



HONOR VETS FOR SELFLESS SACRIFICE

The number of American soldiers killed in Iraq is approaching 2,000. In addition to this, there is well over 14,000 that were wounded in action. These men and women will carry the scars of this war with them the rest of their lives. Attention must be payed to their plight as well as the vets of past wars.

Those who payed the ultimate price leave behind grieving families, their lives forever changed with the loss of a loved one. They suffer with their memory of the soldier and thinking of how things could be. The men and women who return from war having been wounded are also suffering. The pain is not always physical, it may be psychological or emotional.

When the wounded return they must adjust to life with the burden of their injury. Sometimes that path is too difficult to travel alone. Society has an obligation to assist these veterans. Their sacrifice is what allows the society to exist as it is.

Regardless of our personal ideology on the justification of America's military actions, the reality is that our soldiers are in the thick of it. There are many veterans organizations doing their best to help their brethren, but, no matter how hard they try it is not enough, considering that over 670,000 soldiers were wounded in World War II alone. Followed by the wars and conflicts over the past 60 years, including the present war on terror, the number of combat wounded veterans is countless. Most of

One organization dedicated specifically to the combat wounded veterans is the Military Order of the Purple Heart. Their mission is to foster an environment of goodwill and camaraderie among combat wounded veterans, promote patriotism, support necessary legislative initiatives and, most importantly, provide service to all veterans and their families.

The Commander for the Union County chapter of the organization is Anthony LaFarrara. LaFarrara is originally from the Peterstown section of Elizabeth, NJ and now lives in Cranford. The headquarters for his organization is housed in the local Elks Club in Cranford. The Elks Club is also very dedicated to the cause of helping veterans and have generously supported LaFarrara's organization.

There is a need to get the message out to veterans that there is help. One of the biggest problems the organizations have is finding those who could use their services but don't have the wherewithal or resources to find the help. It is up to family, neighbors and friends to recognize those in need and assist them in contacting one of the veterans organizations.

Mr. LaFarrara would like to reach anyone who is a recipient of a Purple Heart. He could be reached at 908-276-2714. There are organizations for different aspects of veteran services, in virtually every town. The first step is to make contact. Sometimes that is all the help that is needed.

Veterans of WWII are now in the twilight of their years and some are alone. Companionship can be a cure for what ails them. And though it seems like a small gesture, a simple thank you may make a world of difference.

Whatever Simone did to help us, or to help so many others, he did quietly and without recognition. He did not


seek high profile accolades for his generosity and he didn't receive them.

Thanks so much for sharing the New York Times article about DiCosmo's Lemon Ice Stand. As a Peterstown transplant to the Los Angeles area, I never fail to revisit DiCosmo's whenever I'm in Elizabeth during the summer months. That's because the entire ambience of Peterstown continues to feed my nostalgia for a happier time that was.

I was born in Elizabeth in 1945 and lived there until 1952 when my family migrated to California. I can remember walking with my grandmother from John Street to DiCosmo's for lemon ice in the days before styrofoam cups when the lemon ice was served in a pleated paper cup and probably sold for five cents. Every year, while she was able, my grandmother and I would stop by DiCosmo's for lemon ice whenever we visited her and Peterstown during the summer.

Now I've begun my own tradition of strolling through Peterstown, whenever I'm in the area, which is usually twice a year, just to recapture the fond memories of my time there. Although much has changed, no more hot dog cart at the market, or Sutera's Grocery, or Saraceno's Bakery, much still remains of the past. St. Anthony's Church, Spirito's and, of course, DiCosmo's reflect a time when living in Peterstown meant living Italian.

Now as the area becomes more and more diverse, it's still a pleasure to see the past mixing with the present in a positive way. And even as the cultural traditions of more recent immigrants to Peterstown are taking hold there, it's wonderful to see that the heritage of its past culture is still respected and revered by everyone for whom Peterstown was, is, and in many ways, always will be home.

With the bombardment of recent catastrophes people are being forced to choose where to direct their aid. The biggest challenge is making a conscious decision that one person's suffering is more important than another's. For the compassionate person the choice can lead to the point of depression.

The casualties of recent catastrophes are being measured by the thousands, even tens of thousands. The Tsunami in Asia effected millions of people, over 200,000 died. The U.S. was hit by a series of hurricanes displacing entire cities. News of the 7.6 earthquake that hit Pakistan killing almost 20,000 shared headlines with a mud slide in Guatemala that wiped out a village. Millions of people are now in need of assistance. The challenge may seem insurmountable, and for any one individual it is. The idea that one little contribution will make no difference is not accurate and people should not be discouraged from contributing. What may seem as a small gesture looms large in the eyes of the recipient.

The success of relief efforts is a result of focusing a little bit of help from many sources onto one problem. In this way, the resource does not dry up and multiple problems can be addressed.

Our choice for giving should be what satisfies us the most. Suffering is a constant. It will always exist. It is not something that will ever be conquered and go away. Our only goal is to minimize it. In satisfying your own need to help someone you will perpetuate your desire to do more. Don't think by helping one cause you are slighting another. Rest assured that the passion you have to help your cause is equal to someone's support of another.

