THREE MAKE ALL-STATE IN 2010

Peterstown has spawned three high school student athletes who earned first-team all-state honors for New Jersey in the same year. Christina Caravano achieved it for softball and Nico Steriti and Brandon Vitabile were named to the football squad. The achievement is so special the fact that there were three in one year is amazing.

The three high school seniors join a very elite group, the best of the best, drawn from thousands of others trying to achieve the same goal. The first-team all-state is a virtual team with players picked from across the sate to fill the limited number of positions. The criteria of being selected goes beyond talent, it includes commitment, work ethic and attitude. The honor is not arbitrary; a resume of statistics and achievements can easily substantiate the praise.

The achievement is a source of pride for the athlete and his or her family but it also goes beyond. The student's school, and coaches, teammates and classmates all share in the glory. Even the player's opponents can boast that they competed against such an athlete improving their own credentials.

The close-knit community of Petersown is proud when anyone of its children succeed. There is a unique bond between the families from the Elizabeth, NJ neighborhood that make the community feel like one big family every child is everyone's child. The feeling still exists even though a few generations have spread the branches beyond the physical boundaries of the streets and of the personal contact that was once prevalent. The bond still stems from the Italian American experience dating back one hundred years when the neighborhood was first settled by Italian immigrants.

Brandon Vitabile is the great grandson of Calogera and Emmanuel Vitabile, who lived on John Street, his grandfather is Steve and father is Pete. Brandon lives in Edison and attended Bishop Ahr High School. Brandon is 6'3" and just weighs 295 lbs. He's an offensive center with exceptional speed and strength. He also plays with an intenseness that cannot be ignored. Brandon was also a defensive lineman. With a 4.4 GPA and National Honor Society member, many universities would have loved to have him but he will be going to Northwestern University in Chicago in the fell.


Nico Steriti is the son of Vito and Josephine Steriti, both with roots in Peterstown. Josephine's maiden name is Sorce. Nico attends Toms River East where he plays tailback. At 6 feet, 200 lbs he is not only hard to tackle but hard to catch. He ran for 1,625 yards while breaking the school record for most career touchdowns with 46. He tied the season mark at 28. Five of the TDs came from receptions, he had 20 of those on the season for an additional 285 yards. Nico was an effective cornerback on defense.

Cristina Caravano grew up in Peterstown on Palmer Street. After moving she played softball at

Hunterdon Central Regional High School in Flemington, NJ where she rewrote the season record book by hitting 10 home runs, and registering 56 RBIs while maintaining a 650 batting average. On defense, Cristina was credited with 147 put-outs playing first and third base. Her accomplishments earned her Player-of-the-Year honors from the Courier News and Star Ledger newspapers. Her story becomes more remarkable when one considers that she tore her labrum at the end of the previous season and could not play through the summer and fall while rehabbing from surgery.

Peterstown celebrated when Anthony Candelino made first-team all-state in Baseball in 1985, while playing for Elizabeth High School. His accomplishment was noteworthy because his brother Benny also was part of that elite club as a baseball player in 1970.

Students raised by Peterstown families are consistently a source of pride for the community, scholastically, artistically and even through altruism. This year Brandon, Nico and Cristina showed what comes from dedication and hard work. They credit their parents for teaching them the values needed in being the best they can be. They will use these traits in college, in their careers and in raising their own families. Everyone in Peterstown will secretly be taking some of the credit.

The Valletese Club located on the corner of High Street and Fourth Avenue in the Peterstown section of Elizabeth, NJ has been re-energized in recent years by a new generation of members taking on the leadership roles. The new programs introduced by the club has promoted the Italian American culture that Peterstown has been known for.

Though the neighborhood is more ethnically mixed than previous decades, the Italian influence is still a dominant characteristic. The Valletese Club has worked to enhance that and has taken up the charge to preserve the traditions and introduce them to their next generation of Peterstown descendents.

For the last six months the club has been having a get-together that showcases the great aspects of growing up in the neighborhood. A majority of the people do not live in Elizabeth but do return to attend the events. What is most commendable is that the party is open to anyone, not just members of the club. So past residents are encouraged to attend and bring their friends and children along. Between 150 to 200 guests attend.

The evening features a DJ playing Italian music, dancing, and more food than can be consumed. All the labor and cooking is done by volunteers. The deserts are prepared by the Valletese Lady's Club and different people step up to cook an ever changing menu of Italian entrees and sides. A small charge of \$10 is imposed to cover expenses.

