

ST. A'S HAS BEEN A FORCE FOR GOOD SINCE 1896

St. Anthony's Parish in the Peterstown section of Elizabeth, New Jersey, like that Of its founding families, is one of dedication to the highest ideals of Christianity and democracy. It is marked by lowly beginnings, hard work, and generous sacrifice.



As early as 1875, Italian immigrants, drawn by the prospect of steady jobs, came to Elizabeth in search for economic betterment. At first, the existing parishes of the little town were adequate for their spiritual needs, but, as their numbers grew, they sought a national parish of their own, with priests of their own mother tongue to guide them. In 1893, the first Italian families - the La Cortes, the Wades, the Nebiolas, the Di Gugliemos - banded together and were generously given the use of St. Michael's Chapel on Smith Street, for their devotions. A dedicated priest, Fr. Ernesto D'Aquila, came from Newark every Sunday to conduct services.



In spite of such humble beginnings, the Italian families looked forward to a real parish of their own and so began a development fund to support a resident priest and a church. Fr. Michael Karin, a handsomely bearded Arabian, became their first pastor in 1895. Speaking fluent Italian, beloved by children and adults alike, he became the center and rallying point of Italian Catholics. When he left for a new assignment in Connecticut in 1899, his successors, Fr. Francesco Cammerata and Fr. Antonio Falcone, found a closely knit and dedicated nucleus of a new parish.

The chapel on Smith Street kept shrinking every Sunday, and volunteers campaigned for further funds to build a new church. Though the young immigrant families were still struggling to set themselves up, they contributed enough to buy the German Methodist Church in their neighborhood; Mr. Matthew Wade furnished a personal check for three thousand dollars as a down payment. This was in 1903, and Fr.. Giovanni Bertolotto had offered his services to the Italian colony.

Sensing the people's generous loyalty to their Faith, Fr. Bertolotto bought off more lots on Center Street and 0f if Third Avenue, built an annex to the church to serve as a rectory, and even opened an orphanage for destitute

children under the care of the Sisters of Charity. The rapidly growing Italian community became a parish on December 27, 1905, when Fr. Bettolotto filed for corporation papers and all property was deeded over to the parish of St. Anthony of Padua. The new parish stood up to meet its responsibilities.

That same year, Fr. Bertolotto was transferred and succeeded by Fr. Givoanni Ferretti, who served his people as pastor for nine years. The little parish weathered the economic storms of the early nineteen hundreds and the pressures of World War I, but it bore its scars, too. Fr. Ferretti had been succeeded by Fr. Eucherio Giannetto in 1914. Both pastors served under adverse circumstances, and by 1923, the parish debt had risen to \$18,000. A pall of sadness fell upon the community. It needed a new life.

That life was found in the Salesians of St. John Bosco, to whom Fr. Giannetto entrusted the parish in 1923. The first Salesian pastor, experienced and dedicated, was Fr. Leonard Ruvolo, who immediately set his efforts to cleaning and redecorating the church, recalling both young and old to their religious duties, putting all the church's resources at their disposal, and rekindling in them the loyalty to the Faith which had marked their forefathers. His enthusiasm was catching. Within two years, the debt was paid off, and plans were made for further expansion. Even today, people recall Fr. Ruvolo's tireless efforts to urge his people to lofty ideals of Christian life.

The test of the parish's new vitality, Fr. Ruvolo urged, would be to erect a new church to replace the old, now inadequate and beyond repair. The response was overwhelming; Italians throughout the city joined forces and campaigned for funds. By April, 1926, plans had been drawn up by the Paul Cerrina Firm, contracts had been let, and, in August, Fr. Ruvolo broke ground for a new church. On November 28 of that year, Monsignor John A. Duffy, later Bishop of Buffalo, New York, laid the cornerstone. A year after, on November 6, 1927, at a Solemn Pontifical Mass, the edifice was dedicated to Divine Service by the Most Reverend Pietro Fumasoni-Biondi, Apostolic Delegate to the United States.



Seating over 700, the new St. Anthony's Church, of Romanesque design, thrusts its seventy-foot steeple into the sky and is a landmark of Faith for the Italian people of Elizabeth.

