### NATIONAL AWARD PRESENTED TO FLAGPOLE COMMITTEE

Cranford's World War I Town Flagpole was the center of attention Saturday, March 11 at a program hosted by the Crane's Ford Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) who presented the organization's National DAR Historic Preservation Recognition National Award to "The Cranford WWI Town Flagpole Restoration Committee." The ceremony also highlighted the 100th Anniversary of America's entry into WWI on April 6, 1917 and Cranford residents' contributions and participation in "The Great War" as it was called. The National DAR Award is designed "to recognize worthy local individuals and groups for outstanding achievement in all areas of historic preservation. The recipients are expected to have contributed to their community in an outstanding volunteer manner."

In the ceremony at the Cranford Township Municipal Building, award recipients in the "Cranford WWI Town Flagpole Restoration Committee of 2008" included: Paul LaCorte, chairman; Martha Garcia, Township Commissioner; Rich Brightman, Cranford Knights of Columbus; Rosanne Barone, Cranford Historic Preservation Advisory Board; Frank D'Antonio, VFW Post 335 Men's Auxilary; James D'Arcy, VFW Post 335; Barbara Krause, Crane's Ford DAR; Rita LaBrutto, Resident; Mark Mayer, Cranford Jaycees; Jean Pascarella, owner of Dovetails; Joni Valerio, Cranford Junior Women's Club.

The volunteer committee was formed through resolution of the 2008 Township Committee by former Mayor Robert Puhak. It was tasked with raising funds estimated at \$50,000 to restore and reinstall the flagpole in its original location at Postoffice Plaza. The flagpole was designed to replicate U.S. Navy ship masts of the era and had been dedicated on April 6, 1918 to honor the 320 Cranford residents who served in active military duty during WWI, 15 of those making the supreme sacrifice, some at sea. It also marked the successful completion of Cranford's Liberty Loan Drive raising three times their quota to support the war effort, the most in Union County.

The 65 foot flagpole was removed in 2003 from Postoffice Plaza to make way for renovations there. The appearance and removal of the aging pole became a subject of town controversy for disregarding the pole's historical significance. The Restoration Committee was initially advised the flagpole was beyond repair but within five months the committee raised the required funds from local businesses and families and had arranged for contractors to restore and reinstall the historical flagpole. The Committee proudly arranged for rededication on November 8, 2008.

Guest speakers included former Mayor Robert Puhak 2008; Martha Garcia, Township Commissioner liaison 2008; Paul LaCorte; Tom Connolly, Cranford Historic Preservation Advisory Board; Christine Glazer, Cranford Historical Society, who quoted WWI letters and stories telling of the impact of the war on local families. Crane's Ford DAR Historian Barbara Krause initiated the award nomination submitted to the National DAR with necessary researched historical documentation and also served as program chairperson. Chapter Regent Mary Leonard assisted in the preparation and presentation of the program.



# CFEE TRIVIA NIGHT FUNDRAISER: A SUCCESS FOR CRANFORD SCHOOLS

At its second annual Trivia Night on February 25, the Cranford Fund for Educational Excellence (CFEE) raised more than \$20,000 to support innovative approaches to learning in the Cranford public schools.

The CFEE awards grants to teachers who want to bring advanced resources into their classrooms to inspire and engage students in new ways. Last year, the organization awarded more than \$16,000 in grants directly to teachers for 8 initiatives that benefit children at all levels—from kindergarten through high school—across a range of subjects, from the sciences to literacy to music and art.

The event was held at the Cranford Community Center. Approximately 30 teams of roughly 10 people apiece competed to answer questions about sports, history, science, social studies, and other topics. The 2017 Champions are the Cranford Newcomers Club #1, captained by Abbie and Chris Signore. The 2017 Team Spirit Award went to Nibbles and Bytes, captained by Jennifer & Robert Wukovits.

Speakers included one of this year's grant recipients, Colleen McDonald, Music Teacher at Bloomingdale Avenue School and Livingston Avenue School. Colleen was awarded a CFEE grant for fourth- and fifth-graders to learn instrumental performance on the ukulele, a user-friendly instrument that's well suited to developing a love of music making. Ms.

