CHRONE'S TAVERN CELBRATES 70TH YEAR IN BUSINESS

On Saturday, October 1st, Chrone's Tavern celebrated its 70th year in business. Mike Chrone is the third generation running the family business. Chrone's Tavern, Italian Restaurant and Pizzeria, located at 906 Mountain Avenue in Mountainside, NJ, was opened in 1946 by Lois Chrone, Mike's grandfather. Mike's father, Maurice started running the business in the mid-1960s and worked there steady up until his death in 2014. Mike continues the tradition that his grandfather and father developed.

The original Chrone's was a few lots over from where the new location is located. The old tavern, said to have been frequented by Al Capone, was razed and replaced by a gas station. They moved to the new location in 1951.

There are many facets to Chrone's. It is opened 7 days a week and it is a popular neighborhood bar with many regulars. Locals mix with neighbors from surrounding towns. It is a comfortable place to socialize or watch sports. Chrone's is also known for its full-service Italian restaurant and pizzeria. Clientele can eat-in, or take out. They also cater events. The building also features a stand-alone liquor store offering a full array of packaged goods.


Chrone's is most known for its fun atmosphere, with a mix of friendly faces who will make you feel like a regular the first time you visit.



MOUNTAINSIDE ARTIST IS PRESIDENT OF KEAN UNIVERSITY'S METALSMITH STUDENT LEAGUE

Chasing, a popular metal smithing technique, involves using hammers and dies to leave indelible marks. On Friday, September 9, Kean University's Metalsmith Student League invited students to "make their mark on Kean" by chasing words and textures into die cut metal letters. The interactive metal smithing display was part of Kean Day, the university's annual celebration of student groups and activities. The Metalsmith Student League won top honors at the event, taking home the \$500 grand prize for best table. Entrants were judged on originality, interaction, and Kean pride. 75 student groups participated in Kean Day, which drew a crowd of over 2,000.

"I fell in love after my first metals class," said Metalsmith Student League president Marianne Jennings. "Professor Jennifer Crupi was so talented I knew I would learn a lot from

one of the best."

Crupi, a metal smith and fine artist whose work is featured in the Smithsonian's permanent collection, is the academic advisor to the Metalsmith Student League. She creates sculptural objects and jewelry that enhance and promote gestures and visual communication.

Jennings, a Mountainside resident, earned her bachelor's degree from Kean in 1985 and recently returned to the university to pursue graduate studies in Fine Arts. In 2016, she relaunched the Metalsmith Student League with help from Crupi and Kean's Fine Arts department. Over 70 students signed up to learn more about the club at Kean Day.

"So many students didn't know Kean offered metal smithing and many had never heard of our club before," said Jennings.



CIVIL AIR PATROL PROGRAM OF UNION COUNTY

The Civil Air Patrol Cadet Program of Union County ended their action packed summer by providing a presentation to community members in the Scotch Plains Library. The Civil Air Patrol is a non-combatant organization, which is an auxiliary of the Air force, made up of civilian volunteers. Cadets had the opportunity to teach local students about aerospace concepts, as well as give hands-on training on how to use a flight simulator. The purpose of the event was to serve as an outreach program to display what the cadet program encompasses, hopefully sparking some interest among the student population in Scotch Plains and the surrounding towns within Union



County.

The day was broken down into two sections. The cadets first presented a PowerPoint explaining topics, such as how wings create lift; which, according to NASA, is a subject that many internet sources, textbooks, and encyclopedias get wrong. The theory NASA uses is what the cadets explained in their presentation, the Bernoulli's principle. NASA also refers to an Isaac Newton theory, but explains that the Bernoulli's theory is correct, along with Newton's theory. Other topics covered in the first session included the axis of an airplane and also the parts of an airplane that control maneuvers.

The second portion of the program was dedicated to more hands-on instruction. Students at the library were instructed on how to use flight simulators. Two simulators were used in the demonstration. Attendees could practice how to take off, land, fly, and could also learn the different instruments on a plane and how they affect the planes movements. Afterwards, paper model rockets were displayed in order to teach basic principles of flight.

Jose and Ceri Vergara are in charge of the Civil Air Patrol. Ceri explains that the Civil Air Patrol began during World War II for the purpose of allowing civilians, who owned airplanes, to get involved. During the September 11th attacks, civilian airplanes were used for reconnaissance. The Civil Air Patrol Program has programs for both adults and teenagers, ages 12-18. Currently, the Civil Air Patrol Program of Union County has 6 adult members, these members are in charge of providing education and scheduling activities for the group. The group meets Tuesdays from 7-9 p.m. at Chatham High School.



Jose and Ceri were inspired to join the Civil Air Patrol by their daughter, Veronica Vergara, who attends Union County Vocational Technical School in Scotch Plains. Currently, Veronica is the elder of the cadets and has taken over as senior cadet.

Jose notes that countless students looking to go to college in the near future often seek extracurricular activities in order to stand out. This is where a program like Civil Air Patrol could be useful. Ceri feels that in addition to the program looking good on your resume, students also have the opportunity to learn and experience things that they might not in a regular school setting. One parent, Ceri recalls, stated at a parent's meeting, "This is the best kept secret in the United States!"


