PRINCIPAL MAKES RUTGERS 1ST 'STRING DAY' HAPPEN

Thanks to the support of principal John Farinella, the Rahway High School Strings Orchestra was able to participate in this brand new event coordinated by Rutger's Dr. Elena Chernova-Davis. Held in November, Rutgers String Day was developed to bring together the most advanced high school chamber orchestras from the tri-county area for a day of playing, fun, and learning at Mason Gross School of the Arts Nicholas Music Center. It was an honor for the RHS orchestra to be invited to join the program along with five other high school orchestras from Montgomery, East Brunswick, Westfield, Old Bridge, and Summit. Recognizing the value of such a learning opportunity for his students, Mr. Farinella saw to it that both the registration fee and transportation were taken care of so that the students could benefit from this unique experience. Teacher and orchestra director, Sergei Panov, offered that it was the consensus of the students that, without Mr. Farinella's help, they could not have participated in this event that inspired them "to do better as musicians."

The String Day began with a faculty concert and was followed by clinics where each of the six schools were required to perform a substantial movement from a major work for String Orchestra. The faculty of Rutgers Mason Gross School of Music then worked with each group to improve their performance and an adjudication of each orchestra followed. To culminate the day's program, all six schools performed together Gustav Holst's "St. Paul's Suite."

It was clear that the day's events provided not only an educational impact on the students, but an inspirational one as well. Violist Jayla Walker saw the program as "an opportunity to see groups out of our district and to see what they do different from us. We get feedback which can help us in the long run." Cellist Najah Nelson confessed she was "nervous" after the first performance, but "got more confident and at ease after that." Section leader Anna Marie Belfon affirmed that, "After 4 years this was my absolute best experience being in an orchestra!" Cellist Ryan Boyle offered a realistic yet truly positive

take on his orchestra's performance, "It was clear we were the least experienced, but we learned how to better ourselves and we WANT to play better and do our part."



A LOOK BACK IN TIME - RAHWAY 50, 75, AND 100 YEARS AGO

It's a new year and time to look back at what was going on in the City of Rahway 50, 75, and 100 years ago as reported in the pages of the local paper of the day.

1917

The year began with the announcement that the evangelist Charles F. Weigle, a well–known and gifted orator from Kentucky, was coming to Rahway for a six-week evangelistic campaign to rekindle the spirits of Rahway's Christians. During his visit, several massive revival meetings were held in a tented tabernacle which was constructed in an open lot on the corner of Campbell Street and Elm Avenue. It was estimated that over 1,730 persons were "born again" and made ready to "hit the trail" for Christ.

The Board of Education reported that Franklin School, located on Union Street and built in 1852, was over-crowded and outdated (a new Franklin School would eventually be built on St. Georges Avenue in 1922.) It was also in 1917 that schools were fire-proofed and fire escapes were added.

The Merck plant completed a three-year construction project that tripled the number of buildings and employees on their 200 acre site. Established in 1899, Merck had developed into the largest manufacturing concern in the city producing over 5,000 different products.

The United States entered World War I on April 6 and Rahway responded by requiring families to complete a survey listing the names of each man in the family of military age and all material resources owned such as guns, autos, and anything else that might be of use in the war effort.

On October 26 the Post Office celebrated the 20th anniversary of their home delivery service.

In December, the library announced that as of February 1918, it would become a free public library, making the borrowing of books and magazines free to all residents of the city. (Paid subscriptions were required for membership before this change.)



1942

Throughout 1942, assisting in the war effort and preparing for the possibility of an invasion dominated the attention of cities across the nation. In Rahway, air raid sirens were installed atop city hall, the high school, Grover Cleveland, Franklin, and Roosevelt schools. The alert signal was a series of short blasts over a two minute period and the all clear signal was a two-minute continuous blast of steady pitch.

On Wednesday, April 15, the first blackout drill was held from 10:00-10:15 p.m. in nine counties in north Jersey. All vehicular traffic was stopped and all lights extinguished. The response in Rahway was almost perfect.

Paper, rags, cardboard, metals, rubber, and tin cans were collected in scrap drives. Ration cards were issued for sugar, gasoline, and fuel oil. Auto purchases were controlled and driving mileage recorded. War stamps and bonds were purchased by students in each of the schools and bonds were sold in churches, factories, theaters, and the hospital.

In August, Regina was awarded the prestigious Army–Navy E Award for converting their production line to produce materials for the war. National Pneumatic received the E Award in September and Merck would be honored with the award in January, 1943.

Rules were set for Christmas lighting. Only modest lighting could be displayed on homes with no extravagant use of lights that could contribute to the overall sky glow.

News came in November that Marine Pvt. Terrance J. Brady died from wounds while fighting in the battles of the South Pacific, thus becoming the first Rahway boy to be killed in action in World War II.

Seventeen candidates ran for seats on the Board of Education which remains the largest slate to run since the board became an elective body in the 1950s. The new board would enact several issues that would become controversial including a plan to transfer 5th and 6th graders from Grover Cleveland and Columbian elementary schools to Madison and Roosevelt as a step in reducing racial imbalance in the grammar schools. A second "hot button" item was the board's decision to introduce courses in Family Life and Sex Education to the high school curriculum.

On Saturday, May 13, American Legion Post 5 chartered buses to take residents to New York City to participate in a parade along 5th Avenue to support the boys fighting in Viet Nam.

Herbert T. Kinch was appointed Chief of Police to become the first African-American to command a large city police force in North Jersey. Kinch joined the force in 1942 and rose through the ranks. He had been named Deputy Police Chief in 1965.

The old library on Seminary Avenue and Irving Street closed on June 26. The grand opening of the new St. Georges Avenue library was celebrated on July 16.



MOURNING DOVES (PART ONE)

WINTER BACKYARD BIRD FEEDING

Mourning doves are the most successful wild dove in North America, with a range from Alaska, Canada, Maine and as far south as Panama.

Although most Mourning doves migrate south during the winter months, many stay in our area where they depend on back yard bird feeders for survival.

Mourning doves feed on a vast assortment of seeds including weed seeds which makes it a valuable ally of farmers and gardeners. If you keep your bird feeders stocked Mourning doves will stay close, eating off the ground (gleaning) under feeders which helps keep that area clean.

Snow and ice make it difficult for these birds to scratch up seed, but there are a few things that you can do to help them. During the snowfall sprinkle seed on top to keep food in reach. If possible flatten an area and sprinkle the seed on that area. After a big storm I put cardboard on top of the snow and sprinkle the seed on top of that. I feed Mourning doves millet which is their favorite seed and black-oil sunflower seed because it is high in protein.

Mourning doves also utilize a heated birdbath for drinking water if you can provide it.

Also known as 'Turtle Doves', Mourning doves are medium size birds around 5 to 6 ounces, with brown pointed wings and tail, white and black markings and a crescent on its neck. Males have blue and pink highlights on the head and around

their eyes. The pointed falcon like wings give them the ability to reach speeds of 40 to 55 miles per hour. Mourning doves are related to the now extinct 'Passenger doves' used in wartime to deliver messages.

feed Mourning doves millet which is their vorite seed and black-oil sunflower seed loud whirling sound and their strong feet enable then to push off the ground quickly. The call from the male is a hollow mournful coah, cooo, cooo.

Habitat is open farmlands, towns, roadsides, open grasslands and scrubs. I'll provide more information on Mourning doves mating and raising their young in the spring.
