TOWNSHIP CELEBRATES PERUVIAN INDEPENDENCE DAY

On Friday July 8th Peruvians took to the street in celebration of their 195th independence day in Union Township. The Peruvian community was elated to receive the hospitality of the townspeople. "We felt the warm welcome of the Township of Union, represented by Mayor Figueiredo and his staff," expressed Luis Palomino, President of the Peruvians for Progress, a non-profit organization founded in 2000. Their goal is to unify professionals with Peruvian American citizens in Union County in order to integrate the Peruvian community.


The Peruvian population in the United States has been rising, with New Jersey holding the third largest amount of Peruvians in terms of population, according to a Cuny Graduate Center study, Peruvians in the United States, published in 2010. Within New Jersey, Union County is the region with the third largest amount of Peruvians, according to the Department of Labor, New Jersey. "We heard the Peruvian community in Union is growing, we do not have the numbers, but what we know is that we want them to participate in our communities more actively," stated Palomino.

The significance of Union Township and its elected representatives welcoming the Peruvian parade and its Peruvian citizens, is key to the Peruvians for Progress vision. Peruvians for Progress first takes the initiative of linking local governments with the Peruvian community. The plan is that with this newfound recognition from the local administration, it could energize those of Peruvian heritage to actively participate in the whole community.

There are big plans in the works for the Peruvian residents, spearheaded by Peruvians for Progress such as a possible mentorship program, where college students volunteer to help guide high school students through their journey to higher education and a Christmas party for younger kids, catered with scrumptious Peruvian food. This is in addition to a scholarship offered through the non-profit organization.

Often different groups of diverse backgrounds feel isolated, but Peruvians for Progress was formed to mend those issues among the Peruvian people. Although Peruvians for Progress represents one group they have a larger amalgamating message, "We are strong believers that union creates strength," stated Palomino.

As you battle, train, and capture your Pokémon just remember you're still in the real world too! Around the country the PokémonGo craze has seen reports of accidents, injuries and even crimes where suspects have set-up fake 'Pokéstops'. So as you or your kids set out to capture them all:

- Be alert at all times
- Stay aware of your surroundings: look up and be aware who is around you-besides Pokémon
- Play in pairs or as a group to ensure your safetyDo not drive or ride your bike, skateboard, or
- other device while interacting with the app... you can't do both safety

• Do not trespass onto private property or go to areas you usually would not if you weren't playing Pokémon Go

- Be aware and tell your kids about "strangerdanger". The app may draw strangers together in real life at 'Pokéstops'
- Parents be aware of 3rd party software apps claiming to enhance the gaming experience however, these 3rd party apps only gives access to sensitive data - i.e. name, email, calendar
- Be courteous to your neighbors and residents of the community while searching for Pokémon Characters- be mindful of noise and local ordinances.

The event will honor this year's sponsors, highlight the cause for 2016 and encourage community participation.





MOTHER LAUNCHES LOCAL AUTISM SEARCH DIRECTORY

Officially NeedQuest.com is an innovative take on something that's become quite familiar in the 21st century: the online local search directory.

However, what sets NeedQuest apart from other similar websites is two-fold. In addition to being a community-building site that directly connects parents of special needs children in the greater Westfield area with reputable service providers located right in their backyards, this new website is also founded by a local parent of a special needs child.

"My 14 year-old son, Jack, was diagnosed at age three with an autism spectrum disorder," says Leslie Crowe, Founder of NeedQuest LLC. "At that time, I was told by our public school district in Brooklyn to locate a Special Education Itinerant Teacher (SEIT) on my own. It was quite a jarring experience because I didn't know where to begin! The internet? The yellow pages? Our pediatrician? I really had no idea."

For Crowe and her son Jack, it took four more months before they could find an appropriate professional. Thereafter, locating an appropriate school for Jack took another three years. Over time, as Jack grew, so did his needs. From therapy to after school programs, summer camps and more, the list of concerns that Crowe found herself combing the Internet in search of answers for, as well as her own anxiety and despair steadily increased.

"I know there are a lot of special needs parents looking for resources for their children," Crowe says. "However, I could not fathom that there wasn't a more efficient tool to navigate the Internet while searching for local providers to

launched this past April, meet our children's needs. Eventually, after years of personal frustration, in 2015 I founded NeedQuest.com and committed myself to filling this void for the special needs community."

> When it comes to affirming the need for Crowe's mission, the numbers don't lie.

> According to the 2012 National Survey of Children with Special Health Care Needs (NSCSN), nearly 14 percent of children under 18 years of age in the United States, or approximately 10.2 million children overall, were estimated to have special health care needs. In New Jersey, the same study uncovered that out of the state's 1.5 million school-aged children, the number of children reported to have a disability

is 4.5 percent, or 67,772 children overall.

32 percent of parents spend more than 40 hours per week with their special needs child or the amount of time equal to a second full-time job.

As such, helping her fellow special needs parents ease these kinds of concerns has become a driving force for Crowe.

"Parents are looking for services and providers at a time in their lives when they have the least amount of energy," she emphasizes. "With NeedQuest, we're aiming to be a catalyst for change when it comes to northern New Jersey special needs search - and hopefully, we'll make everyone's life, both parents and providers a little easier."
