday morning classes at 10 a.m. on July 9th, 16th and 23rd.



ROBOTICS NATIONALS FOLLOW - UP

The WHRHS Team 41 Robotics Team accumulated numerous medals, banners, plaques and trophies during the season and at the World Championship, held on April 27-30 in St. Louis. The success at the World Championship completed the most successful Team 41 season since 2008. Along the way, the team scored an 8th place finish at Regionals, and a 2nd place and first place at seasonal contests at Mount Olive High School and Montgomery High School, respectively.

This year's Team 41 robot as seen from above, with a boulder on board, which could be flung by catapult at a tower window target to score points. The robot needed to contain its computer brain for remote control, propulsion mechanisms, and other mechanisms, such as the hydraulic piston that gives the catapult power. The bot had to be relatively quick, nimble, durable, with its vital components protected and easily repaired if the rough and tumble of competition caused damages.

SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED TO AREA STUDENTS

Two Warren Hills Regional High School students received scholarships from the Adele DeLeeuw Scholarship Fund at a dinner held Wednesday, June 8th, at the Spain Inn in Piscataway. The scholarships are financed by a bequest from Adele DeLeeuw, longtime Plainfield resident, author of 75 books, journalist, and arts activist.

The Plainfield-North Plainfield Rotary Club administers the Adele DeLeeuw Scholarship Fund and is one of five local Rotary clubs that provide scholarships from the fund to students in their communities who pursue a course of study in poetry, art, journalism, writing or engineering. 

English for speakers of other languages classes will focus on conversation, grammar, citizenship, and life skills.

The Adult Literacy and Community Library Partnership Pilot Program will take place at SCLSNJ's Bound Brook Memorial Library, Manville Library, and North Plainfield Memorial Library branches. A summer session and a fall session will be offered.


