The Cranford Family Care Association is celebrating 80 years of service to the Cranford community. Founded in 1936 as a response to the Great Depression, Cranford Family Care's philosophy is one of neighbors helping neighbors. It provides short-term, emergency assistance to families living in Cranford. The most common form of assistance is help with rent, mortgage payments and utilities. Assistance can take the forms of monetary contribution or a donation of food from its pantry located at 61 Myrtle Street in Cranford.

With generous financial and in-kind support from many residents, businesses, places of worship, schools, and likeminded organizations, each year Cranford Family Care ensures that families are able to stay in their homes, feed their families, and have access to the basic necessities. During the holiday season, special meals and gifts are provided to our families through the generosity of others. The CFC has been blessed with many kind partners to ensure this Christmas is filled with joy by providing toys, books, and clothing. Gift cards are a welcome donation that can be given to our older children.

A special note of gratitude is extended to Project Home for our housing funding and to the Cerebral Palsy League of Cranford and Jardine Academy for our office and storage space partnership. This, and the help of many volunteers, ensures that the greatest percentage of donations goes directly to those in need. More than 92 cents of every dollar contributed makes a difference in the lives of those in crisis.







END OF YEAR TAX PLANNING CONSIDERATION FOR DIVORCING COUPLES

As the end of the year approaches, many of us will be inundated with television, newspaper and magazine reports regarding endof-the-year tax planning measures one can take to reduce your tax obligation. For those individuals who are in the midst of divorce proceedings, planning to be divorced before the end of the year, or are already divorced, there are often tax implications which need to be considered.

CELEBRATING OUR 62nd YEAR

For those individuals who are planning to be divorced before the end of this calendar year, you should know that your filing status for 2016 will change as a result. It does not matter whether you get your divorce completed on January 1, 2016 or December 31, 2016, or any date in between, for the tax year 2016 you are considered to have been divorced for the entire year. If this applies to you it will generally limit your filing status for 2016 to either single or head of household (if you otherwise qualify). Your filing status can have serious financial implications.

The funds a divorcing or divorced spouse receives or pays may be includable as income or deductible as support. But not all funds paid or received qualify. You are permitted to deduct alimony paid to a spouse or former spouse if it is paid under the terms of a divorce judgment or Court Order or separation Agreement, and this is true regardless of whether or not you itemize deductions on your U.S. tax return. It must also be noted that: (1) voluntary payments made which are not set forth in a divorce judgment or separation Agreement are not deductible; (2) payments which exceed the amount stated in a judgment or Agreement are not deductible; (3) the alimony received by a spouse or ex-spouse is income in the year they receive it, and; (4) payments designated as child support are never deductible to the parent who pays the support or taxable income to the parent who receives it.

Agreements which distribute marital property at the conclusion of a divorce generally do not have income tax consequences. But sometimes there are exceptions and the specific language contained in these Agreements should provide guidance in such circumstances. Some examples are when pension or other retirement accounts are divided or when a decision needs to be made regarding who will claim property tax payments and the mortgage interest deduction on future separate tax returns.

Lastly, the issue of which parent can claim a child as a dependent on a tax return should always be set forth in a divorce Settlement Agreement. In most instances, it is the custodial parent's right to claim the child as a dependent. The custodial parent is the person with whom the child actually lived for the greater number of nights during the year. However, the right to claim the child or children can be allocated differently in a Settlement Agreement when both parents agree. Parents are even permitted to alternate the dependency exemption or divide the number of children each will claim.

FAMILY FUN WITH JAMES AND THE GIANT PEACH, THE MUSICAL



Roald Dahl's fantastical tale of a boy, his insect friends, and their amazing journey across the ocean on a giant peach of fruit is a musical for the whole family to enjoy! When James is sent by his conniving aunts to chop down their old fruit tree, he discovers a magic potion which results in a tremendous peach - and launches a journey of enormous proportions. Suddenly, James finds himself in the center of the gigantic peach among human-sized insects with equally oversized personalities. After the peach falls from the tree and rolls into the ocean, the group faces hunger, sharks and plenty of disagreements. Thanks to James' quick wit and creative thinking, the residents learn to live and work together as a family. The dangerous voyage is a success, but the adventure takes a whole new twist once they land on the Empire State Building.

