SEVEN WESTFIELD RESIDENTS BECOME CASA VOLUNTEERS

On December 14, 2016 Union County Superior Court Judge Daniel R. Lindemann administered oaths to two graduating classes of community members — among them Anne Bristow, Theresa Brown, Phyllis Dunlop, Michele Higgins, Noreen Horgan, Cheryl Kelesoglu and Marcela Wolf of Westfield — who've stepped up to serve as extra eyes and ears for Family Court judges on cases involving the county's abused, neglected or abandoned children currently in foster care. Of the two classes, one had 19 participants, including CASA of Union County's new executive director, Marla Higginbotham. The second is the result of the nonprofit offering for the first time a five-session, intensive day training at its offices, and included nine volunteers.

The new CASA volunteers completed 30 hours of training. After performing the oaths, Judge Lindemann stepped off the bench and personally thanked each advocate for committing to serve children in need of a voice. Members of the organization's board participated, and each new advocate received a commemorative pin and certificate. During celebratory luncheons that followed, advocates were matched to their new case and learned about their youth.

Volunteers with varied backgrounds and experiences make successful advocates, and these classes are no exception: They range in age from 22 to 75 and most have no prior knowledge of the foster system. They include parents, non-parents and empty-nesters; a recent college graduate and recent retiree; careers include health professionals, school personnel, counselors, legal professionals, former military, business entrepreneurs and homemakers. William "Joe" Goodson of Plainfield, a CASA volunteer years ago who returned to help another child now that his own schedule allowed, said this work is a calling. "I know the situation in the African-American community, and I want to give back. I've been there and done that. We need more positive role models for these children who need us. I can make a difference and be someone they relate to, and that's what I'm looking for." Goodson added that on Thanksgiving, his CASA youth weighed heavily on his mind: "I'm looking at a table full of food and family and thinking of him, wondering, 'Is he ok, today?""

CASA volunteers have court-ordered access to all parties in a child's life, including foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers, and incorporate into court reports findings from these contacts as well as time spent with the youth. Volunteers advocate both in the community and court to ensure their youth's needs are met and time in care is as short as possible. There are 600 Union County children currently in foster care; CASA of Union County serves approximately one-third of those and its mission is to provide an advocate for every child that needs one.

WESTFIELD HISTORICAL SOCIETY PRESENTATION: NEWARK THROUGH THE AGES

Elizabeth R. Del Tufo, President of the City of Newark Landmarks and Historic Preservation Commission, will conduct a Sunday Afternoon Presentation about the history of the city of Newark. The talk will take place on February 26nd at 2:30 p.m. at the Reeve House in Westfield, New Jersey.

Ms. Del Tufo will trace the city's history from its earliest days in the late 1600's through the Revolutionary War, the Industrial Era, the Post-World War II Era, the riots of 1967, and the growth and revitalization taking place today. Along the way, she will discuss many of Newark's most well-known and architecturally significant landmarks — Trinity Cathedral, the Ballantine House, Newark Public Library, the Essex County Courthouse, Branch Brook Park, Mount Pleasant Cemetery, and Broad Street Station.

She will also call attention to many of Newark's notable statues, including the "Wars of the America" statue in Military Park and the "Seated Lincoln" statue in downtown Newark, which was dedicated by President Theodore Roosevelt and was influential in the design of the Lincoln Memorial.

Elizabeth is a long time resident of the city of Newark with a long and productive involvement in the cultural life of the city. She served as the first Director of Cultural Affairs for the County of Essex. As such she created an on-going concert series in the Essex County Parks and was the driving force in transforming an abandoned Nike Missile Base in Livingston to the still thriving Riker Hill Art Park. She founded "The Newark Arts Council" and served as its first director. The New Jersey State Council on the Arts praised her work by stating: "She has created an organization second to none in promoting and presenting the arts."

Ms. Del Tufo was awarded an honoree doctoral degree from the New Jersey Institute of Technology for her work in preserving the history of Newark and for her contributions to building a vibrant new Newark.

NJWA CELEBRATES 45TH ANNIVERSARY WITH FAMILY GALA AND BRUNCH

celebrate a milestone with its 45th Anniversary Around the World Brunch on Sunday, March 12, 2017 at 12 pm at Snuffy's Pantagis Renaissance at 250 Park Avenue in Scotch Plains.

Founded in 1972 by Dr. Ted Schlosberg, who had been a music teacher in the Westfield Public Schools, the Workshop was a response to parent and student interest in offering options for children to pursue their musical development throughout the summer. Dr. Schlosberg devised a five-week program, the Westfield Band-Orchestra-Chorus Summer Workshop, which was first held at Westfield High School and alternately at both Edison and Roosevelt Intermediate Schools.

The following year, the program grew to encompass musical theater and eventually drama and dance. By 1974, fine arts and crafts were added and succeeding years saw the inclusion of creative courses in language, writing, special interests and pre-school classes.

Always interested in fostering a love of music, Dr. Schlosberg began private instrumental lessons in his home in 1980. In time, he had enough students to look for more room and acquired teaching and office space on Route 22 West in Mountainside. Dr. Schlosberg saw how both children and adults were interested in pursuing their musical interests year-round and, in 1989, he founded the Music Studio, which was then located in an office building on South Avenue in Fanwood. The number of students grew and, in 1993, the New Jersey Workshop for the Arts moved into its present home at 150 East Broad Street in Westfield and eventually also

The New Jersey Workshop for the Arts will took over number 152 East Broad Street as well.

Over these past 45 years, the NJWA has enrolled students of all ages in its many programs, bands, ensembles and orchestras. The dedicated staff and individual and corporate sponsors, who have donated their time, expertise and finances, have helped thousands of people be exposed to artistically creative experiences.

This March 12 celebration will feature music by various musical groups among them the Florian Schantz Jazz Combo, the International Alphorn Ensemble and a special Gala Orchestra, comprised of the members of the Wednesday Morning Strings and the Saturday Afternoon Orchestras. The event will include fine food and

children's activities, face painting, balloon twisting and caricature drawing. Proceeds from the gala will benefit the NJWA Scholarship Fund. This arts program is made possible in part by a HEART (History, Education, Arts Reaching Thousands) Grant from the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders.

Our Operation Warm Heart program provides short term shelter at participating church and organization locations scattered throughout Elizabeth, Linden, Cranford, and Rahway for homeless persons who are ineligible for shelter from County Social services. The program operates from December 1 to March 31, and shelters run generally 6 p.m. to 7 a.m.

Additional overnight volunteers are needed to assist site coordinators on specific nights preferably one night a week or bi weekly. Volunteers are given basic training and primarily check in the guests for the night, direct them regarding the facilities and where to set up their cots, and occasionally assist with serving dinner. Most importantly they provide hospitality, oversight, and company to the guests for the night. Guests generally sleep from 11PM to 6AM and most volunteers work out shifts as needed. Cots, blankets, food, and transport are provided by the site or the program.

Persons to be sheltered are prescreened and provided ongoing case management and support services in order to find alternate transitional or long term housing or placement as appropriate, and as soon as possible. The program is not intended as a place for a person to shelter for the 4 months of the season. Generally, we shelter up to 14 persons, more under Code Blue circumstances. Names of those prescreened are provided to the site volunteers in advance. An agency staff person is available by phone at all times.

In summary, volunteers provided a welcome human affirmation for our guests and find the experience very rewarding.
