#### **TOWNSHIP VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT 2016 CAR SHOW**

The Warren Township Volunteer Fire Department held their eleventh annual car show on Sunday, September 11. The annual event is a major fund raiser for the fire department with all proceeds going towards the purchase of firefighting equipment.

The car show is one of the largest in the state and tri state area. This year over 360 show vehicles were in attendance. They included vintage and classic cars, race cars, hot rods, street rods, muscle cars, brass cars, fire trucks, vintage British cars, military vehicles and motorcycles. There was even a fully restored 1960's classic ice cream truck selling ice cream. Many car and "crusin" clubs were also at the show. The show was open from 9am - 3pm. Show vehicles began arriving at 6am to register and park their cars on one of the four show "fields". Free continental breakfast, custom dash plaques, and hats were given to the show car registrants. A group of professional judges with many years of car show experience, evaluated the entries in the various thirty three predetermined classes. There was also a "Best of Show" award given out. This year's winner was a 1948 custom Cadillac convertible owned by John McElroy of Livingston, NJ. The awards ceremony began at 2:45pm.

Over 2,500 people came to this year's event. The day was a nostalgic and fun filled for all who attended. "Golden Gup" Gus Gasciogne delighted everyone by spinning tunes from the 50's and 60"s. At Noon time, the traditional starting of the race car engines took place, sending a thunderous roar throughout the venue. Food vendors sold hot dogs, hamburgers, french fries, zeppoles, beverages and other food





#### **POLICE PATROLS IN WARREN TOWNSHIP SCHOOLS**

As part of an ongoing partnership between Warren Township Schools and the Warren Township Police Department, periodic police patrols will be conducted in each of the district's four elementary schools and the middle school during the school year.

Police patrols are "a good way for our officers to familiarize themselves with the interior layout of the schools as well as with the faculty," says Warren Township Police Chief William Keane.



"Additionally, regular patrols by uniformed officers will allow the children to get used to seeing the police there, making them more approachable and hopefully feeling more comfortable with us should an emergency situation take place."

These planned police rotations are "not due to any particular security concerns," adds Superintendent Dr. Matthew Mingle. "This is a proactive approach to further the relationship between the police and the school community. Students and staff will get to know the police officers and vice versa."

Keane says he has instructed patrol sergeants and supervisors to "conduct periodic, random checks during the school week with no specific time or school." According to the police chief, an officer will enter a school, notify the main office staff of his/her presence and perform a "walk through."

In addition, in close cooperation with the school district, Warren Township police will carry out one so-called active shooter drill during the school year. The drill will be conducted at one of the district's five schools and will occur on a weekend when staff and students are not present. Advance notice of the location/date/time of the active shooter drill will be communicated to the community via district e-blast, Facebook, Twitter and the district website.

"Active shooter drills are just one part of the state-mandated 'School Security Drill Law' and of school safety and security plans. Other drills include evacuation, bomb threat, lockdown, shelter in place, and several others," says Ronald Berry, Security Compliance Manager for the school district. "All drills are important to assure a proper response in the event of an actual emergency."

Chief Keane says his officers train annually for active shooter scenarios and have utilized Watchung Hills Regional High School in past years as the practical setting. Over time, the goal will be to provide access to each of the district schools for these drills.

Police presence in the district schools and at WHRHS is not new. Keane notes that an officer is regularly assigned to the high school on a daily basis and that his officers have routinely performed school safety lectures, along with the Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) program, at the elementary and middle schools.

Superintendent Mingle applauds the partnership with the Warren Township Police Department and all those who work to keep staff and students safe.

"We are fortunate to have such a close working relationship between the school district and police department. There is a clear shared focus on the safety of each student who comes to our schools on a daily basis," Mingle says. "I applaud the Warren Township Board of Education and our leadership team for all of their efforts in this area."

#### CHILD SUPPORT – HOW NEW JERSEY COURTS CALCULATE AND MODIFY SUPPORT OBLIGATIONS

In New Jersey, child support is defined as a financial payment from one parent to the other to provide for the needs of their child or children. Child support is the right of every child and neither spouse can waive this responsibility. All parents regardless of their marital status have an obligation to support their children until they are deemed emancipated.

In most instances, the amount of child support to be paid is calculated by using New Jersey's Child Support Guidelines. Income information is exchanged between the parents and this data is used in combination with factors such as the number of children, percentage of non-custodial parenting time and other prior child support obligations, to determine the amount of child support that is to be paid weekly. The Guidelines take into account the amount of funds necessary between the two parents to cover the basic needs of the children including, but not limited to, their food, shelter, healthcare and clothing expenses.

Child support obligations will remain in place for many years. Child support is not terminated automatically and may continue longer based on extraordinary circumstances such as the special needs of a child. As such, a common aspect of many divorce agreements is an agreement between the parties for the use of a "COLA" which is an acronym for Cost-of-Living Adjustment. This procedure automatically raises child support awards every two or three years, the specific details of which are negotiated and agreed to before any final divorce judgment is entered. The purpose of a COLA is to keep the child support award's value current due to inflation. If child support is payable through the Probation Department, parents are often contacted directly regarding the

implementation of a cost of living adjustment.

Changes to child support obligations can be made. Child support orders in New Jersey are subject to modification based upon what the Court may define as a change in circumstances. While there are numerous situations that can be defined as a change in circumstances, some of the more common situations that would qualify include:

- an increase in the cost of living
- the emancipation (as defined under law) of one or more of the children
- a demonstrable increase or decrease in the paying parents income
- a parent or child suffering a disability or serious illness
- or, in some instances, the maturation of the child or children.

If a modification in the amount of child support is appropriate, the party seeking to modify the amount paid is obligated to file an application with the Court. These written applications can sometimes be extremely fact sensitive and require extensive documented proof of the change in circumstances. This is particularly relevant if the reason for seeking a modification is employment or health related on the part of the paying parent.

#### **SCHOOLS RECEIVE SAFETY GRANT FROM NJSIG**

The Warren Township School District has received a \$4,106 grant to invest in safety-related projects and improvements. The safety grant was awarded in August by the New Jersey Schools Insurance Group (NJSIG), a member-owned joint insurance fund for public school districts that provides property, casualty and workers' compensation insurance to public and charter schools in New Jersey. The grant money will be used for emergency kits for classrooms in all five of the district's schools.

"The process involved in qualifying for these grants enables the district to show the constant and consistent steps it takes toward ensuring safety in the district. In turn, we then receive grant monies to further assist in matters of district safety," said Patricia Leonhardt, the district's Business Administrator. "Kudos to Buildings and Grounds Supervisor Tyler Tribelhorn and his team, who keep safety first in all of their work."

According to NJSIG, the Safety Grant Program was established in 2009 to promote proactive risk management and to provide funding to districts for such safety projects. "These grant awards continue a tradition of partnership between NJSIG and our member districts that can really contribute to the development of a strong safety culture in our New Jersey school district communities," states NJSIG. NJSIG is awarding a total of \$2.2 million in safety grants to member districts in 2016.




Hartley is often recognized from his role as the Secretary of the Treasury in seasons 2, 3 and 4 of



"There is something about the energy of a new school year that is so invigorating," says Superintendent Dr. Matthew Mingle, who addressed a nearly standing room only crowd at Warren Middle School on Sept. 1. Mingle, who began his tenure in Warren on July 1, acknowledged the dedication and hard work of all of the district's employees, many of whom were meeting him for the first time. 
