

COLUMBIA SCHOOL FACULTY PARTICIPATE IN THE 25 MILE MS BIKE RIDE

Smith and Noelle Fenimore recently embarked on the 25-mile Bike MS Country Challenge in support of those with Multiple Sclerosis. According to the Mayo Clinic, Multiple sclerosis (MS) is a potentially disabling disease of the brain and spinal cord (central nervous system). The bike ride was hosted by the National Multiple Sclerosis Society and according to the nonprofit their mission states "people affected by MS can live their best lives as we stop MS in its tracks, restore what has been lost and end MS forever." The bike ride is a fund raiser to help with research, programs, and to raise awareness.

Ashlee and Noelle were made aware of the event by Ashlee's sister, Sara Smith, who works for the National MS Foundation and organized the event. Ashlee organized the team in Berkeley Heights and recruited Noelle, and others like Principal and Vice Principal Frank G. Geiger and Grace Acosta, respectively. The team didn't train together, but worked well together, even though this was their first time being involved in an event of this nature, but it won't be their last. The team plans on possibly training together in the future for other rides.

They already have the next ride planned out, which will be held down the New Jersey shore during the spring. Their hopes are to possibly recruit more staff members, students, and their families to join their ranks. The route, explains Noelle, is flat and wouldn't be as difficult as the 25-mile hilly course that they completed in the Berkeley Heights area.

Noelle and Ashlee are more than co-workers, Columbia Middle School Teachers Ashlee they are good friends and when Ashlee approached Noelle about the event, Noelle agreed, but didn't even own a bike at the time. She now feels that purchasing a bike and agreeing to participate in the event was one of the best investments she has ever made. Noelle contributed to a worthy cause and is now involved in a new hobby, which she thoroughly enjoys.

Word spread throughout the school about their accomplishment and the students are amazed at what their educators have achieved. Apart from what the team at Columbia Middle School have done and what they will do in the spring down at the shore, they also participated in the Walk/Bike to school day on Oct 5th. Ashlee and Noelle biked from their apartment and met up with Frank and Grace, together they all biked amongst their students to school.

RESCUE SQUAD KEEPING COMMUNITY MEMBERS SAFE SINE 1942

Across America there are community members who answer the call for help from their fellow citizens and invest their time for the betterment of othrs. The EMT volunteers of Berkeley Heights have been doing this since 1942 and have been keeping the community safe. If needed, they offer assistance to surrounding towns like New Providence and Long Hill Township, and others.

Their service area extends down to Route 78 and, no matter what the time, these local heroes are always available, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. They are at their best, when others might be at their worst.

The Berkeley Heights Rescue Squad (BHVRS) is an essential part of the community and provides services free of charge, where some cities send a bill to their patients. The medical equipment used by the Squad is primarily paid for by tax-deductible donations. According to the Berkeley Heights Municipal website, the town has a population of 13,345 and is about 6.3 square miles. BHVRS responds to over 800 phone calls a year. EMT members who are over the age of 18 and are certified by the State of NJ, dedicate an average of 12 hours a week, plus two 6-hour weekend shifts. Although these hours are required to be an EMT within the rescue squad, whenever a member is called on for extra hours,

they rarely say no.

Younger members, under the age of 18, are classified as cadets, even if EMT certification has been acquired. Nicole Segalini, of Berkelev Heights, a high school student who is a certified EMT cadet at the Rescue Squad, decided to join in January of this year. Nicole, who is fascinated by the medical world, was encouraged to join by the Rescue Squad Chief, Samantha Lloyd. Nicole earned her EMT certification at Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital, where a minimum of 150 hours of classes are required. She is looking forward to becoming a full member after she graduates from high school. Currently she is required, like all cadets, to dedicate a minimum of 3 hours a week. Some cadets, like Nicole, take on weekend shifts also. Nicole, for example, rides up to 6 hours a week.

When first joining BHVRS every member needs to take a first aid and a CPR class for the Professional Rescuer. These classes are provided by BHVRS member and Vehicle Lt, Bill Schulz, a certified American Red Cross instructor. This allows members to ride on the ambulance and respond to calls. Once a month Bill and Samantha organize cadet meetings where they hold training sessions, providing recruits with scenarios that the cadets may not have seen. Any member wishing to become a NJ certified EMT must attend/pass a state certified basic EMT course and pass the state exam.