McDonald shared video clips of the students sharing their love for the course and demonstrating their newfound skills. Ms. McDonald discussed the long-term impact of the CFEE grant saying, "If it inspires a few students here and there to get their own ukulele and practice it on their own, that is really exciting to me. I feel very lucky to have these instruments, and we're very grateful to CFEE."

### IN A DIVORCE, WHO GETS CUSTODY OF THE PETS?

One of the issues which arises with ever-increasing frequency in divorce cases is who gets "custody" of the pets. A 2015-2016 survey conducted by the American Pet Products Association estimates that 65% of all U.S. households have at least one pet. Combining this with the constant reporting that 50% of all marriages end in divorce ensures that there will be ongoing contentious discussions as to who will be awarded the parties' pets.

Several weeks ago, Alaska modified its divorce statutes to make it the first state in the country to obligate judges to take "into consideration the well-being of the animal" and to explicitly empower judges to order joint custody of pets.

The "Dogington Post" (yes that's right) has reported proposed language one animal rights group suggests be used by Courts in awarding "custody" or possession of dogs in divorce matters. "In determining who should be awarded custody, the court may want to consider which party has paid attention to the animal's basic daily needs (food, shelter, physical care, exercise, grooming, flea control); who takes the animal to the veterinarian; who provides for social interactions (in the case of dogs) with other dogs and/or with people; who maintains appropriate supervision to assure that state and local regulations are complied with (licensing, not allowing the dog to run free and protecting against circumstances that would endanger her life or health); and who has the greatest ability to financially support the animal."

Generally without exception pets are legally considered

personal property and, in New Jersey, are awarded to one of the parties in the event of a divorce. However, as with other types of property, pets can be considered pre-marital property and be awarded to the spouse who owned the pet prior to the marriage. I have seen an increase in the number of individuals who insist on pets being covered in their prenuptial agreement to ensure that the pet remains their possession regardless of a future divorce. Spouses are now also including provisions in post-nuptial agreements as to the future "custody" of their beloved pets.

Over the years parties have adopted a more reasonable approach to pets, post-divorce. The former spouses have used a "time-sharing" agreement with respect to their marital pets and have used mediation to get the mutually desired schedule. If one of the parties violates such an agreement, Courts have enforced the agreements and sanctioned the spouse who violates the agreement.

As with many other 21st century issues in divorce the determination of who will be awarded possession or "custody" of the parties' pets in a divorce is evolving. 

### **CRANFORD POLICE DEPARTMENT PARTICIPATING IN "OPERATION TAKE BACK"**

The Cranford Police Department will once again be hosting an "Operation Take Back" local collection site. This semi-annual Statewide Event is a collaborative initiative headed by the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) New Jersey, New Jersey Office of the Attorney General, the NY/NJ HIDTA, and a majority of local New Jersey Police Departments.

This event will take place on Saturday, April 29th between 10am-2pm. The collection location will be at the Cranford Municipal Building located at 8 Springfield Avenue, Ground Level just outside the Juvenile Bureau.

The initiative, open to all residents, was organized in an effort to allow for a safe environmentally friendly way to properly dispose of unused, unwanted, or expired medications. A Police Officer will be on hand to accept medications (both prescription and over the counter) for disposal. No identification is required to participate in this event, and disposal is completely anonymous and voluntary.

As part of the event, participants are reminded of the following:

- Ensure that liquid products (Cough Medicines) remain in the original tightly sealed container
- Remove the Prescription Label from the bottle, to ensure personal information is protected
- Syringes and Sharps will NOT be accepted

According to the Drug Enforcement Administration, since September 2010; cumulatively, these events have collected 5,525,021 pounds of prescription narcotics. During the April 2016 event, New Jersey Law Enforcement Agencies collected 17,785 pounds of medications.





### FIRST PRESBYTERIAN OF CRANFORD'S MISSION TRIP TO NICARAGUA

On Sunday evening January 15, eight tired, but smiling members of the First Presbyterian Church's Mission Team to Nicaragua debarked from a United Airlines Flight at Newark Airport. The journey, which began on Saturday, January 7 was definitely a successful and eye opening experience for all participants.

