VETS MEET JETS IN JERSEY

Admittedly, it doesn't happen often. Certainly, it doesn't happen enough. But when do 150 Viet Nam Veterans, representing all veterans organizations, join together to remember, to commemorate and to enjoy the company of their comrades?

The New York Jets Football organization apparently understood that. So on Sunday December 4, 2016 the NY Jets invited 150 Viet Nam Veterans to their practice facility in Florham Park, NJ. The occasion was to be honored with a 50th Anniversary of the Vietnam War Commemorative pin and to simply enjoy a terrific "Welcome Home" experience.

A buffet breakfast led the morning off, which followed a "Posting of the Colors" by the Cranford NJ VFW Post #335's Color Guard and a patriotic Pledge of Allegiance by the group. "Amazing Grace" was played meticulously by the 12 member Union County Emerald Society Pipe and Drum Corp. adding a significant degree of solemnity to the event. In keeping with that solemnity and tradition, VFW Post #335 also provided a proper MIA-POW table and empty chair in memory of those missing comrades.

The very first featured speaker, Medal of Honor recipient Jack Jacobs was welcomed with a two minute standing round of applause. Mr. Jacobs saw his meritorious action in Kien Phong Province in 1968 while serving as an assistant battalion adviser to a South Vietnamese army unit. His moving remarks opened humorously on his lack of height, "which saved my life", and later on the patriotic aspect of being a Vietnam Veteran and the need to be proud of the experience.

Following Mr. Jacobs remarks, Major General Troy Kok head of the 99th Regional Support Command at Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst, talked emotionally on the sacrifices that we as veterans have made and the positive consequences of our military experiences. Both speeches were met with tumultuous applause from a grateful audience of men and women Vets.

Following the speeches, a few words of thanks from the General Manager of the NY Jets, Michael Maccagnan were said and commemorative pins were handed out with a handshake and sincere "thank you" to each and every Vietnam Veteran in attendance. Afterwards all were invited to watch a brief practice on the outside practice turf by the Jets squad followed by a meet and greet autograph session with the players.

But the morning was really more than that.

"I met a guy I served with in the 173rd Airborne, that I haven't seen in 45 years" said Viet Nam Vet Billy Lueddeke from Kenilworth, NJ. "Just that, seeing him again made it an unbelievable day for me and brought back memories I haven't thought of in years". Another Vet talked of the special emotions he felt just being in the presence of so many who shared his experiences, "just chatting with the guys at the table about where they were and what they did made it for me, I was truly grateful for this day",

said Mike Chmiel, Army Vet, of Cranford, NJ.

WHAT, WHERE, AND WHEN IN OLD KENILWORTH - LOOKS CAN BE DECEIVING

This building at S. 21st St. is not one building, but four. Years ago, old timers nicknamed it "The Flats." Its origin began Downtown about 1902 when that area of Monroe Ave. from 8th St. to 14th St. served as Kenilworth's first shopping center with a handful of mom and pop stores, a coal yard, a mini railroad station, and other businesses. William Shallcross (1887-1961) came to Kenilworth in December 1898 when it was New Orange. In the 1950s he wrote, "The flats on 21st St. were stores from Monroe Ave, one from 8th St. and two from 13th St." So today one might wonder who moved them and when?

In 1921, James Arthur, an early Kenilworth builder known for building 100 houses in 100 days in 1899, moved those three buildings to

property he owned on S. 21st St. just outside of his New Orange Park development. There he erected a fourth building identical to the others and joined them with a common facade. From the rear of The Flats one can see that they are four distinct buildings joined together.

Eugene Coppola, a 96-year old Kenilworth native, stated (2017), "When a young boy in the 1920s and 1930s there were stores downstairs with apartments above. On the first floors were the Gospel Chapel, Meyers's Bakery, and a deli

owned by Pauline Stupak, mother of former Chief Ed Stupak. The fourth might have been a radio shop. I remember teachers from McKinley and Harding schools walking diagonally through the fields to eat lunch in the bakery. Sometime in the 1940s everything became apartments."

AFRICAN TEA CEREMONY AT NITSCHKE HOUSE

The Kenilworth Historical Society will host an African Tea Ceremony on Sunday, February 19, in celebration of Black History Month. The ceremony, to be presented by certified tea specialist and tea educator Darlene Meyers-Perry, will take place at the historic Oswald J. Nitschke House (49 South 21 Street, Kenilworth) at 1:30 p.m. Admission is \$10 for adults and \$5 for children under the age of 12. Advance registration is requested, as seating is limited. For information/reservations, please call 908-709-0434.

Participants will have the opportunity to learn about and experience the West African tea ritual known as "attaya," which comprises three rounds of tea symbolizing the three stages of life (childhood, mid-life, old age). They also will learn about the ceremonial tea, its preparation and its significance.

Featured speaker Darlene Meyers-Perry is owner/president of The Tea Lover's Archives. As a certified tea specialist and tea educator, Meyers-Perry has a 22-year relationship with tea that has allowed her to cross paths and build friendships with other tea enthusiasts throughout the world. Her tea experiences led her to establish a blog, "The Tea Enthusiast's Scrapbook" (www.theteaenthusiastsscrapbook.com), and an online retail store, "The Tea Lover's Archives" (www.thetealoversarchives.com).

