THIRD UNION COUNTY DAY OF PRAYER DRAWS NEARLY 600

At a time when the nation is gripped by divisiveness and intolerance for those who differ from us is worn by many like a badge of courage, nearly 600 people from all walks of life came together for the Third Annual Union County Day of Prayer, held October 6 at The Parish Community of St. Helen in Westfield.

"Day of Prayer and Reflection: Honoring People of All Faith Communities" drew speakers and readers from the Christian, Jewish, Muslim, Hindu and Sikh faiths. They were joined by people of all races and nationalities, as well as more than 100 people with disabilities. The event featured prayers, meditations and songs.

The Annual Union County Day of Prayer is planned and orchestrated each year by the Union County Interfaith Coordinating Council, an organization comprising interfaith congregations and community-based nonprofits, including Community Access Unlimited (CAU). The council promotes inclusion of all people within the community and creates a clearing house of faith-based, nonprofit and government community services available to the public while bringing greater awareness of these services to the wider community, according to Sid Blanchard, CAU executive director.

"In these times when families are being rendered asunder, when communities are being torn apart, when someone who is different is being rejected, it is essential to come together," Blanchard said.

Rabbi Joel Abraham of the Temple Sholom in Scotch Plains said, "I think it's important to stand with people of other faiths whenever possible. Especially now when there is a force of division...we want to reach across the pew and see how we are more alike than different yet also celebrate the ways we are different."

Reverend Cynthia Cochran-Carney of the Willow Grove Presbyterian Church in Scotch Plains, said, "There are many misunderstandings in our country about different faith groups, many stereotypes. I want to promote the vision we are all called by God and need to respect each other."

Fanwood, said, "It's nice when we can come together and share peace and have a true commonality that we want to have goodness in the world."

Dr. Mohammad Ali Chaudry of the Islamic Society of Basking Ridge said, "Interfaith cooperation is critical for not only the Muslim community but all communities. I've been talking about how to confront and counter bigotry. I will know I am making a difference when I see a Muslim say something hateful about another group and another Muslim stand up and say, 'That's not right.' When a Jew says something hateful and another Jew says, 'That's not right.' And a Christian and so on."

Chaudry encouraged everyone in attendance to sign a pledge to "stand up for the other" that reads: "While interacting with members of my own faith or ethnic community, or with others, if I hear hateful comments from anyone about members of any other community, I pledge to stand up for the other and challenge bigotry in any form." The pledge form is available online at www.standupfortheother.org.

"If you hear something hateful and bigoted, if you don't speak out they'll think you agree with them," Chaudry said. "If we can all take enough of a stand speaking out that that's not right, we can make a difference."



Suddenly, James finds himself in the center of the gigantic peach among human-sized insects with equally oversized personalities. We're often reminded that we should change the batteries in our smoke detectors when we change the clocks twice a year. This one small act could save your and your family's lives.

According to the Red Cross, in the United States seven people die every day in a house fire, and 36 are injured. Take steps now to avoid being one of these statistics. Besides having a working smoke detector (and carbon monoxide detector), we also should focus on preventing fires in the

Cigarettes are the leading cause of fire deaths, so smoke outside and dispose of cigarette butts properly. Cooking fires are also very common, and a small fire extinguisher in every kitchen could prevent a tragedy. Candles might smell nice and look pretty, but left unattended they can lead to big problems. Use the LED versions instead. Clogged dryer vents are another huge cause of fires. Make sure you not only clean your lint trap regularly, but also have your vents cleaned out by a professional at least every couple of years. Fireplaces and flues also need to be maintained, and every fireplace should have a screen in front of it. Portable heaters should be kept away from anything flammable and turned off upon leaving a room. Also, turn off all appliances when leaving the home.

In the case of a fire, everyone in the household should know what to do. A plan needs to be made

Contributing Author: Susan Baldani, a life beforehand, such as where to meet once you leave the house. You should practice a fire drill using this plan at least a couple of times a year. Once you get out, stay out, and call 911 immediately.

Also, don't forget to place stickers on your window letting the firemen know if there are any pets inside. These can be found at most pet stores.

ATTORNEY SETTLES HOME EXPLOSION LITIGATION FOR \$975,000.00

Attorney David C. Bendush announced settlement of a lawsuit arising from a home explosion in Hunterdon County in September of 2014. The blast was caused by a contractor who was converting the home of his clients, from oil to natural gas. The clients were in the home with their infant daughter at the time of the explosion and fire. Davis Heating and Cooling was attempting without success to purge the new gas lines. Large amounts of natural gas were caused to accumulate inside the basement until the gas exploded, nearly levelling the structure and knocking the clients to the ground where they stood. Mr. Bendush litigated the liability issues aggressively, and attained the unusual result of summary judgment for plaintiff. The defense had little choice but to settle quickly and on favorable terms, in order to avoid a trial.
