

## UNICO IS A ONE OF A KIND ORGANIZATION

The dream to create an Italian American service organization to engage in L charitable work, support higher education, and perform patriotic deeds sparked the formation of UNICO. The name, in Italian, means unique. Placing service to the community before and above their own fraternity made the group one of a kind.

UNICO was formed in 1922 and has become the largest Italian American service organization in the United States. The group was formed in the wake of World War I when the Italian immigrant loyalty to America was in question. Even though Italian Americans accounted for twelve percent of the war's casualties the strong anti-Italian prejudice prevailed. lead organizer Dr. Anthony Vastola wanted to remove any doubt that the Italian Americans loved their adopted country first and foremost.

There are nineteen states with local districts and chapters. The Elizabeth New Jersey Chapter has been active fifty two years. Its track record for service is extensive. UNICO raises funds and redistributes them to local Elizabeth community service organizations. Members volunteer for these organizations and then pick a community service project to complete. Beneficiaries of UNICO support include: St. Joseph's Social Service Center, Center of Hope Hospice, St. Anthony's Church, Our Lady Of Guadalupe Academy, Arc of Union County, Kohler Development Center, and Community FoodBank of NJ. The local Chapters also support the national efforts such as battling Cooley Anemia. Academic scholarships are also awarded on an annual basis.

The ties that bind the group is an Italian ancestry. Preserving Italian traditions and culture is prevalent in everything the club does. Moreso, it tries to promote that culture by recognizing the contributions that Italians have made to this country. The Elizabeth Chapter holds an Annual Dinner Dance that honors a Citizen of the Year for their accomplishments and contributions. This year is the first time that the club has selected more than one recipient, in fact, it has chosen three brothers to honor.

Mike, Tom and Philip Colicchio have achieved a level of success in their respective fields. Each have their own brand of success but share the same sense of satisfaction. They also share a connection with Elizabeth rooted over three generations. They are, in their ways, ambassadors fo the city. UNICO chose them as 2015 Citizens of the Year because they exemplify the positive characteristics of Italian American culture. They embrace the Italian traditions that shaped the community in the Peterstown Section of Elizabeth - God, family and community.

The Colicchio brothers were born and raised on South Broad Street in Elizabeth, New Jersey. They are the sons of Thomas Patrick and Beverly Ann Corvelli Colicchio, and are the grandsons of Mike and Esther Corvelli and Felix and Olga Colicchio. The influence and inspiration provided by their parents, grandparents, wives, children, nieces, nephews, aunts, uncles, cousins, friends, colleagues and each other are immeasurable. Dad forged their competitive edge and outgoing side and Mom instilled in them the value of literacy, compassion, humor, cooking, and hard work. She's a confidante and friend to all three of her sons!

Mike, born in 1961, spent considerable time of his thirty year career living and working throughout North and South America, Europe, and Asia directing and managing financial programs.

Tom, born in 1962, has been a trend setting, world-renowned chef, restauranteur, food activist and television personality. He is Executive Chef and CEO of the Crafted Hospitality Group with eight restaurants and a sandwich chain. Tom has been awarded five James Beard Awards

and has won two Emmy Awards. As a founding director of Food Policy Action Group he frequently speaks on Capitol Hill for consumer rights. In 2012 he and his filmmaker wife, Lori Silverbush, produced and directed the

## Editor's Opinion

Some people say "You should have no regrets in life." That's hogwash. There are plenty of things that I regret and would do differently if I could. The deep feeling of remorse and regret is what makes us grow into a person and develops our conscience. The more profound the feeling, the more embedded the lesson.

No one is perfect and we all make mistakes. Some are lapses in judgement while others are deliberate bad behavior. There are plenty of both in my life and I was able to make amends in almost every case. Dismissing the instances of just plain stupidity, I have just a handful of regrets. Nothing serious in the last thirty years until now.

I regret not being present when I had to put my dog down. I left my wife Tina alone to handle the process. It was a devastating thing for her to have to do and worse for her to have to do it alone.

Neuman had been part of our family for 15 years. His health was slipping and Tina and I would have deep end-of-life discussions, but there was no definitive correct time to make the decision. We tried to do what was most humane. A wonderful veterinarian helped us to weigh both sides of the decision, or at least accept the decision. Of course, Tina was racked with emotion over the whole ordeal.

The doctor had a unique practice in that he came to our home and did the procedures on site. This gives the opportunity for the family to comfort their pet to the end. The appointment was made for noon on Saturday, September 12, 2105. That morning Tina took Neuman on one last walk. Tina made him hamburgers from Sacco's Butcher, then made him comfortable in his bed.

That morning I went to a funeral at 10:30 with the intentions of getting back by noon. I'm thinking every five minutes that I had enough time to make it back

home. I sat in the church, cell phone off, lost in the thought of the thirty-one-year-old family friend in the coffin. I'm thinking about losing my dog and just plain numb. When I exit the church I see that it was 12:06. My phone shows a dozen missed calls from Tina. I'm crushed but it doesn't compare to even a small fraction of how sad Tina was. I could not imagine her holding Neuman while he was being put to sleep and our daughter Angela helping to carry him to the car.

Part of the experience is that you get to be close to your pet to the end. I missed being with Neuman on his last day, but more importantly I missed being there for Tina. It is one of my biggest regrets for it was preventable.

I've got to check whatever guided my decision that morning. It's a flaw I experienced in the past but never to such a degree. Some times I think I'm emotionally cold, but this seemed just plain insensitive.

I regret not being there for Tina and missing the opportunity to give a proper farewell to Neuman.

