KEN LARSON CELEBRATES 50 YEARS OF COMMUNITY SERVICE

Ken Larson was born and raised in Green Brook and though he now lives in Middlesex with his wife of 42 years, he has always been dedicated Green Brook, serving as a volunteer firefighter for 50 consecutive years and for 10 years, simultaneously volunteering as an EMS with the Green Brook Rescue Squad.

At a young age Ken would often hang around the firehouse, usually playing. Those moments were impressionable on young Ken Larson and by the time he was 16 years old he joined the Green Brook Fire Department.

His time with the Green Brook Fire Department was temporarily postponed, when Ken's father and Fire House Chief, decided that it would be best if he would join the Navy. The Firehouse Chief was also a Chief Petty officer in the Navy and local recruiter for the area.

Ken is deep into volunteerism and reminisces of a time when the community participated in town events, communal organizations, designed for the betterment of all. When Ken first joined, the Fire Squad had plenty of members, they were a focal point in the community. Ken explains that the Fire Squad was a place where people could come together and get to know one another. Through the Fire Squad members could host different events and hold community activities like running a little league. There are many groups and organizations doing the community service that the Squad once did. Now fewer people are getting involved with the Squad becaude they are involved in the other organizations.

During his 50 years with the Fire Squad, Ken has seen a lot change over the years. He joined because of the proximity of the firehouse and continues to serve because of the people he's encountered. The comradery he developed keeps him coming back.

Ken has seen other changes also, and not all negative. Ken talks about the equipment he once wore, rubber raincoats, and how a notice of a fire came in the form of a person having to call it in. Today's equipment, like their fire protective gear; while it cannot completely withstand fire, gives them enough time to get in and out of a fire. Something that saves lives of firefighters and victims of fires. Fire alarms and CO2 alarms also changed the way the Green Brook Fire Squad responds to emergencies, notifying them immediately.

Being a volunteer firefighter is no easy task, Ken recounts events during his 50 years as a firefighter that demonstrates the dedication that is involved, not only in the day-to-day tasks but in extreme emergencies. Ken was involved during the Green Brook floods and during Superstorm Sandy, basically having to live in the firehouse because of the amount of support the fire squad was providing. His wife, while supportive, was understandably worried.

The Squad struggling to keep memberships up. Ken also joined the Volunteer Rescue Squad as an EMS driver, a position he held for 10 years before stepping down due to inactivity. The Rescue Squad still exists, but duties were relinquished to the Town of North Plainfield.

Currently Ken Larson's duties as a firefighter are much less than what they used to be. He mainly focuses on the recruiting aspect, attending annual bike rides to demonstrate to possible younger members, that if he could be involved so can they. While Ken is concerned with the number of members involved, he stated that he does not plan on retiring anytime soon.





JESSIE SUN ULTIMATE STAR

Ultimate, which was originally known as Ultimate Frisbee, has been gaining a lot of notoriety lately from the public and even the International Olympic Committee in 2015. This is the vision of local Ultimate superstar Jessie Sun, who was part of the Watchung Regional High School championship victories - 4 out of the 6 consecutive championship victories. With the team's mountain of success, Jessie still managed to be a bright spot in a team full of stars.

Jessie's history with the sport dates back to elementary school, but it wasn't until her freshman year in high school that she began to take the sport seriously and even then she joined with no intentions of pursuing the commitment and the success in the sport that she has amassed thus far. Jessie began, like most of her teammates, as a multi-sport student athlete, playing volleyball, fencing, and Frisbee. Due to the caring, yet intense nature of the game, Jessie dropped volleyball and decided to participate in the fall and spring seasons for Ultimate.

"Frisbee was a better choice for me because the game emphasizes equal playing opportunities for everyone, whereas in volleyball, no matter how much effort you put in, favoritism would leave you benched an entire season," expressed Jessie.

This is one of the main attractions to the sport for Jessie. "Ultimate Frisbee is a game of spirit and mentality," Jessie stated; she applauds the sport for relying on honesty when it comes to making calls on the field. Self-officiating is a very big part of the game, but while the sport is not well advertised, due to the growing popularity, especially on higher levels of competition like college, observers or referees are often a part of the game. Jessie feels, these officials are something important due to the crowd involvement, in order to keep the game moving along.

The fact that the self-officiating aspect is diminishing, is a good indication of the sports growing acceptance, something Jessie is proud of. She has served as an ambassador of the sport, traveling to compete in regional tournaments in Amherst, MA; Devens, MA; Portland, ME; Pittsburgh, PA; and Blaine, MN for a National Youth Club Championship. She has also traveled to Florida for world tryouts. Jessie credits her opportunity to travel for her sport to her role models and former Watchung Hill Regional High School Ultimate teams and players like, Olivia Hampton and Sadie Jezierski. The progress that the sport has made throughout the years at Watchung Regional High School has opened up the door for recognition, enough to convince the school to fund travel expenses. Something Jessie regards as extremely important, this allows more exposure and opportunities for upcoming players.

This past summer Jessie had the opportunity to bring her Ultimate skills to Poland and what she realized is that despite the language difference, when it comes to Ultimate, the sport and its players still have the same spirit for the game. During her time in Poland players from all over brought their gear in and traded with each other.

Jessie has seen her short term goals of bringing recognition to the sport at her school come to life, with the team generating plenty of chatter among students and faculty over the team's achievements, as well witnessing how the sport she has invested so much, gain recognition overseas. She will have the opportunity to help in the growth of Ultimate with her new team, The University of Pittsburgh's women's squad, Danger Ultimate. Danger Ultimate had a record 40 new prospective platers tryout and even created a B team, proof that Ultimate has gained legitimacy.

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF CARDINAL LANE

The Green Brooke Historical Society gets quite a few questions about the significance of Cardinal Lane. If one goes to the Washington Rock parking lot and then goes about 50 yards down Rock Road East towards Watchung, one sees a sign for Cardinal Lane where the lane intersects the road.

The lane is walkable although washed out by rains after many years. Jon Gabriel told us that the lane was used by motorcycles as recently as the 1960's. There once was a local newspaper editor who told that in the 1930's his father would drive there all the way from Elizabeth with large bottles to be filled at the spring about 20 feet down hill from the main road intersection.

That ended in the 1930's when some idiot

threw a large firecracker into the mouth of the identified as "The Path". The upper part of "The springhead which sealed it closed forever.

The Lane has had at least three different names over the years as well as a multitude of uses. Each with an important story of its own.

Cornelius Vermeule and his brother at one time owned 1,200 acres of land stretching far and wide. We do know that in 1777 that they controlled a 96-acre self-sustaining parcel, with all important services, which was known as the "Blue Hills" plantation. The main house was located about 200 feet to the west of the current Vermeule Mansion in North Plainfield at Greenbrook Road and Clinton Avenue. On maps of 1777 there is clearly marked a route from "Blue Hills" up to the crest of the First Watchung

Path" is the current Cardinal Lane. So on the afternoon of June 13th 1777 Edward Fitz Randolph volunteered at now 188 Greenbrook Road, which was the home and farm of Jonah Vail, to take General George Washington to a spot on the mountain where the general could best view the British troops on the plains below. They rode to "Blue Hills" and then up "The Path", being careful of crossing traffic, to the end of Cardinal Lane and across to Washington Rock. Of course on that day it was not known as Washington Rock. Hard to verify but probably simply referred to as Herbie's Rock in those days.