Fr. Leonard Ruvolo died at the age of 49, on December 28, 1932, after a life of heroic zeal for God's Church and His people. St. Anthony's Church became a force for good in the City.

I grew up on Cameron Place in Elizabeth, where the new Elizabeth High School is now located. I was wondering if any photographs exist of my old neighborhood?

The neighborhood consisted of South Street up to Battin and St. Mary's High School, Pearl Street around to St. Elizabeth Hospital and Broad Street (now Trinitas).

I lived at 615 Caron Place, which was a dead end consisting of approximately 12 homes. Behind the dead end was Rector Street. There was an abandoned brewery, Breidt's, near Pearl and Rector Streets.

The dirt was so rich my father's and the other men in the neighborhoods gardens flourished and were lush. My father and our neighbors used to kid around about who had the biggest and best tomatoes. I think my father's beefsteak tomatoes took the prize. He had a green thumb. Cow manure was his secret!

The Board of Education took the property in the early to mid 1970's. Sure would like to see some pictures of my street while the homes were still there. There were a lot of great memories there.

My father also had a parking lot behind City Hall for many years where a few old time jazz musicians like Duke Ellington used to park when they played at the Ritz Theater on East Jersey Street. That was many years ago, though.

You may be too young to remember me, but I've known your family many years. I went to Saint Anthony's School and graduated 8th grade in 1971. I'm Tony & Lena Giuliano's niece. My grandmother's house used to be on 4th Avenue as well. I grew up in their houses, between High Street and South Seventh Street, across the street from Petrillo's Bakery and the Lemon Ice Store.

Editor's Opinion everybody has one - this is mine - by Joe Renna

The rituals of my religion had me perplexed; and I had 12 years of Catholic schooling. I could not imagine how others could understand the significance of the ceremonies and the lectures without a Phd in theology. It took me years beyond high school to really grasp the intricacies of my religion. The key was to find out what they ment to me.

Catholics run the spectrum from those who follow a literal interpretation of the scriptures and ceremonies to those who understand them as being symbolic. What seems amazing is that for over two billion Catholics in the world no two individuals worship in the same way, or, as I discovered, need to. I always felt that those who took the word literally were missing something, but I came to realize that I should not have been judging them on how they worship but instead on how they lived. Understanding the mysteries of divine grace is not necessary to live in the grace of God. This was a life lesson learned where I saw even the most religious types forget everything about loving their neighbor if there is a buck to be made.

It is the message that is important, pure and simple -Love thy Neighbor. It is possible to live a life loving thy neighbor but history has shown that without spiritual guidance the evil side of human nature can reek havoc. So religions develop a systems that teaches right from wrong.

As Catholics we use the teachings of Jesus Christ to show us the way. Accepting what he had to say and doing what he preached is our daily challenge. Some times the right thing is the hardest choice to make. That's when we could use some devine intervention.

Critics of the church miss the challenge that world wide religions face. The church must minister to all cultures of the world, from metropolises to farm villages, yet keep the basic tenets intact. Beside the accommodations of local customs, it is amazing how little the rituals change from culture to culture. It is even more impressive that the church has maintained its structure for 2000 years.


The new challenge is for the church to keep up with technology, more so, to stay relevant in today's culture. It has become easy to dismiss the church's teachings because they are steeped in traditions and history that is

no longer taught. There was a time when spirituality was the first lesson in the home. Raising a good person was more important than raising a good earner.

As people get more sophisticated in understanding nature, they are less inclined to feel a need for developing spiritually. There is less need for interpersonal relationships. People became more superficial when it comes to communities. The emotional investment of being neighbors no longer exists. Right and wrong has less to do with helping or hurting someone else and all to do with "What would benefit me."

It seems that the people who criticize the church are the ones who can benefit the most from its teachings. They end up sounding ridiculous because they built a huge intellectual argument against how the church operates and seem unable to grasp the significance of the actions. For instance, the sanctity of life is the most basic concept embraced by Catholics, but the concept is never included in scientific discussions concerning life issues. It is more convenient to leave it out. The Church is a threat to anyone looking to avoid facing their own conscience when choosing right from wrong. The choices are really simple: Choose good over evil, choose love over hate, choose others over yourself.