The Cranford Police Department received a donation of \$5,000.00 from the Cranford Knights of Columbus Council 6226. The entire donation will be used to offset the costs of body armor for Cranford Officers. All sworn officers are issued body armor at an expense of close to \$1,000 per officer. The body armor needs to be replaced at regular intervals due to manufacturer guidelines.

Chief Wozniak said the following about the donation: "The Cranford Knights of Columbus has been a devoted supporter of the men and women of the Cranford Police Department. As an organization we are committed to the safety of all of our officers. In these times, far too many officers in this country are being killed on almost a daily basis. We have to take every precaution to make sure our members go home at the end of their shifts. The cost of equipping our members with body armor is sizeable, but as far as I'm concerned, a small price to pay to help ensure their safety. The generous donation by the Cranford Knights of Columbus will help us keep five of our officers safe for years to come."



Sally founded Cranford's first Young Athlete Program, which introduces and develops skills for future Special Olympics. She is also a coach with Special Olympics for the New Jersey Hawks. Sally was a committee person for Autism Speaks, "Walk Now For Autism" for many years as well as founder, captain and top fundraiser for the community team "Cranford Cares for Our Kids". She also participates and was a top fundraiser for the National Down Syndrome's "Buddy Walk of South Plainfield. She has been directing Cranford's special needs talent show, "An Evening of Shining Stars" for the past four years. In 2016, the event raised \$4,000 which was donated to the ARC of Union County. Another proud accomplishment of Sally, along with her husband and two teenage children was producing "What's On Your Mind: Let Me Inside", a song devoted to families raising a child with autism.

Kathleen Murray

Kathy currently serves as president of the Hanson Park Conservancy (HPC). She oversees the programming, maintenance, and fundraising with the help of an active Board of Trustees. Kathy is also a member of the Cranford Environmental Commission (CEC), writing several successful grant applications that provided funds for the rain garden at the Municipal Building. She serves as the CEC representative to the Planning Board. Kathy oversees Eagle Scout Projects and has guided several Cranford boys to attain the Eagle Scout rank.

Todd Sweeney

From a young age, Todd was a volunteer in Cranford. For many years, he played the role of "Ralph the Elf" next to his father who serves as the Chamber's Santa Claus at Christmas time. Todd was also very involved with the Cranford First Aid Squad as an EMT/Instructor. He is in the National Honor Society helping to tutor freshmen who needed help with English in order to be eligible to play lacrosse. Todd is the 2016 Unsung Hero Award Recipient which was presented to him by the Union County Board of Education in recognition for his service to his school and community.

H. Edward Davenport



86 YEAR OLD RESIDENT WINS MEDAL AT 5K

Cranford's 86-year-old long-time resident, Margaret Collins (known to friends and family as Vera), completed the Fall 5K to support the PTA's of Bloomingdale Avenue and Orange Avenue Schools in Cranford on November 6th. This was Vera's first 5K race and she was joined by her 2 daughters, Veronica Collins of Cranford and Eileen Collins of Scotch Plains, as well as 2 of her 6 grandchildren, Meghan Lamar of Cranford and Artemis Collins of Scotch Plains. The 3 generations walked the race together which was a USA Track and Field Certified 5K race that started at Bloomingdale Avenue School at 8:30 a.m. Top finishers in each age group received a medal and Vera came home with the top female finisher in the 70+ age group.

Vera was born in County Cork, Ireland and grew up outside a small village known as Ardgroom Village in the SouthWest region of the country. She was one of 14 children and immigrated to the United States at the age of 21 along with one of her brothers. Ultimately, 9 of her siblings also immigrated here. Vera married Jeremiah Collins in 1956 and they raised their four children in Brooklyn, NY. When her husband passed in 1994, Vera moved to Cranford to live with her daughter Veronica and her family and has been and continues to be a provider of love and guidance to her two granddaughters (Sheila Lamar and Meghan Lamar) who were raised in Cranford and attended the schools which the race supports. Meghan, who is currently a senior at Cranford High, attended Bloomingdale Avenue School and both Meghan and Sheila (who is currently attending a joint MBA / JD program at Michigan State University) attended Orange Avenue School.

Vera continues to be instrumental in her family's daily lives. While Vera's daughter Veronica has participated in the annual Fall 5K since it began, this is the first year that the 3 generations participated together and the first year Vera has ever participated in a race. Vera started walking with her daughters after reading that walking can add years to a person's life. At 86 years old, Vera is working toward adding many more years to her life and shares that she will continue walking and this will not be the last race she participates in.




