

support center, held an open house on Wednesday February 22nd, to welcome the community to their new facility located at 244 Sheffield St. in Mountainside, NJ.

"Moving into this new space will allow us to double the number of children and families we are able to serve in the years to come," said Mary Robinson, Executive Director and Founder of Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss. The creation of Imagine were inspired by Mary's own loss of her dad to cancer in 1974 when she was 14. "Imagine is truly a labor of love," said Robinson. "I want to ensure that children and teens coping with loss get the support they need during such a traumatic time in their lives. Over 40 years ago when my father died there was very little awareness of the need for grief support for youth, and grief support centers like this didn't exist."

Imagine is currently serving over 230 children and adults every two weeks from 48 NJ towns at its new center in Mountainside. "The Imagine Board began planning over two years ago for a space of our own as we saw the projector of our growth," said Dr. Jennifer Simpson, Board Treasurer. "We developed a plan and launched our Sustainability Campaign to put us in a position to lease a dedicated space of our own and expand our services. The community has been incredibly supportive of our campaign and mission."

Imagine is a free year round grief support center for children, parents and adults coping with the loss of a family member due to death or life-altering illness, designed to help children and