The Berkeley Heights Rescue Squad is a focal point in the community, not only providing medical treatment when needed, but also participating in local community events such as 5K races, the Holiday Tree Lighting and Winter Walk, GL football games and visits to various BH schools. This year the Rescue Squad attended the Mount Carmel Festival and Bikers for Brooke, a yearly motorcycle ride in memory of Brooke Healey held to help raise awareness for her rare tumor, Diffuse Intrinsic Pontine Glioma or DIPG.

Currently the Berkeley Heights Rescue Squad has approximately 20 full-time members, 10 associates, and 8 cadets. While the Rescue Squad has a group of well trained professional EMTs, they are always looking for citizens too step-up and join the squad to help keep this great organization alive. The Rescue Squad is not only looking for volunteers to ride on the ambulance and provide care for those in need, but are also seeking Auxiliary members, those who just want to help out BHVR, but don't want to become EMTs.

SPOTLIGHT ON LOCAL ARTIST MIRON ABRAMOVICI

Berkeley Heights Resident, Miron Abramovici is an engineer by training, former professor at Columbia University, researcher at Bell Labs, and even wrote a computer engineering textbook. Most people would agree that Miron has had a successful and fulfilling life, but about eight years ago when Miron retired from his engineering career, he ventured outside his engineering world and into the world of art. Discovering his inner artist, Miron proceeded to teach himself the art of photography and the results have been quite impressive.

Almost immediately after Miron began expressing his artistic side through photography, he began to earn many awards including the 2009 Fine art Photography Competition. The Fine Arts Photography awards are judged by a panel of industry professionals. Winners of the of the awards are given the title of either Professional Fine Art Photographer of the Year, or Amateur Fine Art Photographer of the Year, given cash prizes, have their artwork showcased, and given international publicity. In January 2011 Miron was awarded the NJ Artist of the Month; and then had one of his photos selected as Kodak Picture of the Day, which was then put on display on Time Square in August 2011, for people from all over to see. 
When Miron creates his art, he begins by walking with his camera and a bit of instinct and foresight of how the image will look once he

BLOOD RESERVES CHALLENGED BY DEMAND O-NEGATIVE BLOOD A CONSTANT CHALLENGE

New Jersey Blood Services, a division of New York Blood Center (NYBC) is asking for help to maintain an adequate supply of all blood types, but especially O-negative – the "universal" blood which can be transfused into anyone in an emergency. In addition, hundreds of additional blood drives need to be scheduled to meet projected hospital demand. Current inventory of several blood types is running below the desired target level.

"It's simple: hospital patient demand for blood often outpaces our best efforts to recruit donors and schedule blood drives," said NYBC Executive Director of Donor Recruitment Andrea Cefarelli. "There are always reasons but we have to overcome that for the sake of hospital patients who need us."

"This is one of the toughest times of the year," Cefarelli added. "We're asking for our dedicated supporters to roll up their sleeves to make sure we're able to provide our hospital partners with whatever they need to take care of their patients."

Blood products have a short shelf life – from five to 42 days, so constant replenishment is necessary. Each and every day there are patients who depend on the transfusion of red blood cells, platelets and plasma to stay alive. But blood and blood products can't be manufactured. They can only come from volunteer blood donors who take an hour to attend a blood drive or visit a donor center.

you cannot donate but still wish to participate in bringing crucial blood products to patients in need, please ask someone to donate for you, or consider volunteering at a local blood drive.

Any company, community organization, place of worship, or individual may host a blood drive. NYBC also offers special community service scholarships for students who organize community blood drives during summer months. Blood donors receive free mini-medical exams on site including information about their temperature, blood pressure and hematocrit level. Eligible donors include those people at least age 16 (with parental permission or consent), who weigh a minimum of 110 pounds, are in good health and meet all Food & Drug Administration and NY or NJ State Department of Health donor criteria. People over 75 may donate with a doctor's note.
