



Raphael's Life House, founded by Cranford resident Edith Coogan and former resident, Mary Orrico, is Covenant House New Jersey's Mother Child program, created to provide non-sectarian housing to homeless and pregnant young women and their babies when born, for up to one year. The goal is to assist the women in establishing an independent living situation for themselves and their babies. The women in the program are ages 18-23, alcohol and drug free, mentally and physically capable of caring for themselves and their baby, and willing to obey the house rules while either working or attending school. Raphael's Life House shelters 12 women at a time; each mother shares quarters with her baby in a safe and homey environment.

Staff and talented volunteers provide classes to assist moms with prenatal care, parenting skills, building esteem, job seeking, educational and vocational opportunities and other critical life skills. Volunteers also participate as baby-sitters, host community monthly dinners, coordinate baby showers and fundraising events, and much more. 

HOW DIVORCE CAN IMPACT YOUR CURRENT AND FUTURE SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS

One of the questions often asked by divorced individuals, particularly at the time of their retirement or the retirement of their former spouse, is whether or not they are entitled to receive Social Security benefits based on their prior marriage. The Social Security Administration interprets the law with the philosophy that a divorced person may deserve a personal benefit themselves if they were a long-term spouse of a member of the country's workforce.

Generally, there are two sets of rules which the Social Security Administration applies to determine whether or not an individual will qualify. The first applies if your former spouse is living; the second applies if they are deceased. The interpretation of these rules can sometimes be complicated and is often necessary to have an experienced family law attorney review not only the rules applied by Social Security but the settlement agreement signed at the time of the divorce.

In the first scenario, where the former spouse is still living, the preliminary criteria which need to be met are: (1) your prior marriage lasted for 10 years or more; (2) you are not currently married; and (3) you are 62 years of age or older. Just as important is whether you are entitled to receive Social Security benefits based on your own prior work history. If you are, the amount which you are entitled to receive for your efforts must be less than what you are entitled to receive based on your prior marriage. No individual is entitled to collect both benefits.

A second set of rules apply if an individual's former spouse has already died. Under these circumstances, you would have to be 60 years of age or older, have to have been married to your former spouse for more than 10 years, and cannot be entitled to a retirement benefit which would be higher than what could be claimed based upon your former spouses work record. Finally if you have remarried before the age of 60, you may not be able to receive this benefit. If you remarry after the age of 60, you would probably be entitled to receive it.

It is also important to note that ex-wives and ex-husbands are treated the same under the Social Security statutes, that it does not matter if your former spouse is now remarried and that any benefit you are entitled to receive as the divorced spouse will have no effect on the amount of the benefit your former spouse is entitled to receive based upon his or her work history. Lastly, bear in mind that if you should elect to receive your benefits before your full Social Security retirement age (which you can determine at www.ssa.gov) you will permanently reduce the amount you are entitled to receive.

There are other rules that may apply to divorced individuals. If you subsequently remarry, you generally are prohibited from receiving benefits based on your former spouse's work history unless your later marriage ends (whether by death, divorce or annulment). If your former spouse has not applied for retirement benefits, but has met the qualifications to receive them, you can receive benefits on his or her record if you have been divorced for at least two years. Differing rules apply for those who have been married multiple times.

There are other qualifying factors and determinations which need to be considered to confirm what benefit a former spouse is eligible to receive. It is always best to contact an experienced family law attorney who can discuss your qualifications to receive such benefits. 



LITTLE RED HATS WARM HEARTS IN A BIG WAY AT TRINITAS

"More than 40,000 infants are diagnosed with congenital heart disease each year. At Trinitas all







HISTORIC PRESERVATION ADVISORY BOARD HIGHLIGHTS 2016 ACTIVITIES

This past December, the Cranford Historic Preservation Advisory Board (HPAB) completed an inventory of historical resources in Cranford, a 980-page report with descriptions, maps and supporting materials detailing many of the

significant buildings and other assets throughout town. This is the first phase of a planned comprehensive survey, and it includes resources identified in studies done by various government and private organizations over the years. "Phase I Cranford Historic Resources Survey: Review of Existing Documentation, Baseline Inventory, and Survey Updates" includes an overview of Cranford's history and development, comprehensive review of existing cultural resources surveys, National Register listings and other documentation, current status updates for existing resources, and recommendations for future survey activity.

HPAB member Kinney Clark, who compiled the inventory, noted that it follows the US Department of Interior guidelines and provides a valuable document for use by the Township. He stated that while HPAB has been working on a variety of identification and designation efforts over the last several years, this comprehensive approach to assessing historic resources in Cranford will help develop an objective basis for decision-making and help establish a community vision for how best to incorporate historic resources into the development of Cranford. He also said that a comprehensive historic resources document can also support design guidelines and style guides.

Highlights of the Inventory were presented to the Township Committee, and copies were distributed to Township officials and committees. The Inventory is available to the public at the Cranford Library and at the Administrator's Office in the Municipal Building.

The Inventory was one of HPAB's many accomplishments in 2016, furthering its mission of aiding in the preservation of Cranford's architectural heritage through documentation of significant structures, education of the public as to the value of preservation, and advice to the Township on laws and activities impacting preservation. HPAB is a Township Committee established by an Ordinance in 1993.

HPAB also provided comments on Cranford's historic resources for the Rahway River Flood Risk Management Project to the Army Corps of Engineers and to the State of NJ, and also met with a State representative about flood elevation guidelines. HPAB also commented to the Township Committee on various topics, especially the Master Plan and the demolition of the Trolley Building.

HPAB's "Cranford's History and Architecture - A Journey Through Time" DVD continues to be available in several stores in downtown Cranford and online on the HPAB website, www.preservecranford.com, for \$15. Copies of the DVD were donated to the Library and almost 100 people attended a free showing of the "History" at the Community Center in May. HPAB's map of Cranford that is color-coded with the years houses were built continues to be popular and is available downtown and on the HPAB website.

On November 2, HPAB was honored by the Chamber of Commerce with their Pride in Cranford Award. HPAB was cited for "commitment to safeguarding treasures of the past for the benefit of future generations", particularly in saving the Flint Faience fireplace from the Roosevelt School, producing the "History" DVD, sponsoring an Ordinance to establish a procedure to designate historic sites and districts, and designating the Crane-Phillips House and the Droescher's Mill as Cranford Historical Sites.