The Pope just released his Ten Commandments for cars. This may be his attempt to get through to these jetset, book-smart, pseudo-intellectuals who can only see things literally.


The high light of the morning was the recognition of the two council members who reached a milestone of 50 years. Stanley Wenks and Pete Renna joined the



Tequila's Grill is located is an odd spot on Pearl Street in Elizabeth, NJ. It is centrally located, walking distance form the Union County Courthouse, and Trinitas Hospital. Aside form a full menu of mixed cuisine, Spanish, Mexican and Italian, Victor plans and prepares dishes based on availability of quality meat and fish. Together with his brother Ruben and chef Jesus, he offers exquisite options every day.

There is another surprise at Tequila's and that is the service at the bar. As the name suggests, a lot of care is put into preparing cocktails. From a variety of sangrias to their freshly made "Pilon" the drink selection matches the menu perfectly.

The easiest way to get to Tequila's is to drive to the end of Rahway Avenue and bear right under the train trestle. The restaurant will be the first building on the right. Rahway Avenue in Elizabeth is a continuation of St. George's Avenue in Linden. There is usually parking available on the street but Tequila's has its own off street parking. Tequila's kitchen is open seven days a week 11am to 11pm and until midnight on weekends. (right) Claudia Zuluaga of Tequila's Grill stands before the ingredients to make Mojitos.







1903 was located in St. Michael's chapel on Smith Street. This marks the humble beginning of our parish. Fr. Michael Karin, an Arabian priest that spoke fluent Italian was

the first one to take care of the "little flock." We are forever grateful to our neighboring parish, St. Michael's for giving us a start.



The second Church 1903 1927 was a wooden

structure, an abandoned German Methodist Church on Centre Street, it was purchased in 1903 by Fr. Giovanni Bertolotto. We became an official Parish on December 27, 1905, under the name of St. Anthony of Padua. Here

the new parish was directed by Fr. Giovanni Ferretti for nine years and then by Fr. Eucherio Giannetto until 1924. The Church structure was kept as a church hall until 1956 when it was demolished to make room for our present school building.

The coming of the Salesians -1924 Fr. Leonardo Ruvolo arrived with some Salesians on December 8, feast of the Immaculate Conception, and set to the task of paying off the

"huge" debt he had found here. That done in short order, Fr. Ruvolo challenged his people to erect a new Church worthier of God and the swelling ranks of Italian immigrants. The

difficulties of this enterprise were only surmounted by the tough fiber of the young Pastor and his Salesian Confreres.

St. Anthony's new Church first came under scrutiny in the architect's rendering here reproduced. Paul Cerrina's plans were approved quickly and the corner stone was laid in

St. John Bosco, founder of the

Salesians, was canonized in 1934, two years after Fr. Ruvolo's death in New York City. But other Salesians had succeeded him, like Fr. Ceasar Rinaldi who served as pastor from 1933 -1938. He followed the brief stay of Fr. Zolin 1931 - 1933. To commemorate Don Bosco's Canonization in Rome,

Fr. Ceasar erected a beautiful statue which still graces our Third Avenue site. Fr. Ceasar organized classes for the young and parish societies for young and adults.

succeeded Fr. Ceasar in 1939 and served for nine years as Pastor until 1948. During the years of World War II when he held the people together in faith and patiently nibbled away at the huge debt. The mortgage was burned in 1944

The school was dedicated September

In 1961 the Rectory and in 1963 the Convent were added. Such was the momentum of the early sixties, that contractors never left the premises. In a short time both buildings were paid in full during the brief pastorate of Fr. A.J. Louis 1963 - 1967. An outstanding organizer and administrator, Fr. Louis consolidated the finances and left the parish solvent. He returned to his beloved South America Missions where he still serves.



Rev. August Bosio (Pastor 1967-1975)

The new Pastor, Fr. August Bosio, came in 1967 and during the decade here formed a team of six Salesian Priests. Fr. John Murphy found a fertile field in the care of the hospitals and the Hispanic population. The shut-in's, elderly and the Italians fell to the care first of Fr. Brice and then to Fr. Bordin. Fr. Anthony

Bregolato retired here after serving as pastor. Fr. Dominic Di Guardo was in poor health and dedicated his time to the parish office. Fr. Frank Kelly headed the youth work in school and C.Y.O. He also served as Pre-Cana coordinator.