Conversations tend to turn towards reminiscing and sharing news of what is happening with each other's families. The youngsters in attendance get to hear some

interesting stories of their parents growing up in the Burg. They are always entertaining but more importantly they are educational. The event actually serves in passing down of the oral history that may otherwise be lost

Some of the old timers still share stories of my grandfather that I am hearing for the first time. His photo from a hundred years ago hangs on the wall with those of hundreds of men and women who have shaped my life.

I want my daughters to know how I derived the system of values and ethics that I try to instill in them. These Vallatese events give me that opportunity.







MEMORIES OF THE MALGIERI FAMILY AND LIFE ON FOURTH AVE

My Grandfather Alfred Malgieri came to America at the age of 14 from Vallata Italy in 1905. My Grandmother Raffela Esposito, from Fogia Italy, arrived when she was two. Grandpapa's parents were Luigi Malgieri and Philomena (Cornacchio) Malgieri. Grandma's parents were Ronald Esposito and Nuniata Lavano. They bore 8 children named Louie, Minnie, Josie, Nancy, Rocky, Rose and Alfred Junior., one other passed away early in life.

My mother was Josie who married my dad Angelo Mollozzi. They lived at 612 Fourth Avenue when I was born. The four family house was owned by the Malgieri, Piga and Veltre families. It was so much fun having such a big family around. The hallway doors were always open for friends and families to come and go. The building was warm and loving, someone was always there to talk to and share laughs with.

In the back yard, Dizi Pete Piga and grandpop had a

vegetable garden, chicken and pigeon coupe which was located under an old blueberry tree. There were fig and grape trellis's, and a well with a hand pump that was used to water everything in the garden!

Above all, "The Garage" was the place to be. The family turned the Garage into the greatest Italian kitchen that had a basketball court and a swimming pool beside it. So many fond memories were made in that garage. Family, friends, neighbors would gather there for the coffee, Petrillo's bread, great food, bingo, card games, singing, dancing, laughing and some passionate

The garage was the place to be, young and old. Even long after the youngsters grew up, got married and moved away, they would regularly meet at The Garage.

The generations that followed did not experience this type of comradery, and that's unfortunate. Instead of all their family members and friends being just ear shot away, they need to hop in a car and take a drive to go visiting or send an email.



FOURTH AVENUE MEAT MARKET

My maternal grandfather, Aurelio Sciscione, 19, left his home in a small town just south of Rome, Italy. Along with his brother Salvatore, they made their way to Naples. There, the two brothers boarded the U.S.S. Virginia and sailed to New York, USA.

Salvatore would become a cobbler, Aurelio a butcher. Eventually, Sal settled in the Philadelphia area. Aurelio settled in Elizabeth, NJ. There, Aurelio met a first generation Italian American named Theresa Cantello. They married and, over the next sixty-plus years, their union would produce 9 children (6 girls, 3 boys), 31 grandchildren and numerous great and great-great grandchildren.

Theresa's father loaned the newlyweds money to purchase a small parcel of land in Elizabeth. On that land, at 613 Fourth Avenue, the couple constructed a building which had a butcher shop on the first floor and living quarters on the upper level.

On the windows were letters stenciled in gold and outlined in red that read "Fourth Avenue Meat Market".

I was born in 1950, so most of my memories were from when I was 4 to 12 years old. By that time, my Uncle Bill had joined Pop in the running of the shop.

Customers were always greeted as they entered the shop, some in English, others in Italian. Frequently, Grandma would walk down the stairs and find a place to sit and chat. Grandma always amazed me by her ability to switch back and forth between Italian and English.

The customers were like an extension of our family. That was the magic of the shop, and of the neighborhood.

This was not unusual in Elizabeth, NJ during that time. There were Italian, Polish, Ukrainian, German, Irish and Jewish neighborhoods. Each section had its own cultural delicacies. I remember going with my father many times to the Jewish or German stores for "real rye bread" or the Swedish Delicatessen for potato

During the Depression many customers were short on cash. Pop would still fill their orders. He would tell them to pay when they were able. He told my grandmother that he could not bear to withhold food from neighbors who had children.

Pop's kindness and generosity were rewarded many times over. As the economy improved neighbors came in and paid him back. Each one kept a record of what was owed. Moreover, these families told their children about the kind butcher, Mr. Sciscione.


