WHRHS STUDENTS SING AND DANCE WHILE RAISING FUNDS FOR PROJECT ALS WITH TALENT SHOW


Students and teachers at Watchung Hills Regional High School (WHRHS) demonstrated their performance skills and entertainment savvy, while raising funds for Project A.L.S. (Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis), at a Talent Show, Wednesday, Jan. 11, in the school's Performing Arts Center (PAC). Some 16 acts were presented for the enjoyment of the audience, including solo and group performances of song, dance, musicianship, and poetry. Three of the acts were awarded prizes in the talent show competition at the event.

First prize went to Peri Martins of Warren Township, who sang "Rise Up," by Andra Day, and accompanied herself on piano. Second prize went to Eliana Neuwirth of Warren Township, who sang, "Almost Lover," by Fine Frenzy. Third Prize went to Isabella Zhou of Warren Township, who performed a Chinese Dance to the music of the number titled, "Incense."

According to the program, the Talent Show was presented, "In loving memory of Tom Shea (1968-2012) and Jenifer Estess (1963-2003)." Shea is the late brother of WHRHS English Teacher Laura Goodson, who died from A.L.S.

Two summers ago, WHRHS students read, as part of a summer reading assignment, "Tales from the Bed: A Memoir," by the late Jenifer Estess, as told to her sister, Valerie Estess. The work of non-fiction was about Jenifer Estess' battle with ALS, often also referred to as Lou Gehrig Disease. In addition, several representatives from Project ALS, including Jenifer's sisters, Valerie and Meredith Estess, spoke to assemblies of WHRHS students. WHRHS student government leaders have held several fundraising events in the last couple of years, such as this year's and previous years' Talent Shows.

"Since its inception, Project ALS has advanced ALS research, accelerating the testing of potential drugs, establishing the world's first and only privately funded stem cell laboratory and developing the first laboratory models of ALS," according to published Project ALS literature.

"We have brought together the top stem cell biologists, geneticists, motor neuron experts and ALS neurologists to work on ALS and related diseases—transforming the field. In 17 years, Project ALS has raised over \$75 million, directing between 80-93 percent annually to research programs."

One of the highlights of the Talent Show was an ensemble performance of "The Room Where It Happened," from the current award-winning Broadway musical, "Hamilton." Among the performers were WHRHS History teachers Rebecca Brown, Sean New, Ken Karnas and Greg O'Reilly.

Students in the ensemble include Adele Rotondo, Jack Melillo, Suchir Govindarajan, Hannah Melillo, Kyra Anthony, Claire Vickery, Matt Oboh, Maddy Goffredo, Elisabeh Russo, Grace Shanahan, Julianne Lin, Francesca Meehan, Stephanie Moreno and Sarah Kelly. In a separate performance, Dana Wasserman and Summer Stuart sang another song from Hamilton, "Dear Theodosia."



John Trovato is Troop 228's 93rd Eagle Scout, and he attained this rank at his Eagle Board of Review on August 16th, 2016. John's Eagle service project was the construction of a large patio picnic area (approx 500 ft2) at Our Lady of the Mount Church. In addition to the patio, two 8' long stained picnic tables were constructed and nine bushes were planted along the edge. John's improved outdoor area provides a place for religious education classes to go outside, opportunities for the church to hold events outdoors, and use as a general use picnic area for parishioners and the elderly to sit, pray, relax and talk.

Karthik Irakam is Troop 228's 94th Eagle Scout, and he attained this rank at his Eagle Board of Review on October 5th, 2016. Karthik's Eagle service project was the creation of an outdoor area for the pre-school program at Watchung Hills Regional High School. Under Karthik's planning and leadership, scouts and adults from the troop built an outdoor classroom with benches for students and staff to sit on, constructed a raised garden bed and a composting bin, and restored the huge outdoor sandbox to make it useable once again. Karthik's project enables the pre-school students and staff to utilize the outdoors more often in a safer environment.



Michael Duncan is Troop 228's 95th Eagle Scout, and he attained this rank at his Eagle Board of Review on November 15th, 2016. Michael's Eagle service project was the creation of a boardwalk and portable benches at Warren Middle School. Michael's 36' boardwalk stretched over a boggy area leading from the school to their Outdoor Adventure area, which was impassable after rain. He also constructed 4 benches, portable in nature, so the students would have somewhere to sit while waiting their turn on the outdoor apparatus. Michael's project was advantageous to the student community at Warren Middle School..