Rice Balls

INGREDIENTS

1 lb. Carolina Rice
 1/2 sticks butter softened
 1/4 cup parsley
 3 eggs hardboiled
 3 eggs uncooked
 1 small package of mozzarella
 1/4 lb thick ham or 1/4 lb thick salami
 1 1/2 lbs. plain bread crumbs
 1 cup grated Parmesan cheese
 Salt and pepper to taste
 Vegetable oil

PREPARATION:

- 1) Cook rice as directed Do not over cook
- 2) Cut mozzarella, salami or ham, and hardboiled eggs into 1/4 inch chunks
- 3) Drain rice well
- 4) Meanwhile beat together egg whites and yolks with butter, grated cheese, parsley, salt and pepper
- 5) Add drained rice to mixture
- 6) Take a portion of rice in hand and flatten slightly, place a piece of ham or salami, mozzarella and hardboiled egg in center then shape into a ball
- 7) Roll rice ball in breadcrumbs
- 8) Deep fry until golden brown

Makes 18 rice balls

Fried Zucchini Flowers

INGREDIENTS

 l egg
 teaspoon olive oil
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 1/4 teaspoon black pepper
 1/2 cups flour
 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
 1/2 cup warm water
 1/4 cup parsley chopped
 1/2 cup sail chopped
 1/2 cup grated cheese
 20 zucchini flowers washed and chopped.
 (Keep in water until ready to use, shake water off and add to mix, do not dry.)
 Vegetable oil for frying

PREPARATION:

- 1) In a medium bowl, beat eggs lightly.
- 2) Add olive oil, warm water, slat, pepper, baking powder, basil, parsley and grated cheese.
- 3) Gradually add flour and mix until the consistency of a smooth pancake batter.
- 4) Add chopped flowers and mix well. Add more water to flour if need. Let stand for at least 30 minutes.
- 5) Heat oil in a large skillet.
- 6) When the oil is very hot drop a teaspoon of mixture into oil, careful not to crowd. Fry on both sides until lightly golden.
- 7) Drain on paper towels.

About 50 years ago, two little boys, one from Center Street and the other from 4th Ave somehow found each other and started playing together. From that time until this, a lifelong bond of friendship, family and love has come to pass. And it will not end now or ever.

Our memories of Alby, (we always called him that because his dad is Al) will be with us always, and they help to console us now in this time of sadness and grief.


We always seemed to find trouble...like the time when we were about 8 years old and the dirt road of High St. was being paved. Even then Alby liked machines, and as we played on the steamroller, he said he could start it. And of course he did. We ran away and left it running until it ran out of fuel. We didn't know how it happened when my father asked us about it.

His mechanical ability was evident even when he was a boy. One time he had just fixed up an old English race bike, especially the handbrakes. Then we went for a test ride, coming down Dairy Queen hill only the front brakes worked and he went head first over the handlebars. He walked home with his front teeth in his hand.

My mother loved Alby like another son. He was always welcome in our home and my father enjoyed having him eat over and come along on our weekly summertime trips to Keansburg on Saturday nights.

There was one time however when my mother's welcome turned into a torrent of hammer-like blows with a pair of drumsticks. He always liked guns and one day he his '59 Dodge that Alby's grandfather gave him. And a found his father's pistol and brought it over to show me. We set up a shooting gallery in my cellar using my mom's pots and extra dishes as targets. We were shooting away when suddenly Alby grabbed his forehead after firing a shot and went down holding his head.

As he stood up and took his hand away, the blood was running down his face. I ran out of the cellar and called my mother to tell her that Alby shot himself. When she got to him she saw that he wasn't shot at all but that the slide of the ancient gun has blown off and hit him in the head, causing the tiny cut that was bleeding so profusely. She grabbed whatever was handy (in this case it was a pair of drumsticks) and proceeded to beat the daylights out of both of us, even though Alby was still bleeding like family that Alby found pride and happiness. a stuck pig. Then she called Mr. Rugani and he came over with a hammer, which he thankfully used on the gun and saved his belt for Alby and me.



He never got stopped making all those trips to the icehouse.


A WIN THAT GOT AWAY