Jeff and Carol Berns, Mark Cassidy, Lynne Fitzpatrick, Phyllis Dunlop, Jim Vanderhoff, Kelli Bruno and Skip Winter experienced all facets of life in Nicaragua, from visiting agricultural villages without clean and available drinking water, and which had waited 20 years for electricity, to INHIJAMBIA, a facility in Managua for abandoned children, to a new surgical facility operated by one of the best spine surgeons in Nicaragua.

The journey began in Esteli, a northern Nicaragua community which had suffered many casualties in the Sandinista Revolution in the 1980's. The group visited and met with representatives from FEDICAMP, an agricultural community that desperately needs clean and

available drinking water and had just received electricity after waiting for over 20 years. The initial plans had been to begin construction on a water project to provide drinking water for families and schools in a rural community. Upon arrival the team found out that the government had agreed to fund that particular project this year. The efforts were not in vain, as the mission team was able to begin to develop another water project in a neighboring community with the assistance of a local Rotary Club.

Moving on, the team traveled south to the capital city of Managua to visit INHIJJAMBIA, a facility that works with street kids, many who are drug addicted and live on the streets in groups and fight for survival every day. Staying in Masaya, the mission team visited the construction site of the new home for AXAZYACATL, a facility to assist women who suffer from domestic abuse and domestic violence. The Last year's Mission Team had initiated the construction and they were pleased to see that the new home is about sixty per cent completed.

The journey was concluded when the team

spent a few days in Granada, a Nicaraguan city rich in culture, art and history. They visited two of the schools where previous mission trips had done work and helped plant some newly acquired trees.

Perhaps the most important parts of the trip were not only to learn about the rich cultural history and political turmoil of Nicaragua, but as a group, to work and travel together as a community of twelve to work hard, learn a great deal, and have a good time doing it. A highlight of the trip was to have Kelli Bruno perform on stage in a restaurant in Masaya with her new handmade Nicaraguan guitar.

Through the effort and inspiration of Lynne Fitzpatrick, owner of the Guillotine Salon and Spa in Westfield, plans are already underway to fund barber and beauty school training at AXAZYACATL and INHIJAMBIA.

### FRIENDS OF LIBRARY STRIVE TO HELP OTHERS

Every year, many generous patrons of the Cranford Public Library donate their used books to the library. All of the books, with the exception of some that are needed by the library, are sent to the library's Friendly Book Cellar which has two rooms filled with shelves. This is where the Friends of the Cranford Public Library holds its five annual used book sales. Proceeds benefit the library and enable it to buy books, equipment and much more. They also help the Friends to fund numerous adult and children's programs which are free and open-to the public.


To prepare for a sale, the Friends sort the donated books and shelve them in categories such as fiction, non-fiction, mystery, science, gardening etc. Some categories like poetry and classics are also alphabetized. Children's books occupy a separate section and are shelved in categories. Parents really appreciate the ability to quickly find a biography or a graded reader without having to pore through a stack of unorganized books.

Books that are damaged or out of date cannot be sold, but those that are sturdy or have only minor damage can still be used. Some are placed on the library's "free" cart and others are distributed by the Friends to places like Elder Care or the Cranford Railroad Station. The rest are put into boxes. These will be given to

churches, hospitals, schools and charities which contact the Friends with special needs. The Friends are always glad to lend a helping hand and make every effort to fill all requests. After the 2013 hurricane, they prepared many boxes of books for Books for the Bayou and the Jersey Shore. Other groups that have been helped include St. Peter's University Hospital (ongoing), Books for Ghana, the Art and Library Program of the Arc of Union County, Zambia, South Africa and Schools in the Philippines.

Recently, Barbara Ugenti, the Director of Book Sales for the Friends went to the Friendly Book Cellar to give several boxes of books to volunteers from Books for Taiwan. This organization collects and distributes donated books to Taiwanese libraries, schools where children are learning English, culinary schools where future chefs are learning western cuisine and wherever a need for English books exists. The books are collected from libraries throughout New Jersey, stored in a Fairfield warehouse and then packed and shipped to Taiwan. Since 2004, Books for Taiwan has shipped more than 300,000 books. The Friends are happy to have been able to help this worthy group.

The Cranford Public Library welcomes book donations. People wishing to donate books may bring them to the main desk during regular library hours.
