

the World building was erected in 1909 by noted early Kenilworth builder James Arthur. The W.O.W was a fraternal organization whose early purpose provide was to financial assistance to widows of members. Originally the first

floor was a residence and the upper floor a meeting room used by the W.O.W. and other organizations for meetings and social events. Mayor and council meetings were conducted there prior to being acquired as Kenilworth's first borough hall. Before that, the police headquarters had moved into the first floor. The Woodmen of overcrowding struck the public and St. Theresa's parochial schools. The building became the senior citizens and recreation center once the new municipal building opened in 1962. In 1964 it was renamed Edward H. Kasbarian Hall for a councilman who died in office at the time.

> The most memorable event there was the New Year's Day 1940 shootout. Then tax collector John Butler planned to assassinate members of the governing body. He succeeded in slaying only former mayor August J. Stahl who then was borough clerk. Butler was subdued by patrolman Andrew Ruscansky, who was shot by Butler. Ruscansky survived.

> Often referred to as the old borough hall, it was demolished in 1984. The Kenilworth Senior Citizens Center now occupies that site at 526



For Monica, that moment would happen when she'd least expect it. She was twenty-three living on coffee and cigarettes when she woke up with a lump protruding from her neck.





LITTLE RED HATS WARM HEARTS IN A BIG WAY AT TRINITAS

Trinitas Regional Medical Center is joining the American Heart Association's Little Hats, Big Hearts program to raise awareness of family heart health and congenital heart defects, the most common type of birth defect in the country. The campaign coincides with Congenital Heart Defect Awareness Week in February, and aims to empower new moms to take charge of their own wellbeing while starting a healthy lifestyle for the entire family.

As part of the Little Hats, Big Hearts program, babies born at Trinitas during the week of February 7 received a red knitted or crocheted hat, and a kit full of heart-healthy information for mom and baby. The kit includes tips on raising healthy children, heart-healthy workouts that can be done at home, recipes, and information on congenital heart defects.

"More than 40,000 infants are diagnosed with congenital heart disease each year. At Trinitas all of our newborns receive a critical congenital heart disease screening before they go home, but some heart defects don't become known until the child is months or years old," states Gary S. Horan, FACHE, President& CEO of TRMC. "This is why we are so pleased to be part of a program that educates parents on congenital heart disease and informs them of symptoms they should look out for as their child ages."

Trinitas distributed nearly 100 kits during Congenital Heart Defect Awareness Week. Congenital heart defects are structural problems with the heart present at birth. They result when a mishap occurs during heart development soon after conception and often before the mother is aware that she is pregnant. Defects range in


malformations, such as complete absence of one or more of the heart's chambers or valves. According to the American Heart Association, it's possible to fix most congenital heart defects and there are an estimated 2 million CHD survivors in the United States.

Trinitas maintains a full-service cardiac facility as well as facilities for the intensive nursing care

severity from simple problems, such as "holes" of patients with cardiac disease. These include a between chambers of the heart, to very severe cardiac care unit, intermediate coronary care unit, cardiac catheterization lab, non-invasive cardiology services, full-service emergency department, and cardiac rehabilitation services. PROPERTY TAX HELPFUL INFORMATION

Submitted by: Borough of Kenilworth Finance and Tax Department

During tax season our department receives many questions regarding programs to assist residents with their property taxes as well as many general financial and other tax related questions. Keeping residents informed is the best way to assure property owners participate in the property tax programs available. Ironically, thousands of eligible individuals around the

State of New Jersey do not participate and we encourage you to apply.

SENIOR CITIZEN PROPERTY TAX FREEZE ACT

The Senior Citizen Property Tax Freeze Act is a tax reimbursement program sponsored by the State of New Jersey. The program reimburses eligible senior citizens and disabled persons for increases to their principal residence. To qualify, you must meet certain income eligibility requirements for each year from the "base year." Base year means the first year you met all the eligibility requirements. You or your spouse was, 65 or older as of December 31, 2015 or actually receiving Federal Social Security disability benefit payments. Eligible residents are encouraged to apply!

Property Tax Reimbursement (PTR) Booklets are expected to arrive by the State in the mail in March.

HOMESTEAD REBATE

The New Jersey Homestead rebate program is credits against your property tax bill. If and when

these credits are applied, they are determined by the State of New Jersey. You can access this information at www.state.nj.us/treasury/taxation or call 1-888-238-1233.

SENIOR CITIZEN, DISABLED, AND VETERANS PROPERTY TAX CREDITS

The State of New Jersey also offers a \$250 property tax deduction for Senior Citizens and the Disabled who earnings do not exceed \$10,000 excluding Social Security benefits. Additionally, the \$250 deduction also applies to Veterans who were honorably discharged and served in certain active wartime service periods determined by the State of New Jersey. Forms are available in the Kenilworth Tax and Finance Office and online at www.state.nj.us/treasury/taxation/otherptr.shtml

NEW CHANGES IN THE TAX AND FINANCE OFFICE

With the retirement of our CFO/Tax Collector Robert Ordway, the borough has retained the services of a part time tax collector, Jill Goode, from the Borough of Mountainside. She is available on Wednesdays at 3pm by appointment but many questions for the tax collector can be addressed to the Tax and Finance Department as staff may be able to provide the answers to many of your property tax questions. Furthermore, Chief Municipal Financial Officer and Qualified Purchasing Agent Joseph DeIorio now serves as the Borough's licensed finance and purchasing officer. In The Signature of All Things, Elizabeth Gilbert

author of Eat Pray Love, returns to fiction. Spanning much of the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries, the novel follows the fortunes of the extraordinary Whittaker family as led by the enterprising Henry Whittaker—a poor-born Englishman who makes a great fortune in the South American quinine trade, eventually becoming the richest man in Philadelphia. Born in 1800, Henry's brilliant daughter, Alma (who inherits both her father's money and his mind), ultimately becomes a botanist of considerable gifts herself. As Alma's research takes her deeper into the mysteries of evolution, she falls in love with a man named Ambrose Pike who makes incomparable paintings of orchids and who draws her in the exact opposite direction — into the realm of the spiritual, the divine, and the magical. Alma is a clear-minded scientist; Ambrose a utopian artist — but what unites this unlikely couple is a desperate need to understand the workings of this world and the mechanisms behind all life.

Exquisitely researched and told at a galloping pace, The Signature of All Things soars across the globe—from London to Peru to Philadelphia to Tahiti to Amsterdam, and beyond. Along the way, the story is peopled with unforgettable missionaries, characters: abolitionists, adventurers, astronomers, sea captains, geniuses, and the quite mad. But most memorable of all, it is the story of Alma Whittaker, who — born in the Age of Enlightenment, but living well into the Industrial Revolution — bears witness to that extraordinary moment in human history when all the old assumptions about science, religion, commerce, and class were exploding into dangerous new ideas. Written in the bold, questing spirit of that singular time, Gilbert's wise, deep, and spellbinding tale is certain to capture the hearts and minds of readers.


