

# PURSUING A DREAM TAKES COURAGE

In 1929 Joe Imbriaco's attention turned to flying, telling the family he wanted to become an air mail pilot. The period of the late 1920s and early 1930s was the golden age of aviation and Joe wanted to be a part of it. But his dream was cut short.

Joseph W. Imbriaco was born on May 30, 1908 in Elizabeth, New Jersey. He was the son of Italian immigrants Giovanni (John) and Carmela Imbriaco. The Imbriacos were a working class family of nine brothers and sisters. Joe graduated from Battin High School which was a coed school in his day. Joe went to work for the Metals Disintegrating Company which had a plant in Union. The company was founded in 1916 by Professor Everett Joel Hall, who taught metallurgy at Columbia University and pioneered the production of metal powders. Professor Hall liked Joe's job performance and saw his potential, so he enrolled him part-time in chemistry courses at Columbia, with the company paying for his tuition. Joe was also an expert car and motorcycle mechanic.

He may have been influenced as a child by the stories of the gallant American fliers who soared over the battlefields of France in WW I downing German planes. These exploits were widely published in the newspapers, magazines, books and movies.

Another influence on Joe's interest in flying may have been the presence of the Standard Aircraft Company plant in Elizabeth. During WW I this company took over the large manufacturing complex of the John Stephenson Trolley Company to build military and air mail planes. The plant was located at the juncture of Bayway and Brunswick Avenues and employed over 1,000 at its peak.

The solo flight of Charles Lindbergh across the Atlantic in May 1927 was a stunning achievement in the early days of aviation. The widespread publicity may have further motivated Joe to try flying. There were some interesting parallels between Lindberg and Joe - both were mechanically inclined with an interest in cars and motorcycles, were attending college, and were only 20 when they started pilot training. And Joe may have really become hooked on flying if he took one of the joy rides in an open cockpit plane offered from nearby Newark Airport, which opened on October 1, 1928. Area airports posted promotional signs on roads that read: YOU WILL TOMORROW-WHY NOT TODAY? The tours were run by Captain John O. Donaldson, one of the most highly decorated WW I fliers. Donaldson purchased five Waco 10 biplanes in the late 1928 to early 1929 period and Joe started to take instruction from Donaldson.

Joe flew on Sundays, telling the family he would fly over their home on Reid St., and they actually saw his plane passing overhead. One night John Imbriaco begged his son to give up flying, citing recent accidents at Newark Airport, but Joe assured him there was nothing to worry about. The next day was Sunday, March 3, 1929, so Joe went to church and then drove to the airport for another flying lesson. His sister detailed her remembrances of the day in a letter to her nephew. She was ten years old at the time.

"I remember on Sundays my father, first thing in the morning, would go buy a large cheesecake for us. On that sad day, when Joe was leaving, he said to his mother in Italian "Mama, don't forget to save my piece of cheesecake". In the afternoon, she was in the kitchen, heard a knock on the door, and answered it. There were two men from Newark Airport who wanted to talk to her father. John and his oldest son Dominic came to the door and were shocked by the news that Joe was killed in a plane crash at noon while flying with instructor Peyton Schenck who also died. Carmela broke down crying. My brother Joe said my mother remembered that she and several other siblings had gone to the movies and received the dreadful news upon their arrival home. I remember my father asking me and Mary to go over to Anna's house and tell her what happened. We had no phone then. Can you picture me (10 years old) and Mary, 13 years old, walking up to Elizabeth Ave. and Broad St, and to Race St. where Annie and Fred lived with baby Eleanor, crying all the way!

Newspaper reporters came to the home seeking information about Joe. The story was published nationwide. Joe's body was recovered early Monday morning, March 4, 1929 after 15 hours of effort by the Newark Fire Department, which used extension ladders from the fire truck to bridge the marshy land. My father had to go to Engel's funeral home to identify Joe. We knew Joe had a tattoo of an Eagle on his right wrist, which my father saw. What a sad ordeal that was for him! The viewing was for three days! So many people came to our home.

After a funeral mass at St. Anthony's Church, Joe was laid to rest in the Elmwood section of the Rosedale Cemetery in Linden, New Jersey, where many Imbriaco family members have since been buried. The photograph of him in a flight jacket was placed in a glass oval imbedded in the tombstone. My mother kept his leather coin purse which had some coins, a miniature mechanic's wrench and a chain with a cross."

The cause of the crash was never determined. There was a life insurance policy on Joe but the company refused to pay because he was piloting a plane. Carmela suffered a long despondency over Joe's death.

He was a bright, ambitious young man, impressing the owner of the company he worked for, who was paying for his education at Columbia University. He may have become the first Imbriaco to graduate from college. We can only guess at what he may have accomplished if he had lived a normal life span and had a family of his own. But Joe had a spirit of adventure that many of us dream about but rarely carry out.

James "Jimmy" Malta passed away on Friday, October 8, 2010 at the age of 89. To me, he represented what makes Peterstown a great community, its high moral value system and code of ethics. No one embodied these qualities more than Jimmy Malta. He never strayed from those principles and applied them to every aspect of his life. What made him special was that he was so multi-dimensional.

