OSTAL CUSTOMER (Enilworth, nj 07033 **LORRAINE LOZA SWORN IN AS FOSTER CHILD ADVOCATE**

Union County Superior Court Judge Daniel R. Lindemann recently administered oaths to 16 Union County residents — among them Lorraine Loza of Kenilworth — to serve as extra eyes and ears for Family Court judges on cases involving abused, neglected or abandoned children currently in foster care. This marks the 30th training class since Court Appointed Special Advocates of Union County began in 2005. A 17th volunteer was sworn in at a later date.

The new CASA volunteers completed 30 hours of training over six weeks. After performing the oath, Judge Lindemann stepped off the bench and thanked each advocate for committing to serve children in need of a voice. A member of the nonprofit's board participated, and each new advocate was provided a commemorative pin and certificate. During a celebratory luncheon that followed, advocates were matched to their new case. Before starting that work, though, they observed court proceedings to see other CASA volunteers in action. Already, most are in the trenches, working their cases and making inroads for their assigned youth.

Volunteers with varied backgrounds and experiences make successful advocates, and this class is no exception: Ages range from 33 to 80 and include parents, empty-nesters and non-parents; careers include health professionals, school personnel, attorneys and stay-at-home parents. Several experienced abuse in their own childhoods, and one was a CASA years ago who returned to help another child now that her schedule allowed. Most have no prior knowledge of the foster system.

CASA volunteers have court-ordered access to all parties in a child's life, including foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers, and incorporate into court reports findings from these contacts as well as time spent with the youth. Volunteers advocate both in the community and court to ensure their youth's needs are met and time in care is as short as possible. There are 600 Union County children in foster care; CASA of Union County advocates for approximately one-quarter of those and its mission is to provide an advocate for every child that needs one.





HEALTH FAIR TO BE HELD ON SEPTEMBER 24TH

Kenilworth Board of Health President, Randy M. Moscaritolo, announced that: The Michael L. Vitale, Sr. Health Fair will be held on Saturday, September 24th, 2016 at St. Theresa's Elementary School, 540 Washington Avenue, Kenilworth, NJ from 9 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

Health Professionals will be providing screenings and educational materials for: Hearing, Vision, Hypertension, Dental, Colorectal Cancer, Vascular Educator, Prostate Health, Posture, Scoliosis, Podiatry, Diabetes and Blood Chemistry (SMAC/CBC), and more.

If you are taking the SMAC/CBC blood test, you must fast after 12AM the night before. Do not take the diabetes test. The following

immunizations will also be provided at no cost: DPT for ages one to seven years old; MMR-ages 15 months to six years old (three in one Vaccine provides protection against Measles, Mumps, and Rubella), Polio vaccine-ages one to eighteen years; Tetanus booster shots for adults.

The SMAC & CBC Blood test will be offered free of charge to Kenilworth Residents and a \$30.00 fee for Non-residents. There will also be a \$30.00 charge to residents taking PSA (Prostate Screening) and \$35.00 to Non-Residents.

Flu shots will be available at a cost of \$20.00. Fees may be subject to change by the Laboratory. Snacks will be provided for blood donors and individuals having had blood work.


Children had an opportunity to visit with Kenilworth.

Tracy, the unofficial mascot of the Kenilworth Public Library, along with Sparkee the mascot of the Somerset Patriots.







