MEMO FROM THE MAYOR



Spring is here! But at the time of this writing we have a little snow to melt first! While we had a mid-March storm that brought icy sleet and snow it was far less than the 24" that was expected. Kudos to the DPW and Police for doing a good job as always. This was a difficult storm to plow as because it iced very quickly, hampering efforts to get snow moved off the roadways, a special thank you to the residents who complied with the snow ordinance and got their vehicle off the roadways and to the many that checked on their neighbors during the event.

I've noticed there is still a little confusion as to when each side of town is supposed to put out recycling. I understand that the DPW schedule on-line reflects the old schedule and we will be updating this as soon as possible. We did not update as we were unsure if the system would be workable, but I believe to alleviate this issue we need to get it out as quickly as possible. So to review for the month of April and May we are still alternating each week north side and south side. April 4 and 18 will be north side pickup and April 11 and 25 will be south side pick up. May 2, 16 and 30 will be north side pickup and May 9 and 23 will be south side pick up. Remember, if you are a town resident Kenilworth does offer the option to drop off at the DPW yard until 3 pm, please check to make sure someone if available at the yard. Again Kenilworthians, thank you for being patient and understanding through this. And thank you for getting the word out to some who didn't get the reverse 911 phone messages or weren't on social media pages in our effort to get everyone the information.

Kenilworth utilizes the Swift 911 system to get information via landline phone or to cell phones if you wish. Sign up is free and is located on our Kenilworth Borough website. Our goal is to get everyone signed up and we will have information and a sign-up center at the Senior Center as well as the Library so we can help those who might be confused as to how to do it. In times of crisis, the ability to get information quickly and accurately is imperative. This system allows the authorities to reach as many people as possible.

We have some big things happening. Here are some important dates and events:

April 18: While tax day is on the 15th because of the weekend, the final day for taxes will be on the 18th so all you procrastinators get a couple of extra days to give Uncle Sam his share.

April 19: North side Bulk pick up commences.

April 22: The Kenilworth Historical Society is hosting "An Elegant Victorian Tea with a Contemporary Flair" at Kenilworth Gospel Chapel - 557 Newark Ave., Kenilworth. An elegant Victorian Tea complete with tea sandwiches, scones, desserts and a gift auction. Dr. James Pumarada, a longtime Kenilworth resident and owner of Complete Physical Rehabilitation, a Union County based Physical Therapy clinic, finished his very first half marathon on March 20, 2017, participating in the United Airlines NYC Half Marathon in New York. For Dr. James, the decision to participate in such a high profile event as a first timer was very simple.

"It's really about showing my kids the value of physical activity and physical fitness," states Dr. James, who has 3 children all attending St. Theresa's School in Kenilworth. "As a physical therapist, I always try to impart to them that exercise is important, but I thought that I participating in this race would really provide the best message."

Having no previous marathon experience and having entered the race via lottery, the training process proved to be equally challenging and rewarding.

"I was so shocked that I actually won that lottery, and I'm really glad I treat runners all the time, or things would've been much harder," he jokes. "It was very rewarding. I kept myself in great shape through training, I got through my first race ever, and my kids got to see what you can accomplish when you put your mind to something. It was all win-win for me."





About 1849 farmer George Gage (1805-1892) and family lived in the farmhouse on Cross St. By 1860 James L. Benedict (1814-1892) owned the farm. About 1878 Charles Frost (b. 1845), his wife Catherine (b. 1848), and family, arrived from NY. Charles was a gardener and became a wholesale florist of regional repute. When the New Orange Industrial Association purchased farms in the 1890s in Union and Cranford to

Research suggests create New Orange, he declined to sell.

Fred Frost, a son (b. 1875), owned the farm until 1943 when he sold it to Adolf Roessle (1899-1979) and his wife, Marie (1901-1992). They were assisted by their son, Rudy, now 85 years old, who explained that the family renovated the property, demolished some structures, and added new. One was a flower shop which became a thriving retail business known as the Kenilworth Greenhouses and Flower Shop. In the 1960s a rear portion of the property was sold to help create the Brearley Regional HS campus. Until that time the farm's shape had not changed in 120 years. In 1988 the Roessles retired and sold the property and farmhouse to a local developer who demolished the greenhouses, flower shop, and barn, but not the farmhouse. The future of this landmark structure, although in a state of decline, remains uncertain.

DISTRACTED DRIVING CAMPAIGNTO BE CARRIED **OUT LOCALLY FROM APRIL 1 – APRIL 21, 2017**

Borough of Kenilworth - Law enforcement officers from the Kenilworth Police Department will be cracking down on distracted drivers during April as part of New Jersey's UDrive. UText. UPay.enforcement campaign.

Beginning April 1 and running through April 21, the high visibility law enforcement initiative will target motorists who engage in dangerous distracted driving behaviors such as talking on handheld cell phones and sending text messages while driving.

"Distracted driving is a serious issue on our roadways," said Gary Poedubicky, Acting Director of the New Jersey Division of Highway Traffic Safety. "The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration reports that in 2014 alone, 3,179 people were killed in distracted driving crashes and an estimated 431,000 people were

injured in motor vehicle crashes involving a distracted driver."

Despite the fact that using a hand held cell phone or texting while driving is illegal in New Jersey, the practice appears to be widespread. In a recent survey conducted by the FDU PublicMind Poll for the Division of Highway Traffic Safety, 67% of respondents said they "very often" see people driving and talking on a hand held cell phone. 42% of respondents said they "very often" see driver's texting.

The campaign is being carried out during the month of April, which the National Safety Council has designated as Distracted Driving Awareness Month. The New Jersey campaign is modeled after similar successful high visibility enforcement programs such as Click It or Ticket and Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over.