It is difficult to express these concepts in a tangible way and so write about individual accomplishments, acts of charity, spiritual enlightenment and the like. It seemed to me that no matter what the theme of the story was I could have easily written about Jim.

Jimmy lived in The Burg his entire life. No one I've met knew more history of the neighborhood than he did; or the city; or the nation for that mater. Jim had an impeccable memory for all things great and small. He could speak about intricacies of world history and talk sports in equal depth. His love of baseball and the Yankees in particular was a source of joy.

Jim was truly part of the "Greatest Generation." After serving in World War II he returned home to The Burg and worked as a lab technician for General Aniline Chemical Company in Linden. He worked there 40 years before retiring in 1986.

From 1968 to 1993 Jim owned the immensely popular Malta's Luncheonette on the corner of Third Avenue and Centre Street, three doors from his home. It was a catchall for the entire neighborhood; breakfast, lunch and pinball.

Cross corner stood St. Anthony's Church where Jim and his wife Sarah (nee Renda) were active congregants. Jim was also a member of the Knights of Columbus Council 3310.

From '93 to his death Jim trekked across Third Avenue to Sacco's Butcher Shop where he developed a good following of neighborhood folks looking for breakfast and lunch. In no time Sacco's was the new Malta's, a place for a cup of coffee on the way to work and stimulating conversation.

The best part of coffee at Sacco's was watching Jim

interact with the gaggle of customers discussing current events and concepts of the universe. It was more like dinner theater. Jim had a great sense of humor, a sharp wit and vaudevillian timing. Though he played the violin he did not use it like Henny Youngman. Most times, to my amusement, his foils would be clueless to his antics.


There was serious business going on in the butcher shop also. John is the President of the Sons of Peterstown and is also involved in many functions at the church and with other organizations. The shop was also Central station for neighborhood news, deaths, births, weddings, etc. Jim absorbed every bit of news and filed it away. His knowledge was invaluable to me at times. If need be he would be able to identify a person in question as so-and-so's mother's brother' wife's niece. And give the history of the family going back to their immigration.

I've been publishing the Peterstown newspaper for 12 years with the intention of recording our oral history that would otherwise be lost. I also want to preserve the traditions of this great Italian-American community. I wanted the newspaper to be used as a reference for the values that were second nature to our forefathers but not so prevalent as the family base expanded.

Joe Spirito told me that Jimmy Malta was the first person to taste a Spirito's pizza pie. He was about 12 years old when they were first testing the ovens in 1932. This means nothing unless you actually had a slice of pie at Spirito's.

I can write about the virtues of growing up in The Burg but today's youth will not learn from reading the stories. Life lessons have to be experienced. I can tell you about the love between Jim and Sarah after 64 years of marriage but it would be a concept of love from the reader's imagination. To really experience what that love is you must be in their company.

And there lies the greatness of Peterstown. Learning how to do what's right from those who have done what's right. A piece of the "Good 'ol Days" is gone. My sadness from Jimmy's passing is for those who will never get a chance to know him. Anyone who spent time with Jim was blessed, I know I was.

# ST. A'S CLASS OF '70 CREATES SCHOLARSHIP

In 1970 there were about 15 Catholic Grammar Schools and also three Catholic High Schools in Elizabeth, N.J. Catholic school pupil enrollment was around 5,000 to 7,000 students at the time. Catholic churches were full every Sunday at all Masses. Each church had about four or five Masses on Sunday. Remember 9 o'clock Mass on Sunday was the school children's Mass!!

The City of Elizabeth is now down to two Catholic grammar (K-8 grade) schools and Mass attendance has dropped significantly. St. Anthony's Grammar School was recently combined with two of the last remaining grammar schools to form Our Lady of Guadalupe Academy (OLGA), at the Centre St. (Peterstown) location. Due to low enrollment and financial issues this has taken place beginning with the 2010-2011 school year. St. Anthony's Church / Parish is still functioning with the help of the remaining community of Peterstown and the new residents that have moved into the area.

The church is still associated with the Salesians of St. John Bosco, however the school is now operating with the help of the Order of St. Benedict (Benedictine) Sisters and many dedicated lay teachers along with the new principal, Deacon Joseph Caporaso. Deacon Joe is an alumnus of St. Anthony's and was born and raised in Peterstown. He is also an experienced educational administrator from the Elizabeth, NJ public school system. Many things have changed since 1970. Catholic education has experienced some major changes in Elizabeth and especially at St. Anthony's Grammar School. Thanks to many dedicated individuals the school is still a place where families and children can come to get a quality Catholic education.

This bit of information is to let people know how fragile and valuable the experience of a Catholic education has become. On October 15th, 2010, the first reunion of the 1970 Graduating Class of St. Anthony's Grammar School will take place. A proposal has been made to try to help the school by starting a scholarship fund that would serve as a memorial to the deceased members of the class. As of now it is known that at least 6 classmates have passed away. A 50-50 will be held during the evening of the reunion to jumpstart the




(above, 1-r) Anthony Yacek preparing to climb the stairs to the top of Bank of America Building in San Fransisco.


