### **STUDENTS SHARE ACHIEVEMENTS AND GOALS** WITH SUPERINTENDENT IN AFTERNOON VISIT

"Now I feel more connected to my town than ever before." This was the sentiment expressed by Rahway High School senior and president of the French National Honor Society, Sephora Delice, after a visit with Rahway School Superintendent Dr. Patricia Camp.

On the afternoon of November 16, Dr. Camp welcomed into her office the presidents of nine different national honor societies in the high school to offer each of them her personal congratulations on their accomplishments and exceptional academic achievements. She was also genuinely eager to learn about the future plans and career aspirations embraced by each student. Listening with a caring ear (and offering sage advice when the moment was right), Dr. Camp clearly conveyed to her young guests her dedication to and support for all the students in her district.

This unique opportunity for superintendent and student to sit together at table and dialogue was the first of its kind in Rahway and definitely had a strong and very positive impact on Dr. Camp's guests on many levels. Senior and president of the Italian National Honor Society, Anly Paulino, felt "privileged to have the chance to meet somebody in such a high position and to learn that she genuinely cared about MY success." Nataly Quelopana, president of the Spanish National Honor Society, found it "an amazing experience to find out my superintendent is involved in and dedicated to our high school's honor societies." As the conversation moved briskly from one topic to another, students also had the opportunity, as Luzangela Martinez states, "to get to know Dr. Camp as a person and to know she cares enough to get to know us, the students in her schools." (Ms. Martinez has the honor of being the president of both the Science and the Math National Honor Societies.) Perhaps the most important effect the day's visit had on the students was that they all shared in the feeling that their superintendent was very "real" and that they were being "watched over" during these very stressful high school years. "After all," president of the National Honor Society Cedric Price points out, "she took the time to share her day with us!"

Dr. Camp is quick to aver that "these students are examples of what can be achieved with work and dedication by the students and their teachers; they are wonderful representatives of our schools, our community, and their generation!" In addition to finding her guests "thoughtful and well-spoken student leaders", she was also impressed to learn that her students "are considering a range of careers including medicine, education, law, criminal justice, and engineering."

The overall success of the afternoon can best be termed as a 'learning experience' for both student and superintendent alike; each discovered something new about the other through open, shared dialogue. President of the National Art Honor Society, Clarissa Miranda-Simmons summed it up quite well: "Cool how she gave kids our age acknowledgement for things we love doing."

### **RAHWAY KNIGHTS COLLECT NEARLY 88 THOUSAND ALUMINUM PULL TABS**

On November 1, 2016 the Knights of Columbus Council #1146 Rahway NJ delivered 87,930 aluminum pull tabs to Ronald McDonald House in New Brunswick NJ.

### **RAHWAY MEN OPPOSE BELVA LOCKWOOD IN 1884 PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION**

In the fall of 1906, a newly arrived resident made the following observation on the day of an election, "Rahway is the worst place for politics I ever struck. For its size, I don't believe there is any other town or city in the state that can begin to touch it. It is politics, politics, politics." On more than several occasions throughout the city's history, demonstrations for and against parties and individuals have overtly illustrated the passions of its politically astute citizens. One such occurrence took place during the presidential campaign of 1884 when the men of Rahway, in a unique and humorous way, expressed their opposition to a woman who was running for President of the United States.

Thirty-five years before women were granted the right to vote, a New Yorker named Belva Lockwood took the very bold step of accepting the nomination of the National Equal Rights Party, thus becoming the 1st woman to appear on an official ballot for president (back in 1872, Victoria Woodhull ran a limited campaign for the office). Ms. Lockwood was said to have stated, "I cannot vote, but I can be voted for."

Ms. Lockwood, a teacher and lawyer, had spent most of her life working to improve the status of women while fighting against all forms of discrimination. Her positions were in line with those of the National Equal Rights Party which advocated equal rights for women, African-Americans, Native Americans, and immigrants.

From the outset of her campaign, she received little support and much criticism. Most newspapers were opposed to her candidacy and if they mentioned her campaign at all it was lampooned with both light-hearted and sarcastic humor. The Atlantic Constitution, for example, referred to her as "Old Lady Lockwood" and warned their gentlemen readers to be wary of the dangers of "Petticoat Rule."

In a politically active city such as Rahway, it was almost a certainty that the men of the place would take an interest in the Lockwood candidacy and wage a protest, albeit in a humorous vein, to show their disapproval. A month before the election, a group of men met in

a room above the post office and formed the Belva Lockwood Club. It was during that meeting that the club would make their plans to stage an unusual street parade as a way to poke fun at the candidate and to ridicule the very concept of a woman running for the highest office in the land. The parade would turn out to be an event that would be remembered in the city for many years to follow.

By Monday evening, October 20, news of the parade had spread and the city was alive with people, not only from Rahway, but also from adjacent cities and towns. At an appointed signal, approximately 70 men began their march through the streets, each one outlandishly attired in Mother Hubbard dresses, complete with bonnets, parasols, and striped stockings. A good natured, rotund member of the club who represented Ms. Lockwood was carried along the route in a horse drawn carriage as her attending footmen playfully regarded her with the obeisance reserved for royalty. When the "ladies" reached the home of one of their leaders, the procession halted and satirical letters were read that were supposedly sent in by Ms. Lockwood, her running mate, her Republican opponent, and the Democratic nominee, Grover Cleveland. As the bogus letters were read, a loud and hearty cheer resounded. A local paper reported that, "The line of march was a long one and the procession created considerable amusement for the many citizens who lined the streets."

A week after the parade in Rahway, the club was invited to Elizabeth to march down Broad Street. That city greeted the marchers with music played by a brass band, the popping of Roman candles, and the glare of red lights emanating from lanterns carried by many of the spectators. A great crowd of people witnessed the parade which was followed by a reception at the Armory.

In the election itself, Ms. Lockwood received only 4,149 votes, all coming from the six states which allowed her name to appear on their ballots.

AMARYLLIS 'Hippeastrum Amaryllidaceae' Because of its willingness to bloom during the winter months, 'Amaryllis' has become very popular holiday gift. Amaryllis are bulbous plants which produce large flowers in red, pink, white. Nowadays a wider range of colors and combinations are available. Usually sold as a dormant bulb or with the stem emerging, you can expect a spectacular display when it comes into

bloom. Flowers last two or three weeks.

Amaryllis need bright light with some direct sunlight throughout the active growing season. Not enough light will produce a weak stem or perhaps no flower at all.

A temperature of 65

if recommended during bloom to make the flower last.

Water bulbs sparingly until growth begins then more often. Let the top of the soil dry between watering. Overwater can cause the bulb to rot.

When the flowers fade the bulb will produce broad leaves which help it to regenerate over the summer.

Amaryllis are easy to overwinter and bring back to bloom if you can supply the proper conditions. Once the leaves have formed feed plants twice a month with a basic plant fertilizer. In October cut back on watering so the soil dries out. After the leaves turn yellow cut them off and store your bulbs in a dark dry space around 50 degrees for the winter. A basement or connected garage are perfect spots for this.

Amazingly, in spring the new shoots will appear at the top of your bulb. Water lightly at first and move it into its spring spot when growth become more robust. Before you know it you will have started the entire process again.