Meyers-Perry is a board member and vice president of the Mid Atlantic Tea Association and is a member of many other professional organizations as well, including the Tea Association of the USA, The Association of Tea Bloggers and the New Jersey Association of Women Business Owners. She graduated from the Specialty Tea Institute in 2012 and has

lectured and exhibited extensively at numerous tea expositions/events, including the World Tea Expo and the New York City Coffee and Tea Festival. She also has traveled internationally, including participation in the Floating Leaves Taiwan Tea Tour, where she acquired firsthand knowledge about tea from tea masters.

Proceeds from the February 19 event will benefit the Kenilworth Historical Society's Oswald J. Nitschke House (c. 1880) "living history" museum and cultural arts center by helping defray programming costs. The Nitschke House has an elevator and is fully accessible.

A CALL FOR HELP: OVERNIGHT VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR OPERATION WARM HEART

Submitted by Vanessa Checo, Operation Warm Heart
- Elizabeth Coalition to House the Homeless

Our Operation Warm Heart program provides short term shelter at participating church and organization locations scattered throughout Elizabeth, Linden, Cranford, and Rahway for homeless persons who are ineligible for shelter from County Social services. The program operates from December 1 to March 31, and shelters run generally 6 p.m. to 7 a.m.

Additional overnight volunteers are needed to assist site coordinators on specific nights preferably one night a week or bi weekly. Volunteers are given basic training and primarily check in the guests for the night, direct them regarding the facilities and where to set up their cots, and occasionally assist with serving dinner. Most importantly they provide hospitality, oversight, and company to the guests for the night. Guests generally sleep from 11PM to 6AM and most volunteers work out shifts as needed. Cots, blankets, food, and transport are provided by the site or the program.

Persons to be sheltered are prescreened and provided ongoing case management and support services in order to find alternate transitional or long term housing or placement as appropriate, and as soon as possible. The program is not intended as a place for a person to shelter for the 4 months of the season. Generally, we shelter up to 14 persons, more under Code Blue circumstances. Names of those prescreened are provided to the site volunteers in advance. An agency staff person is available by phone at all times.

In summary, volunteers provided a welcome human affirmation for our guests and find the experience very rewarding.

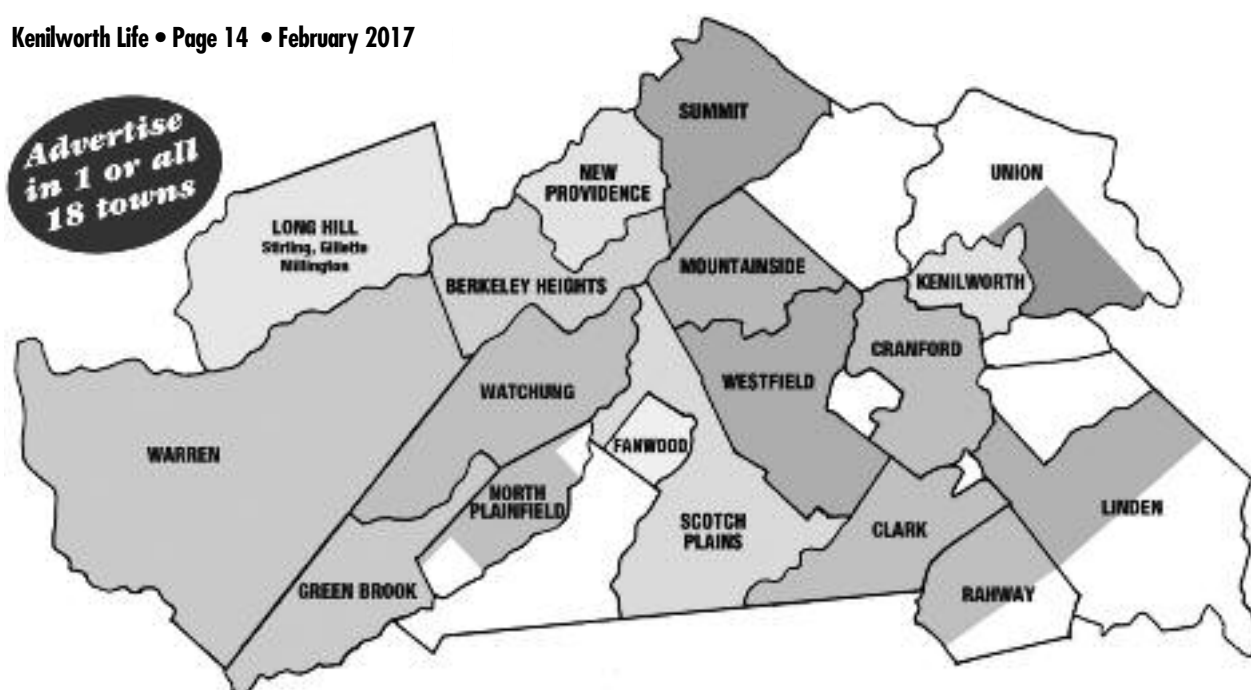