All humanity is interconnected and the help given to

one cause becomes fluid and is felt globally.

For instance, the local food banks have sent resources to New Orleans, but the need to service local families still exists. Helping the local food bank with the strain of maintaining their local service will benefit those suffering across the country.

There are so many facets of human services that are in need of assistance and they are all intertwined, from the local to global scale. Finding the level where you are most effective is the best way to give. That level should be reflective of the amount of resources you have to give.

As far as choosing a cause, there is no bad choice. When the result is the relief of someone's pain and suffering, everyone benefits When one segment of the population suffers, the entire community suffers.

There is more than enough resources to go around that can make a significant difference to those living in poverty and despair. The problem is that the majority of those in control of the resources must make the commitment to help those in need.

Autism is a complex brain disorder that often inhibits a person's ability to communicate, respond to surroundings, and form relationships with others. First identified more than 50 years ago, autism affects people of all racial, ethnic and socioeconomic backgrounds.

Autism, a vexing brain disorder, remains largely a mystery. Researchers still don't know what causes it, nor do they know how best to treat a condition that prompts one child to stop speaking and another to memorize movie scripts. With a tenfold spike in numbers over the past 20 years, 1 in every 166 children is now diagnosed with an Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)-researchers, advocacy groups and the government are racing to improve the lives of children and their families, many of them emotionally and financially drained.

Few disorders are as devastating to a child and his or her family. While some people with autism are mildly affected, most people with the condition will require lifelong supervision and care and have significant language impairments. Many children with autism will never be able to tell their parents they love them. An intellectual thief, autism infiltrates children's brains, stalling or stealing cognitive and social development. A child once bursting with potential finds spinning tops more captivating than her mothers smile.

Currently, the causes of autism are unknown and there are no specific medical treatments or cure. The diagnosis of autism is based solely upon observations of behavior. Despite increasing national interest and high prevalence, autism research is one of the lowest funded areas of medical research by both public and private sources.

In just eight years, NAAR has committed an astounding \$21 million to fund biomedical Autism research projects worldwide. NAAR has also been active in advocating for increased government funding for research through the (NIH), and other government agencies and keeps its supporters informed about research efforts through both narrative and its electronic newsletters.

The picnic, like always was well attended by members, neighbors and families. The setting was a perfect place to discuss the future plans of the site and to share the excitement.



I was down a pawn early and lost a piece on move 13. I thought I played brilliantly to pull out a win. The reality, as pointed out by my high school classmate, Greg Tomkovich, is that I played pretty poorly and my opponent played worse. Greg wrote this quick analysis of the game. He was being very kind.

Notes by Greg Tomkovich


Both players made some significant errors in the game, but they played with a lot of energy. Black missed the opportunity to play 13 ... Qd4! after Nxe5, White missed that 19 Nxc5! was far better than Bxc5. Black's last error was 34 ... Qb4? (better is Rxe3), but the final error was made by White 38 Bd6?? (g3 makes an escape square for the King with a very good game).

The saying, "The player who makes the next to last

mistake wins," held true for this game. An important lesson to be learned is that even if you are behind, don't give up hope, you may yet pull victory from the hands of defeat.


(right) Greg Tomkovich, a "Chess Bully" in high school, picks on classmate Rich Wischusen after beating Curt Mohr for his lunch money.



TONY ESPOSITO'S MAGIC GARDEN

Few gardens are more productive than that of Tony Esposito. His scientific approach and meticulous care of his garden reaps an unbelievable amount of produce from such a small area. His garden is about three feet wide and wraps around three sides of a 20 foot square lawn.

Tony grows three types of tomatoes, three types of peppers, three types of lettuce two types of cucumbers, along with beans, basil and, of course, cocozza, which he labels "bats".

There's really no magic involved in his success, just a tremendous amount of knowledge and experience that came from years of perfecting what his father taught him. In the 1930's, Tony's father, Costantino, had a permit to garden on land owned by the City of Elizabeth. Lots about one block in area were mapped out in the south end of



Not for Nothing But...

I traded a goose that laid golden eggs for a handful of magic beans. Peterstown between Third and Fifth Avenues, and from Loomis Street to Butler Street. Now the Turnpike has claimed most of the land. Gardeners would dig their own wells on their parcels, tend to the vegetables and sell what they didn't eat at the market.

Tony knows every nuance of his plants and soil. He rotates the crops each year to balance the nutrients in the soil. Everything he grows comes from seeds that he prepares from previous seasons of growing. All his seeds are bagged and labeled, the variety seems endless.

Tony jars some veggies like peppers, but mostly gives everything he grows away, something that has become a tradition for many of his friends, and no matter if it is one of high bred tomatoes or grapes from his 20 year old vine, the taste is never disappointing.








Parental digression is advised

When there are not enough bees to pollonate Tony Esposito's cocuzza, a long sicilian sqash, he becomes the goomba and helps them along. Some gardeners take a small paint brush to swipe the male flower's stamen, which produces the pollen, and then brushes the female flower's stigma. The pollen is mixed with the ovum and that is how baby cocuzzas are born.

There is still no guarentee that the mating will stick so Tony actually uses a bondage method to put the two love flowers together. He marries the male and female flowers together