#### FR. SESTO CELEBRATING 75 YEARS PROFESSED

On Saturday, September 19, 2015 (The Feast of San Gennaro) The Eastern province of the Salesians of St. John Bosco, celebrated the anniversaries of professions and ordinations of their order, the oldest of whom is Fr. Gennaro Sesto at 94 years old. Fr. Sesto was formerly pastor of Italian Ministry at St. Anthony's of Padua in the Peterstown section of Elizabeth, New Jersey. He honors his Italian heritage with 75 years of service and charity.

Gennaro Sesto was born in Biddeford, Maine on August 1, 1921. His parents who were born in Bitonto, Puglia, Italy, emigrated to the United States at the turn of the of 1900's and had 9 children. In 1935 Gennaro attended the Don Bosco High School, then the novitiate and afterwards the Don Bosco College in Newton, New Jersey. On September 8, 1940 Fr. Sesto made his first vows in the Salesian order of St. John Bosco. From 1946 to 1952 Fr. Sesto studied in Turin and was ordained July

2, 1950.

In 1956 Fr. Sesto received his Ph.D in Canon law at Catholic University in Washington DC. and taught Cannon law at the Salesian University in Turin and then in Rome

In 1963 he was appointed president and Dean of the Don Bosco College in Newton, New Jersey. After four years there he taught Cannon law at the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus Ohio where he was Dean of Academics. He returned to New Jersey in 1981 as Director of Don Bosco Prep in Ramsey, where he now lives.

Fr. Sesto served as provincial Secretary and Director of Lay missionaries in New Rochelle and Director of Shrine in Stony Point, New York. In 2002 he went to St. Anthony's saying mass in Italian until 2013. He continues to teach seminarians at Don Bosco Prep in Ramsey.

Carmela Mildred (Millie) Iscaro was born on September 27, 1915 in Elizabeth New Jersey and one hundred years later, she would be turning a century old in the same city as she was born in, but lets start her story from the beginning.

One hundred years ago, World War I was raging on in Europe while Millie Iscaro was just born to parents, Julia Maranico and Enrico Iscaro. As Charlie Chaplin was rising to fame, she was learning how to walk. Millie had three siblings, Joseph, Angelina, and Louis Iscaro now deceased. Millie Covino has seen a lot in her life. She has lived through two world wars, seventeen presidents, seen countries rise and fall, and countless other events and people in her one hundred years on this planet. Not many people today can say that they roared along with the crowds in the Roaring Twenties, but Millie can. She not only lived through it all, she thrived through the years as the proud Italian woman. Presently, at one hundred years of age, she is still living in the small apartment where she was born in Elizabeth. She still lives on her own, without assistance, a resilient golden woman. Her niece Rose and her son John help her with some chores but mostly to be in her company.

Millie loves watching old movies on TCM movie channel and still love ot sew. He apartment is a like a museum filled with memories and items she saved for decades, garments that she made, love letters from her husband predating the German invasion of Poland.







## Recipes

Submitted by Cafe Gallo, Edison. NJ

#### Chicken Scarpariello

#### **INGREDIENTS**

1/2 cup olive oil

2 1/2 lbs chicken, cut into small serving pieces

1 lb Italian sausage, cut into 1 inch pieces (sweet or hot, or both)

1 small red bell pepper, julienned

2 garlic cloves, minced and crushed

6 hot cherry peppers, sliced (bottled in vinegar)

1 onion, sliced

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/8 teaspoon fresh ground black pepper

1/4 teaspoon dried rosemary leaves, crushed

1 cup chicken broth (canned or fresh)

1/2 cup dry white wine (such as Pinot Grigio)

2 tablespoons all-purpose flour

1-2 teaspoons fresh lemon juice

2 potatoes, peeled and diced small

3/4 lb fresh mushrooms, sliced

#### **PREPARATION**

- 1) In a skillet heat oil. Add chicken and sausage in batches; brown on all sides, removing pieces to a plate as they brown.
- 2) Discard all but 2 tablespoons drippings from pan. To hot drippings, add the mushrooms, red bell peppers, sliced cherry peppers, onion, potatoes, and garlic; sauté until tender.
- 3) Return chicken and sausage to skillet.

  Add salt, black pepper, rosemary, broth, wine, and lemon juice. Bring to a boil; lower heat and simmer, covered, until chicken is tender, about 25 minutes.
- 4) Remove chicken and sausage from skillet; arrange on warm serving platter.
- 5) Skim fat from mixture in skillet.
- 6) In a small glass measure cup, mix flour with 1/4 cup water until blended. Stir into liquid in skillet, bring to boil, stirring constantly; boil for 1 minute, stirring, until mixture thickens.
- 7) Spoon sauce over chicken and sausage.

#### Rigatoni Bolognese

#### **INGREDIENTS**

4 carrots, chopped

4 celery ribs, chopped

1 white onion, chopped

2 tablespoons olive oil, to sauté

2 lbs ground beef or 2 lbs veal

2 cups red wine, chianti a must

1 (29 ounce) can crushed tomatoes, San Marzano is best Salt, to taste

Pepper, to taste

1 lb rigatoni pasta

Fresh parsley (to garnish)

#### **PREPARATION**

- 1) Pour olive oil into a pan. Add the chopped veggies and sauté until the celery softens.
- 2) Add ground beef or veal and sauté until meat browns.
- 3) Add your favorite red wine (the alcohol will be absorbed during cooking process).
- 4) Add the crushed tomatoes, salt and pepper to taste and allow this to simmer over low heat for at least an hour until sauce thickens.
- 5) Boil rigatoni in hot, salted water.
- 6) To plate the dish, put the rigatoni in a bowl, pour some sauce on top and garnish with some fresh parsley






