ITALIAN FESTIVAL CELEBRATES TRADITION AND COMMUNITY

Monday, September 5th, marked the end of Labor Day weekend and the four-day Italian Festival held in Scotch Plains, hosted by the UNICO Scotch Plains-Fanwood Chapter, St. Bartholomew Church, and St. Bartholomew Academy. People of all backgrounds made their way through the church parking lot to the large yard area, which had been turned into a carnival style fiesta. Participants had the option of enjoying a variety of Italian dishes or partaking in several thrilling rides and games.

While the festival this year was a success, like it's always been, this celebration was much different in its early years than recent times. Laura Swiderski, was born and raised in Scotch Plains and has been a member of the St. Bartholomew parish since it was established in 1948. She recalls a different event. Laura, who volunteers to help with the festival as a representative of the church, was recruited by Mark Ginder, two years after the Festival first started

When the first festival was held in 1974, she explains, the church didn't own the lot or much property. The church used a portable altar to hold a Mass, and at the end of the festival, a firework display was held for the community. As the church grew the town grew with it. The fireworks show had to be cancelled because of the proximity to the homes, instead new carnival rides were added to the festival annually.

Attractions weren't the only new additions, UNICO and St. Bartholomew Church began creating new ways to raise money for noble causes. This year festival goers had the opportunity to donate to the Relief Fund, to support victims of a recent earthquake that had occurred in Italy. St. Bartholomew Church accepted donations for their 9/11 Luminary Remembrance and for a 5-dollar contribution a donor could have the name of a victim added to their prayers.

The amount of food and those who prepared it for the festival is also different these days. Renato Beribin, who helped establish UNICO chapters in Scotch Plains-Fanwood, Westfield, and Clark, spoke about church members preparing all of the

food. Renato began organizing the festival a couple years after Laura and remembers the smell of freshly cooked pasta fagioli. While the food and attractions have changed, the atmosphere remains the same.

Renato explains the festival is in celebration of Saint Nicholas De Bari, Patriot Saint of the town Montazzoli, Italy and Saint Bartholomew. On Saturday September 3rd, the church held a Mass in his honor. It is clear that the hopes of holding this festival are to instill tradition and community togetherness. After 42 years this notion seems to be working well and Bill Mariani is a perfect example.

Bill who represents both the St. Bartholomew Church, and UNICO which is an international Italian service organization, was working alongside Laura and Renato at this year's festival. "I was born and raised in the parish," explained Bill. Bill was born in Scotch Plains, Laura and Renato met Bill when he was one-year of age. They passed on the tradition to him and Bill is sure to pass on the tradition to the younger generation.





Sepsis, a severe reaction to infection that can be life-threatening, is not a very well-known condition. However, according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, it "kills more than 258,000 Americans every year, making it the ninth-leading cause of diseaserelated deaths in the country."

Some people believe that sepsis is something that only occurs in hospitals, but this is not the case. Dr. Craig Coopersmith, professor of surgery at Emory University School of Medicine and the former president of the Society of Critical Care Medicine, states "about two-thirds of cases are first documented by the emergency department, which means that they were acquired outside of a hospital setting."

Sepsis often happens in the very young, very old, and those who have chronic illnesses and compromised immune systems. However, anyone can develop sepsis, even those with a

Contributing Author: Susan Baldani, a life simple scrape, wound, or burn that has not been death. It is a true emergency and medical help properly treated. If you have had any type of infection and think you may now have sepsis, it's very important to make this clear when seeking medical help. The Sepsis Alliance, along with the CDC, advises patients to actually say "I am concerned about sepsis." According to Dr. Coopersmith, "If you get sepsis, you have a higher chance of dying than if you have a heart attack, stroke or trauma. There is no question that increasing awareness of sepsis would save lives."

> The signs of sepsis can be broken down in a simple acronym:

- S Shivering, fever, or feeling very cold
- E Extreme pain or general discomfort, as in "worst ever"
 - P Pale or discolored skin
 - S Sleepy, difficult to wake up or confused
 - I "I feel like I might die"
 - S Shortness of breath"

If sepsis is not caught and treated quickly, it can lead to tissue damage, organ failure and needs to be obtained immediately.

