#### **AED'S DONATED TO WARREN TOWNSHIP RECREATION COMMISSION**

Memorial Fund presented, at the November Recreation Commission meeting, six Automated External Defibrillators (AED) and seven outdoor cabinets to Warren Township (the total value \$11,800) to be stationed at the athletic fields and tennis courts. This donation is to replace and add AEDs donated by the Janet Zilinski Memorial Fund (The Janet Fund) previously in 2006.

In 2006 Warren Township Recreation Commission's J.A.N.E.T. Policy (Janet's Always Near Emergency Treatment) was adopted. This was the first one in the country. Each township youth sports organization recognized by the Recreation Commission wishing to utilize Township of Warren athletic facilities is required

Karen and Jim Zilinski from The Janet Zilinski to assign a "Safety Coordinator" for its organization and require at least one coach be certified in CPR for each team. Warren Township's J.A.N.E.T policy has been adopted by various towns throughout New Jersey.

> Since September 1, 2014, Janet's Law went into effect for all New Jersey public school and private schools that provide instruction to students in grades kindergarten through 12. Each school must have at least one AED in an accessible location and have a minimum of 5 trained responders in both the use of the AED and CPR. In 2006, Warren Township Recreation was the first in the state of New Jersey to have AEDs on its athletic fields thanks to the generous donations from the Janet Fund.

Annual studies repeatedly show that the most common month for individuals to file for divorce is January. The reasons for this are many and varied. Most people, for obvious reasons, do not want to address emotionally charged issues over the holiday season preferring a more peaceful Thanksgiving, Hanukkah, Christmas and New Year. For couples whose pending divorce is more driven by financial considerations, and less by emotions, there can be tax consequences which relate to the timing of filing for divorce. And still others who have come to the conclusion that the dissolution of their marriage is inevitable, often times decide that a "new year" is the best time for a "new start."

Over the course of my career as a family law attorney I have come to believe that the "best" time to make this difficult decision is when an individual is emotionally prepared and after they know that all attempts to make their marriage work have been exhausted.

On a more positive note, a recent report showed that New Jersey had the fourth lowest divorce rate (just 12.9 per 1,000 people) in the United States for 2015. Married couples in New Jersey beat the national divorce average of 16.9 per 1,000, a rate which is a 35year low, according to the National Center for Family & Marriage Research at Bowling Green State University in Kentucky.

The only couples more dedicated to the institution of marriage are those residing in Hawaii, Wisconsin and Rhode Island. In Hawaii, divorce rates are lowest with only 11.1 per 1,000 calling it a day, followed closely by Wisconsin (12.4 per 1,000) and Rhode Island (12.6 per 1,000). Where might you not wish to live if you want to stay together? The answer is Washington, DC which the same study confirmed had the highest divorce rate at 29.9 per 1,000. Nationwide, the divorce rate dropped significantly from 17.6 in 2014 to 16.9 in 2015 which marks the lowest rate since 1980.

Before anyone assumes that couples are now more likely to stay together for emotional or economic reasons, some researchers say that a primary reason for the decrease in divorce may be that fewer Americans are getting married at all and those who do are getting married at an older age.



#### **GILLIAN KLEIN RAISES OVER \$1,000 FOR YOUNGSTERS AT GORYEB CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL**

Thanks to Warren resident and competitive dancer Gillian Klein, youngsters undergoing treatment at Goryeb Children's Hospital at Morristown Medical Center, which aids families coping with pediatric illnesses, have their spirits brightened.

The senior at Mount Saint Mary Academy has directed her passion for dance and her devotion to serving others in a unique way. Gillian, who has been dancing since she was 3 and competing since she was 7, garners many accolades in regional and national competitions as a varsity team member and soloist.

"During my freshman year, I was awarded hundreds of dollars after participating in various regional and national dance competitions," explained Gillian, "and in my sophomore and junior year, I received even more money. I realized that I could be doing something significant with that money to help others."

Even though her cousin who suffered from cancer is now cured and thriving, his struggle left an unforgettable impression on Gillian, who began fundraising for Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center when she was in the fifth grade. She has also been motivated by two members of the Mount Saint Mary Academy community who died of cancer this year.

"I admired them very much," she said, "and it has made me want to help as many people who suffer from cancer as possible."

Now, Gillian donates her award winnings from solo competitions toward Dancers Turn Against Cancer, a fundraising initiative she established to

benefit pediatric cancer patients. This summer, she donated 100 new Build-A-Bear teddy bears which she calls "Cancer Friends" to newlydiagnosed patients at Goryeb.

"It's the little things that make them happy and the fact that they have a 'Cancer Friend' to help them along their journey is very special," she said. Gillian hopes to raise more money this year to replenish the supply of teddy bears.

Gillian volunteers her time as a member of the Kids-4-Kids Teen Board which helps raise thousands of dollars for Goryeb Children's Hospital.

Through her volunteer efforts with the Kids-4-Kids Teen Board, Gillian started a fundraising initiative to purchase kid-friendly IV poles for pediatric patients who receive extended IV treatments. To date, she has raised \$1,000 for the cause.

"Every child that I have seen at Goryeb has motivated me and it means so much to see how this fundraising is changing their lives," said Gillian.

"I realized that the children at the Valerie Center at Goryeb are in critical need of new kidfriendly IV poles," she added.

"Many children spend countless hours getting IV treatments for cancer and blood disorders. The new kid-friendly poles are brightly decorated with animal or cartoon toppers and have a skate board base."