As the years passed, those children grew up and had their own families. Even if they moved out of the

neighborhood, they would return to the Fourth Avenue Meat Market to shop.

Pop retired and turned the shop over to my uncle Bill, his eldest son. People began moving to the suburbs and eventually, my uncle closed the shop. The building still stands, but no remnants of the shop are apparent.

Today the neighborhood is ethnically varied. Supermarkets swallowed up the mom and pop stores. It is rare, and precious, to find a traditional butcher shop.

He didn't have monetary wealth, but was rich in the things he valued most, family and friends. I think back and I realize that Pop truly lived the American dream. He came to this country, started his own business, owned property and saw his family prosper.





Porchetta Sandwich with a Fennel and Mustard Seed Slaw

PORCHETTA INGREDIENTS:

4 Italian sub rolls 5 cloves. Sliced Garlic 5 pounds Boneless Pork Loin 1 cup Olive Oil ½ cup Chopped Rosemary 2 tablespoons. Kosher Salt ½ cup Chopped Thyme 1 tablespoon Black Pepper ½ cup Fennel Seeds

PREPARATION:

In a dry pan over medium heat place the fennel seeds and toast until its very fragrant, take off the heat and ground in a spice grinder. Make a couple of slits in the pork loin and add some of the sliced garlic. In a small bowl combine the toasted fennel seed, rosemary, thyme, the remaining garlic, black pepper, salt and olive oil to make a paste. Rub all over the pork and marinate for at least 8 hours. Preheat the oven to 400 degrees. Place on the center rack and cook for 2 hours or when the temperature of the pork reaches 145 degrees. Remove the pork and cover with foil and let it rest for 30 minutes. Slice Very thin.

FENNEL AND MUSTARD SEED SLAW INGREDIENTS:

2 heads Fennel with Fronds 1 tablespoon Sugar 1 Red Onion 2 tablespoons Mayo ½ cup Whole grain mustard TT Salt ½ cup Olive Oil TT Pepper

½ cup Sherry Vinegar

PREPARATION:

Remove fronds from the fennel and reserve. With a mandoline or sharp knife, slice the fennel very thin remove the core. Repeat with the red onion. Place in a bowl with the remaining ingredients and toss to combine, season with salt and pepper refrigerate for 1 hour.

Cut the sub rolls in half and pile the sliced pork on the bottom, add some of the fennel slaw on top, drizzle with some extra virgin olive oil. Ready to eat.

Summer Squash Salad with Fried Squash Blossoms

SQUASH SALAD:

2 Medium Yellow Squash (Cut into ½ moons) ½ cup Basil (Chopped) 2 Medium Green Zucchini (Cut into ½ moons) 1 cup Olive Oil 1 cup Grape Tomatoes (Halved) 1 cup Lemon Juice 1 Red Onion (Sliced) 1 teaspoon Kosher Salt 2 cups Baby Arugula Leaves ½ teaspoon Black Pepper

PREPARATION:

In a bowl whisk together the lemon juice, olive oil, basil, salt and pepper and reserve. In a bowl combine the yellow and green squash, tomatoes, red onion and arugula. Toss with the reserved dressing.

ZUCCHINI FLOWER

12 Squash blossoms 1pinch Nutmeg 8 oz. Ricotta Cheese 1 teaspoon Kosher Salt ½ cup Parmesan Cheese 1 zest Lemon

½ cup Parsley (Chopped) 1 cup Pine Nuts (Toasted and Crushed) 1 Egg (Beaten)

1 ½ cups Olive Oil

BATTER

1 cup all-purpose flour ½ teaspoon kosher salt 1 cup chilled sparkling water

In a bowl whisk together all the ingredients. Refrigerate.

PREPARATION:

In a bowl combine the ricotta, parmesan cheese, egg, nutmeg, salt, lemon zest, parsley and pinenuts mix until its incorporated and the ricotta is smooth. Gently fill each blossom with about 2 teaspoons of the cheese filling.

In a heavy skillet, heat 2 inches of oil to 375 F over medium heat.

Carefully dip a stuffed blossom into the batter, covering the entire flower, and ease into the hot oil. Brown on one side, then turn to brown the other. Cook only a few at a time so they are not crowded. Remove with a slotted spoon and drain on paper towels. Repeat with remaining stuffed squash blossoms. Season with salt and pepper.

Serve 2 squash blossoms with a spoon full of the salad, sprinkle with parmesan cheese and serve.