The Scotch Plains Rescue Squad is a volunteer organization of Neighbors Helping Neighbors. With over 90 volunteers, we answer calls not only in Scotch Plains but in surrounding towns as well when needed. Besides answering calls, you will see our ambulances at many special events held in town, such as Scotch Plains Day, the Memorial Day Parade, high school football games, and the summer concerts on the Village Green. We are also available to provide demonstrations for Boys and Girls Scout troops, clubs, and any other group that may be interested in what we do. In addition, we lend out wheelchairs, crutches, canes and other assorted medical equipment free of charge. 



Ever since the 5th grade Kristian has been enamored by the inner workings of the computer, which is why at the beginning of this summer, Kristian professed to his father, Leszek Borysiak, his ambitions to open up a new business, selling computers. Leszek encouraged his eager son to pursue his dream, but proposed a different way of providing computer hardware to the public. Kristian loves computers as a whole, but what he really enjoys is building computers from scratch. The business that Kristian wanted to start, with longtime friend Junaid Ilyas, was constructing computers for his requests. Leszek advised his son to build a computer, but instead of selling the computer he could donate it to an organization in need.

Kristian's bond to his grandparents set the course for the organization in need. Kristian will be heading to high school in a year, where he plans on expanding his knowledge through participating in different clubs, such as the Robotics Club.

BLOOD RESERVES CHALLENGED BY PATIENT DEMAND

New Jersey Blood Services, a division of New York Blood Center (NYBC) is asking for help to maintain an adequate supply of all blood types, but especially O-negative – the "universal" blood which can be transfused into anyone in an emergency. In addition, hundreds of additional blood drives need to be scheduled to meet projected hospital demand. Current inventory of several blood types is running below the desired target level.

"It's simple: hospital patient demand for blood often outpaces our best efforts to recruit donors and schedule blood drives," said NYBC Executive Director of Donor Recruitment Andrea Cefarelli. "There are always reasons but we have to overcome that for the sake of hospital patients who need us."

"This is one of the toughest times of the year," Cefarelli added. "We're asking for our dedicated supporters to roll up their sleeves to make sure we're able to provide our hospital partners with whatever they need to take care of their patients."

Blood products have a short shelf life – from five to 42 days, so constant replenishment is necessary. Each and every day there are patients

who depend on the transfusion of red blood cells, platelets and plasma to stay alive. But blood and blood products can't be manufactured. They can only come from volunteer blood donors who take an hour to attend a blood drive or visit a donor

People over 75 may donate with a doctor's note.

CIVIL AIR PATROL PROGRAM OF UNION COUNTY

The Civil Air Patrol Cadet Program of Union County ended their action packed summer by providing a presentation to community members in the Scotch Plains Library. The Civil Air Patrol is a non-combatant organization, which is an auxiliary of the Air force, made up of civilian volunteers. Cadets had the opportunity to teach local students about aerospace concepts, as well as give hands-on training on how to use a flight simulator. The purpose of the event was to serve as an outreach program to display what the cadet program encompasses, hopefully sparking some interest among the student population in Scotch Plains and the surrounding towns within Union County.

The day was broken down into two sections. The cadets first presented a PowerPoint explaining topics, such as how wings create lift; which, according to NASA, is a subject that many internet sources, textbooks, encyclopedias get wrong. The theory NASA uses is what the cadets explained in their presentation, the Bernoulli's principle. NASA also refers to an

Bernoulli's theory is correct, along with Newton's theory. Other topics covered in the first session included the axis of an airplane and also the parts of an airplane that control maneuvers.

The second portion of the program was dedicated to more hands-on instruction. Students at the library were instructed on how to use flight simulators. Two simulators were used in the demonstration. Attendees could practice how to take off, land, fly, and could also learn the different instruments on a plane and how they affect the planes movements. Afterwards, paper model rockets were displayed in order to teach basic principles of flight.

Jose and Ceri Vergara are in charge of the Civil Air Patrol. Ceri explains that the Civil Air Patrol began during World War II for the purpose of allowing civilians, who owned airplanes, to get involved. During the September 11th attacks, civilian airplanes were used for reconnaissance. The Civil Air Patrol Program has programs for both adults and teenagers, ages 12-18. Currently, the Civil Air Patrol Program of Union County has

One parent, Ceri recalls, stated at a parent's meeting, "This is the best kept secret in the United States!"

Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home, including the basement. Larger homes may need more alarms. For the best protection, make sure all smoke alarms are interconnected. When one sounds, they all sound.
